Home Shoal is reported to be in $19^{\circ}\,1_{3}^{4'}\,\mathrm{S.}$, $174^{\circ}\,44_{2}^{4'}\,\mathrm{W.}$, with 4 fathoms. The assigned position, about two and a half miles southward, was passed within half a mile without any

miles southward, was passed within hair a mile without any sign of shoal water.

The small volcanic island, variously named as Wesley Rock, Metis Rock, Mechanic Island, is about three hundred yards N.W. and S.E., 151ft. high, in 19° 19½ S., 174° 48½ W. Its crater, in eruption, open to water's edge, is on western side. There are no outlying breakers, but discoloured water extends about one mile N.W., and a little less than one mile to southward and south-eastward.

St. Michael Shoal is reported not to exist, but is retained on charts.

The island E.D. in 20° 9′ S., 175° 12′ W., also Culebras Reef in 20° 22′ S., 175° 18′ W., are reported not to exist, and are removed from charts.

are removed from charts. Falcon Island, which appeared in October, 1885, is one and four-tenths miles N.W. and S.E., 164ft. high, in 20° 19' S., 175° 21½' W., or nine miles northward of the former position given. Reefs extend from the island one mile south-eastward, seven cables north-eastward, and one and a quarter miles westward. The crater, in eruption, is on eastern end of island.

The discoloured water and breakers, about twelve miles N.W. of Tongatabu, are reported not to exist, but are retained on charts.

Tongatabu Island.—The land about Cook Point, south extreme of island, is 200ft. high. The reef off Cook Point extends about one cable farther than shown on charts.

Euaji Island.—Breakers extend off eastern side. Vessels

should not pass E. or S. side nearer than one and a half

Vavu Island.—The bare tree shown on plan of Nei-Varu Island.—The bare tree shown on plan of Nei-Alo holonger exists; red patch is not distinguishable. Roman Catholic church, a low structure without a steeple, on a hill S.E. end of village, is a good guide in approaching the anchorage. (November.)

Savage Island.—A reef (Antiope) is reported ninety miles N.E. of the island, in 18° 14′ S., 168° 20′ W. (September.)

2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings or if in quartz not less than five miles

must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required. will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward tion for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club, whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A sublibrary will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A sub-sidy will not be given to more than one library in the same

A nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of each library's receipts, and the vote of £4,000 will be divided in proportion to the amounts as thus augmented, but so as that no institution shall receive more than £50.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

Notifications under section 24 must be so delivered as to reach the Commissioner and the Chief Judge of the Native Land Court respectively before the 1st day of April, 1887.

SCHEDULE A.

Section 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Native Land Administration Act, 1886." It shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

Section 24. A person who may claim to have heretofore purchased or leased the share or interest of some out of several owners of land (the title whereto was not at the time of such purchase or lease subject to any restriction precluding such purchase or lease) may, within three months after the coming into operation of this Act, notify the fact of such purchase or lease to the Commissioner and also to the Chief Judge of the Court, and it shall thereupon be a duty of a Judge to inquire into the circumstances thereof, and who, if satisfied that there had been a purchase or lease as alleged, and that the transaction was bona fide, and that a fair value or rent was given or reserved, may give his certificate to that effect to the person alleging himself to be such purchaser or lessee, who shall transmit the same to the Commissioner.

Section 25. Upon the grant of such certificate the person therein named,

- (a.) If a purchaser, shall be the owner of the share of his vendor in the land the subject of such purchase, and shall be entitled to have partitioned to him in severalty such part of the land as the Court may deem just;
- (b.) Or he may within one month after the date of the certificate give notice to the Commissioner that he is desirous of purchasing the shares or interests which he has not already acquired, and in such case he may, on obtaining a certificate from a Judge that such Judge is satisfied that he had, before the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eightysix, obtained the signature of one or more owner or owners to a writing purporting or agreeing to convey the share or interest of the persons signing, at any time within twelve months from the said first day of July, but not afterwards, purchase all or any of such shares or interests.
 - If all such outstanding shares or interests are not pur-chased, he shall be entitled to have partitioned to him such part of the land as the Court may deem just;
- (c.) If a lessee, shall be entitled to have the share of his lessors in the land comprised in his lease ascertained, and partition made thereof to such lessors, and shall be entitled to hold his lease subject to the terms thereof until its expiry;
- (d.) Or he may, within one month after the date of the certificate, give notice to the Commissioner that he is desirous of obtaining a lease of all or some of the owners who have not already granted him a lease, and owners who have not already granted him a lease, and in such case he may, on obtaining a certificate from a Judge that such Judge is satisfied that he had, before the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, obtained the signature of one or more owner or owners to a writing purporting to be or agreement to grant a lease of the land or of the share or interest of the person signing, at any time within twelve months from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, but not afterwards, obtain a lease of all or any of such shares or interests for the same term as he holds the shares or interests acquired before the coming into operation of this Act. acquired before the coming into operation of this Act.
- If a lease of all such outstanding shares or interests is not acquired within the said twelve months, he shall be entitled to have the shares of his then lessors ascertained and partition made thereof, and shall be entitled to hold his lease subject to the terms thereof until its expiry; and

It shall be a duty of the Court to effect such partitions as aforesaid, the purchaser or lessee in whose interest it is made paying all Court fees and the charges for survey in respect of the land the subject of such purchase or lease.
