A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the Marlborough Sheep District and the Amuri Sheep District as at present constituted should be altered and reconstituted:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eighth section of "The Sheep Act, 1878," do hereby constitute anew the Marlborough and Amuri Sheep Districts, and the subdivisions thereof respectively; and I do hereby declare that, for the purposes of the said Act, the said districts and the subdivisions of the Marlborough Sheep District shall hereafter be as the same are described in the Schedule hereto, including in such districts or subdivisions all boroughs within the territorial area comprised within the external boundaries of any such district or subdivision as defined in the said Schedule, although such boroughs do not actually form part of any county therein mentioned, and that such districts and subdivisions shall be known by the names set over each such district and subdivision respectively in the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

MARLBOROUGH SHEEP DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Provincial Districts of Marlborough and Nelson bounded generally towards the West, North-east, and East by the ocean from the head of Croiselles Harbour to the mouth of the Conway River; thence towards the South-west generally by that river to its source; thence towards the South by a straight line in the direction of the confluence of the Acheron and the Dillon Rivers as far as the western boundary-line of Run No. 1, Terako Survey District; thence again towards the East by the said Run No. 1; again towards the South by Run No. 84, Square 81, Percival Survey District; again towards the East generally by the said Run No. 84 and Runs Nos. 97 and 59 of Square 81 to the Hammer River; thence again towards the South by that river and the Waiiau River to the confluence of the Boyle River with the said Waiiau River; thence towards the West by the last-mentioned river to its confluence with the River Henry; thence again towards the South-west and towards the North-west generally by the southern, western, and north-western boundaries of Section No. 16, Square 183, Dillon Survey District, the western boundary-line of Section No. 14, Square 183, Maling Survey District, the south-western boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 15 and 9, Square 183, and the western boundary-line of the last-mentioned section; again towards the North-east by the north-eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 9 and 15 aforesaid; thence again towards the North-west generally by the north-western and northern boundary-lines of Section No. 12, the northern and north-eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 11, and the north-eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 10A and 10, Square 103, Maling Survey District; thence by lines so as to include Runs Nos. 99 and 106 to Lake Tennyson; thence by that lake, the northern boundary-line of Run No. 1, Square 72, Alma Survey District, and the north-western and north-eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 1, Square 71, to Serpentine Creek; thence by the right bank of that creek to its source; thence by a straight line to the source of the Wairau River; thence by the left bank of the said Wairau River to a reserve of 13,000 acres in the Wairau Survey District; thence by the western, north-western, north-eastern, and eastern boundary-lines of that reserve to Run No. 3, Square 70, Wairau Survey District aforesaid; and thence by the north-western boundary-lines of Runs Nos. 3 aforesaid and 4 to the boundary between the Provincial Districts of Nelson and Marlborough; thence again towards the South-west by the Provincial District of Nelson to the Wairau River; thence again towards the South-east by the said Wairau River to the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 6, Wiesenhaven Run; thence again towards the South-west and North-west by the south-western and north-western boundary-lines of the said Section No. 6, the north-western boundary-line of Section No. 3, the south-western and north-western boundary-lines of Section No. 4, and the north-western boundary-line of Section No. 7, all of Wiesenhaven Run aforesaid, to Ward's Pass; thence by the summit of the watershed between the Wairau River and Tasman Bay to the source of the Pelorus River; thence by that river to its confluence with the Heringa River; thence by that river to its source; thence by a right line to Saddle Hill; thence by the summit of the watershed between the Pelorus and Tasman Bay to Mount McLaren; and thence by a right line to the head of Croiselles Harbour: including D'Urville Island, Arapawa Island, and Forsyth and Chetwode Islands, and all

islands adjacent thereto; and shall comprise the following subdivisions:—

*The Picton Subdivision.*

Bounded generally towards the West, North-east, and South-east by the sea from the head of Croiselles Harbour to White's Bay at the north-east corner of the Native reserve; towards the South-east generally by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 37, Picton Suburban; thence by the northern boundary of that section produced to the Tuamarina River; thence by the northern boundary of the Raydale Run to the north-western corner of that run; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 9, Okaramio Valley; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 72, Havelock Suburban; thence by a right line to the south-west corner of Section No. 85, Havelock Suburban; thence by the summit of the watershed between the Atuhaua Stream and the Kaituna River to the watershed between the Wairau and Pelorus Valleys, and by the summit of that watershed to the watershed between the Wairau River and Blind Bay; thence generally towards the north-west by the Nelson Sheep District to the head of Croiselles Harbour, the starting-point: including D'Urville Island, Arapawa Island, and Forsyth and Chetwode Islands.

*The Blenheim Subdivision.*

Bounded towards the East by the sea from the mouth of the Awatere River to the north-east corner of Native reserve at White's Bay; towards the North by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 37, Picton Suburban; thence by the northern boundary of that section produced to the Tuamarina River; thence by the northern boundary of the Raydale Run to the north-western corner of that run; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 9, Okaramio Valley; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 72, Havelock Suburban; thence by a right line to the south-west corner of Section No. 85, Havelock Suburban; thence by the watershed between the Atuhaua Stream and the Kaituna River to the watershed between the Wairau and Pelorus Valleys, and by that watershed to the watershed between the Wairau River and Blind Bay; towards the North-west by that watershed over Mount Rintoul to Ward's Pass; thence along the northern and western boundaries of Sections Nos. 7, 4, and 3, Wiesenhaven Run, known as the "Red Hills Reserve," to the Wairau River; thence northerly along the right bank of that river to a point in line with Tophouse and Barefell Pass; towards the West by a right line from thence to the Awatere Subdivision, hereinafter described; and towards the South by the said Awatere Subdivision to the mouth of the Awatere River, the starting-point.

*The Awatere Subdivision.*

Bounded towards the East by the sea from the mouth of the Kekerangu River to the mouth of the Awatere River; thence on the North and West by the Awatere River from its mouth to a point on Section No. 30, Wakefield Downs (being the south-western corner of the Vernon Run); thence by a right line to the south-western corner of Section No. 29, Wakefield Downs; thence by the eastern side of the road between Sections Nos. 33 and 29, Wakefield Downs, and Sections Nos. 4 and 2 of Block I., District of Awatere, to the Utawai Stream; thence by the Utawai Stream to the northern boundary of Section No. 2 of Block I., District of Awatere; thence along that boundary to Maxwell Pass Stream; thence by the Maxwell Pass Stream to the watershed; thence by a tributary of the Taylor River to the Taylor River at the base of a hill called the "Maori;" thence by the northern boundaries of the Dumgree and Blairich Runs to the summit of the dividing range between the Awatere and Wairau Valleys to Langridge Run No. 2; thence by the western boundary of that run to the summit of the range; thence by the said summit to Saxon's Pass; thence by the stream running out of Saxon's Pass to the Acheron River; thence by that river to the junction of the Saxon; thence by the Saxon for a distance of 210 chains; thence by a line due east and west to intersect a right line drawn from Tophouse to Barefell Pass; thence by part of said line to Barefell Pass; thence by the Guide River to its confluence with the Acheron River; thence by that river to its confluence with the Clarence River; thence towards the South by a right line to a point on the Clarence River where a right line drawn from the junction of the Acheron and Clarence Rivers to the source of the River Conway intersects it; thence towards the South-east by the Kaikoura Subdivision, hereinafter described, to the mouth of the Kekerangu River, the starting-point.

*The Kaikoura Subdivision.*

Bounded towards the East by the sea from the mouth of the River Conway to the mouth of the River Kekerangu; thence North by the River Kekerangu to the junction of Benmore Stream; thence by that stream to its source; thence by a tributary of the River Ure to the southern

boundary of the Chalk Range Run; thence by the southern boundary of the Chalk Range Run to the Upton Fells Run; thence by the southern boundary of Upton Fells Run to Upton Fells Run No. 2; thence by the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Upton Fells Run No. 2 to Section No. 11 on the Upton Fells Run; thence by that section to the eastern boundary of the Camden Run No. 2; thence by that boundary and the southern boundaries of Camden Run No. 2 to the summit of the dividing range between the Awatere and Clarence Valleys; thence on the West by a line along the said summit to Lake McRae Run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run to a point where a right line drawn from the junction of the Acheron and Clarence Rivers to the source of the Conway River intersects it; thence by a right line to the source of the River Conway; and thence by the right bank of that river to its mouth, the starting-point.

*The Hopefield Subdivision.*

All that area in the Provincial District of Nelson bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of the Rivers Boyle and Waiau, and proceeding northerly along the Waiau River to its confluence with the River Henry; thence along the left bank of the said River Henry to the western boundary-line of Section No. 16, Square 183, Dillon Survey District; thence along the western, north-western, and north-eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 16 aforesaid, along the western boundary-line of Section No. 14, Square 183, Maling Survey District, along the south-western boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 15 and 9, Square 183, along the western boundary-line of the said Section No. 9, and along the northern and north-eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 9 and 15 aforesaid of Maling Survey District, along the western and northern boundary-lines of Section No. 12, along the northern and north-eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 11, and along the eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 10A and 10, Square 103, Maling Survey District aforesaid, along the north-western, western, north-eastern, and south-western boundary-lines of Run No. 99, and along the western and northern boundary-lines of Run No. 186 to Lake Tennyson; thence southerly along the shore of that lake to Run No. 1, Square 72, Alma Survey District; thence northerly generally along the northern and eastern boundary-lines of Run No. 1 aforesaid, and of Section No. 1, Square 71, to Serpentine Creek; thence along the right bank of that creek to its source; thence along a straight line to the source of the Wairau River, and along the left bank of that river to a reserve of 13,000 acres in the Wairau Survey District; thence along the western, north-western, north-eastern, and eastern boundary-lines of that reserve to Run No. 3, Square 70, Wairau Survey District aforesaid; thence easterly along the northern boundary-line of Run No. 4 to the boundary between the Provincial Districts of Nelson and Marlborough; thence southerly, westerly, and easterly along the Provincial District boundary to Run No. 1, Terako Survey District; thence southerly along the western boundary-line of that run, along the northern and western boundary-lines of Run No. 84 to Run No. 59, Square 81; thence along the north-western and south-western boundary-lines of Runs Nos. 59 and 97, Square 81, Percival Survey District, to the Hanmer River; and thence westerly along that river and the Waiau River aforesaid to the place of commencement.

**AMURI SHEEP DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Provincial District of Nelson bounded as follows: Commencing at a point where a right line from Top House to Barefell Pass intersects the Wairau River; thence by said line to Barefell Pass; thence by the Guide and Acheron Rivers to the confluence of the Acheron with the Clarence River; thence by a right line to the source of the Conway River and by that river to the sea; thence by the sea to the mouth of the Waiau or Dillon; thence by that river and the Henry River to its source at Travers Peak; thence by the summit of the Spencer Mountains and St. Arnaud Range to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section No. 6, Wiesenhaven Run; thence to and by said Section and the Wairau River to the starting-point: exclusive of the Hopefield Subdivision of the Marlborough Sheep District, hereinbefore described.

3. No such policyholder shall be entitled to effect such a transfer unless he is at the date of such transfer the absolute owner of such policy.
4. Every policyholder who has so transferred his policy shall, at such times as the Commissioner may require him so to do, not being more than once in each year, make a declaration of abstinence in the manner and form prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto.
5. No such transfer shall be allowed after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, on or before which date the policy, with the memorandum of transfer indorsed thereon, must be received at the Office of the Government Insurance Commissioner at Wellington.

WHEREAS by section seven of "The Native Equitable Owners Act, 1886," it is provided that the Native Land Court of New Zealand shall have and may exercise the jurisdiction conferred upon it by the said Act in respect of any Native reserve situate in the South Island or in Stewart Island which may be submitted to such jurisdiction by Order in Council, which the Governor was thereby authorized to issue from time to time: And whereas it is expedient to order and declare that the reserves described in the Schedule hereto should be submitted to the jurisdiction aforesaid:

WHEREAS by "The West Coast Settlement Reserves Act, 1881" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations, *inter alia*, for the mode of application and expenditure of all revenues arising from the West Coast Settlement Reserves, and by any such regulations may from time to time appoint fees to be paid in respect of anything done under the said Act in relation to any such reserve: And whereas the Governor did, by Order in Council dated the eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, make regulations and appoint fees to be paid under the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said regulations and fees, and to substitute others in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the hereinbefore recited Order in Council, and the scale of fees and charges made thereunder, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations as those upon which the revenues arising from the said reserves may be applied and expended, that is to say,—

The Public Trustee may from time to time, out of the revenues of the said reserves, apply such portion as he may determine in repayment to the colonial revenue of any advances which may have been, or may hereafter be, made out of the Consolidated Fund for defraying the cost of advertising, preparing, and issuing leases prior to the leasing of the said reserves.

And by and with the like advice and consent, and in exercise of the like power and authority, His Excellency the Governor doth hereby appoint the following fees as those to be paid in respect of such of the matters following as may be done in relation to the said reserves, that is to say,—

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the real estate described or referred to in the fifth column, for estates therein derived as mentioned in the sixth column:

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of December, 1886.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," and "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Counties of Taranaki and Clifton, and in the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout, perch, and tench in all the waters in the Counties of Taranaki and Clifton will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Taranaki Acclimatisation Society, at New Plymouth, and for every such license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the said Secretary to issue a license.

2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in any of the said waters from the sixteenth day of October in any year to the thirty-first day of March in the year following, inclusive, between the hours of five a.m. and ten p.m. only, but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill, or have in his possession, or attempt to fish for, take, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, any of the salmonidæ or trout, except during the above-mentioned period.

4. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish with one rod and line only, and with the following baits: natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, silveries, bullies (*Eleotris gobioides*), grasshoppers, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, and worms.

5. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort or kind whatever, for the purpose of fishing for, taking, catching, or killing trout, perch, or tench, except a rod and line, landing-net, and gaff, for fish taken with rod and line.

6. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout, perch, or tench, nor shall any of the baits above mentioned be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

7. No person shall fish without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the Acclimatisation Society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing trout, perch, or tench.

8. Every trout not exceeding ten inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

9. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any of the said waters, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

10. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

11. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the district to which these regulations relate, any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, or tench, or take, fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, or tench, in order to make sale of the same, for a period of one year from the

sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

12. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, or tench during the period appointed for a close season for any such fish.

13. No person shall take, catch, or kill any perch under eight inches in length, nor shall perch be taken, caught, or killed at all, or had in possession of any person, between the first day of April and the thirtieth day of November in any year.

14. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than twenty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first [day of December, 1886.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," and "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the County of Waitaki, and in the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout, perch, and tench in all the waters of the County of Waitaki shall be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Waitaki County Acclimatisation Society (hereinafter termed "the said Acclimatisation Society"), at Oamaru, in the Provincial District of Otago, and for every such license a fee of one pound will be charged: Provided, however, that licenses may be issued to youths under fifteen years of age on payment of a fee of ten shillings; provided also that it shall not be obligatory upon the said society to issue a license.

2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in any of the said waters from the first day of October in the year in which the license is issued to the thirty-first day of March in the year following, inclusive; but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish with one rod and line only, and with the following baits, namely, natural and artificial fly, natural and artificial minnow, silveries, bullies (*Eleotris gobioides*), grasshoppers, beetles, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, grubs, and worms.

4. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort (except a rod and line, and landing-net or gaff for fish taken with rod and line) whatever, for the purpose of fishing for, catching, killing, or taking trout, perch, or tench.

5. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other un-sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of catching, killing, or taking trout, nor shall any of the baits above mentioned be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

6. No person shall fish without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the said Acclimatisation Society, or other person producing a license from such society, produce and show to such ranger, constable, member, or person his license, or the contents of his creel or bag, and the baits used by him for catching, killing, or taking trout, perch, or tench, as the case may be.

7. Every trout not exceeding eight inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall be immediately returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

8. No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill, or attempt to fish for, take, catch, or kill, in any manner whatsoever, or have in his possession, any trout, perch, or tench except during the above-mentioned period.

9. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the district to which these regulations relate, any of the salmonidæ or trout, or take, fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ or trout in order to make sale of the same, without permission in writing under the hand of the Secretary.

10. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall be immediately returned to the water from whence it was taken.

11. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, or tench between the first day of April and the thirtieth day of September in each year, which period is hereby appointed a close season for any such fish.

12. No person shall take, catch, or kill any perch under eight inches in length, nor shall perch be taken, caught, or killed at all, or had in possession of any person, between the first day of July and the thirtieth day of November in any year.

13. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, in any of the waters hereinbefore mentioned, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, dynamite, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

14. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one pound and not exceeding fifty pounds.

15. These regulations shall come into force as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Rewards offered for the Discovery of New Goldfields.—  
 Amended Conditions.

REWARDS are offered for the discovery of new goldfields, upon the conditions set forth hereunder, payable out of the parliamentary vote of £2,500.

AMENDED CONDITIONS.

1. The maximum sum offered as a reward for any proved discovery of a new goldfield in accordance with these conditions is £500; but, if the total sum claimed as rewards in any one year exceeds the parliamentary vote, the amount available only will be divided equally.

2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

Additional Regulation as to Payment of Rewards for Discovery of New Goldfields.

No claim for a reward for the discovery of gold will be considered by the Goldfields Committee unless such claim be made within one year from the date of the discovery.

Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

Treasury Department,

Wellington, 10th November, 1885.

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

JULIUS VOGEL.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

- (1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ½d. and ¼d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for

all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

*Subsidies to Public Libraries.*

Education Department,

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £4,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 8th February, 1887, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 31st January, 1887.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club, whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

A nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of each library's receipts, and the vote of £4,000 will be divided in proportion to the amounts as thus augmented, but so as that no institution shall receive more than £50.

Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1886; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

DECLARATION.

I [name], of [place of abode], [occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary or Treasurer] of the [name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1886, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only was as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under "The Public Libraries Act, 1869," pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence; and from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions, pounds shillings and pence. *The Gilchrist Scholarship.*

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University January Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the January examination for New Zealand will be held some time in the month of January, 1887, or as soon after as the examination papers arrive in the colony, and at such place or places as may be hereafter fixed, having regard to the candidates' places of abode.

Candidates will not be approved by the examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subjects, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

1. Latin:
2. Any two of the following languages: (a) Greek, (b) French, and (c) German:
3. The English language, English history, and modern geography:
4. Mathematics:
5. Natural philosophy:
6. Chemistry.

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of London, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for January, 1887, are *Cicero*, *De Senectute* and *Pro Lege Manilia*; and *Homer*, *Iliad*, Book XVI.

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1887, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1887, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

Every candidate will be required to give satisfactory evidence that he is between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two years, and either that he is a native of New Zealand, or that he has resided in New Zealand for the last five years.

Notice of entry, with satisfactory testimonials as to personal character, and the London matriculation fee of £2, must be sent to the Secretary for Education, Wellington, so as to reach his office not later than the 1st January, 1887.
