General Regulations re Importation of Dogs under "Diseased Cattle Act, 1881."—Notice No. 221.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this first day of February, 1887.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred on him by "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1881" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke so much as relates to dogs of the Orders in Council dated respectively the thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and the twenty-second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, made under the provisions of the said Act, and also of the several regulations made thereunder, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the general regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth order and declare that such last-mentioned regulations shall take effect from and after the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

IN these regulations the following words shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:—

"Inspector" means the Inspector or Deputy Inspector of the district appointed under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1881:"

"Board" means the local Cattle Board of the district:

"The said Act" means "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1881:"

"Dog" means any dog or slut:

"Imported dog" means any dog or slut arriving in New Zealand from any place other than one of the Australasian Colonies:

"Disease" means *rabies canina*:

"Diseased" means suffering from *rabies canina*.

1. All dogs affected with disease, and all imported dogs, shall, until such dogs have passed through and been released from quarantine, as hereinafter provided, be treated as diseased.

2. The introduction of any dog into the colony found to be suffering from disease is prohibited.

3. No imported dog shall be landed in New Zealand except within one of the under-named ports, viz., Auckland, Napier, Port Nicholson, Nelson, Lyttelton, Port Chalmers, the Bluff Harbour.

4. When any vessel arrives at any port in New Zealand from any place other than one of the Australasian Colonies having on board any imported dog, the master of the vessel, and the owner or person in charge of any such dog on board any such vessel, shall, so soon as the vessel enters New Zealand waters, cause every such dog to be securely chained up or otherwise confined, so as to be unable to bite or come in contact with any person or dog coming on board, until an Inspector, by writing under his hand, shall otherwise order.

5. The master of every such vessel shall, with the least possible delay, furnish the Inspector stationed at or near the port of arrival with a description in writing of each imported dog on board of his vessel, stating where the same was shipped, the name of the owner or person in charge thereof (if any) on board the vessel, or the name of the consignee (if any) of every such dog.

6. All dogs on board any such vessel shall be forthwith examined by the Inspector or by a duly-qualified veterinary surgeon appointed by him; and, if such dogs are certified to be free from disease, the Inspector may grant a permit for the removal of such dogs by the owner or consignee to such quarantine-ground or other place as the Inspector may direct; and no dogs shall be removed from such vessel without permission in writing from an Inspector first had and obtained by the owner or consignee.

7. All imported dogs showing symptoms of disease on arrival, or during the term of quarantine, shall be destroyed; or, if any dog be not removed to a quarantine-station as directed by an Inspector, such dog shall be destroyed.

8. All imported dogs belonging to any of the officers or crew of a vessel arriving in the colony shall be placed in quarantine and remain therein for six months, or until the vessel by which such dogs arrived is about to leave New Zealand waters; and no dogs shall be removed from such quarantine-ground without permission in writing from an Inspector first had and obtained by the owner or agent.

9. All other imported dogs shall remain in quarantine for a term of not less than six months from the date of arrival.

10. All dogs imported as aforesaid shall be under the supervision of the Inspector at the port of arrival, and shall not be removed either from the vessel by which they shall have arrived or from quarantine unless and until a permit for the removal of such dogs shall have been first had and obtained by the owner or consignee from an Inspector.

11. All expenses of examination by the Inspector or by any veterinary surgeon employed by him, and all expenses of landing, removing to, maintaining and keeping in quarantine and removing from quarantine of any dog, and all expenses in connection therewith, shall be borne by the owner or consignee of such dog; and the owner or consignee shall on demand deposit the estimated amount of such costs and expenses with the Inspector previous to any dog being landed; and when such dog shall die or be destroyed, or be delivered up to its owner or consignee, the Inspector shall render to such owner or consignee a full and true account of the money so deposited with him as aforesaid, and shall hand over the balance (if any) of such deposit to the depositor, his executors or administrators, or, failing such, shall pay it into the Public Account.

12. When any Inspector has caused any dog to be destroyed he shall give notice in writing to the owner or consignee thereof.

13. Any notice required to be given to the owner or consignee of any dog may be given by a registered letter addressed to such owner or consignee at any address which such owner or consignee may have forwarded in writing to the Inspector as his usual address; or, if such owner or consignee has not so forwarded any address, then by advertisement in a newspaper locally published or circulating in the locality.

14. Every master of a vessel who shall neglect to forward notice of the arrival of, or who shall land or attempt to land, or permit or suffer to be landed, any imported dog without a permit for such landing or removal from an Inspector first had and obtained, or who shall remove or attempt to remove, or permit or suffer to be removed, any such dog from his ship or vessel to or from any other ship or vessel whilst either of such ships or vessels shall be within New Zealand waters without permission from an Inspector, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than £20.

15. Every owner or consignee or person who shall land or attempt to land, or assist or be in any way concerned in landing or transhipping, or attempting to land or tranship, any imported dog from any vessel before a permit shall have been had and obtained from an Inspector for that purpose; or who shall refuse or neglect to remove any dog from any vessel to a quarantine-ground on being directed by any Inspector so to remove such dog, or who shall remove or attempt to remove, or assist or be in any way concerned in removing, any imported dog from a quarantine-ground, without a permit from an Inspector authorizing such removal first had and obtained; or who shall refuse or neglect to remove any dog from quarantine within twenty-four hours after an Inspector shall have granted a permit for such removal; or who shall refuse or neglect forthwith to obey any requisition, order, or direction under these regulations or any of them; or who shall obstruct or hinder any Inspector in the execution of any of his duties or powers under these regulations, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty of not less than £20.

16. Every person being thereunto liable who shall neglect or refuse to pay on demand by an Inspector the expenses or deposit required by Regulation 11, or any other expenses under these regulations, shall, for every day during which such neglect or refusal shall continue, forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than £10.

17. Any dog from the shore found or allowed to stray on board a ship on which an imported dog is detained may be destroyed or placed in quarantine on the order of an Inspector.

18. Any master, mate, or member of the crew of a ship who shall wilfully permit or suffer a dog to go on board their ship during the time any dog shall be detained on such ship shall be liable to a fine of not less than £5.

19. No dog will be allowed on the quarantine-ground except for the purpose of quarantine, and any dog found trespassing on the quarantine-ground may be immediately destroyed.

20. No compensation or claim shall be allowed or payable to any person whatever for any dog destroyed under these regulations, or dying from any cause whilst in quarantine.

21. No Inspector shall authorise any dog brought by sea from any place in any of the Australasian Colonies to be introduced into New Zealand under the provisions of any regulations made under the said Act, unless a certificate of the Inspector or other officer charged with the execution of the law relating to the prevention of diseases among dogs in the place whence the same is brought, that the same is the produce of such colony, or has performed a quarantine of not less than six months therein and been found free from disease, be produced to him, together with a certificate of

the master of the vessel in which such dog is introduced indorsed thereon that such vessel has not during the preceding six months received on board any dog from any place outside the Australasian Colonies, or from any vessel which during the six months preceding such reception has been in any port outside the Australasian Colonies.

22. If any dog brought by sea from any of the Australasian Colonies be not the produce of such colony, and has not been kept in such colony for a period of six months, or has not performed a quarantine of six months therein and been pronounced free from disease, such dog, for the purpose of such last-mentioned regulations, shall be deemed to have been shipped at a port outside the Australasian Colonies.

INSPECTION FEES, ETC.

23. Under authority from the Colonial Secretary, or upon authority in writing by the Chairman of the Local Cattle Board, the Inspector shall employ a veterinary surgeon to inspect and examine any dog known or reasonably suspected to have disease, and shall require such veterinary surgeon to furnish a certificate stating the condition of any dog.

24. Such veterinary surgeon, with any assistants he may require, is hereby authorised to enter upon any premises or ship for the purpose of such inspection and examination, as if he were an Inspector appointed under the said Act; and any person refusing to admit or obstructing such veterinary surgeon in such examination and inspection shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £10.

25. There shall be paid to the Inspector, on demand, by the owner of any dog or dogs, or his agent, or the person in charge thereof, the following fees in respect of the matters hereinafter stated, viz. :—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this first day of February, 1887.

Present :

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that, where the foreshore has been legally vested in any Harbour Board or other local governing body, it may from time to time, subject to the provisions of the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," license and permit any part of the foreshore to be used or occupied, *inter alia*, for the erection and use of any landing-place or wharf: And whereas by the said Act it is also provided that every licensee shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have power to make and construct any necessary reclamation for the purpose of erecting on the foreshore comprised in his license, or upon any land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore which shall be specified in such license, any building, structure, erection, or other works to enable him to obtain the full benefit of such license: And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that every such license shall be in writing under the seal of the Board or body granting the same, and may be for any period not exceeding fourteen years from the date thereof, and may prescribe a sum of money to be payable either at stated periods or on or before the granting thereof for the use of the foreshore so granted, and may prescribe any other terms or conditions, general or particular, to be observed or performed by the person to whom the same is granted: And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted that, in any case where there is no Harbour Board, or no Harbour Board empowered to grant any such license as aforesaid, the Governor in Council may in his discretion grant and issue a license for all or any of the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, and all the provisions of the said Act in respect

of such licenses shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply accordingly: And whereas Thomas Stirrup Webb (hereinafter termed "the licensee") has applied for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore on the Wairoa River, Kaipara Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1289), showing the manner in which it is proposed to construct such wharf, the place in the said harbour where it is intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas there is no Harbour Board having jurisdiction in the said harbour, and it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by him upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such wharf, which is shown on the plan marked M.D. 1289.

2. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of five pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound, dating from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, the first of such yearly payments to be made on a copy of this Order in Council being supplied to the licensee, and thereafter such annual payments to be made on the first day of January.

3. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

4. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring him, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

5. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

6. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by the Harbourmaster at Kaipara.

7. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

8. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

9. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

10. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause two of these conditions; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

Treasury Department,
Wellington, 10th November, 1885.

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

JULIUS VOGEL.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

- (1) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (2) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (3) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ½d. and ¼d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

REWARDS are offered for the discovery of new goldfields, upon the conditions set forth hereunder, payable out of the parliamentary vote of £2,500.

AMENDED CONDITIONS.

1. The maximum sum offered as a reward for any proved discovery of a new goldfield in accordance with these conditions is £500; but, if the total sum claimed as rewards in any one year exceeds the parliamentary vote, the amount available only will be divided equally.

2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of

gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

Additional Regulation as to Payment of Rewards for Discovery of New Goldfields.

THE following additional regulation for the payment of rewards for the discovery of new goldfields, recommended by the Goldfields Committee on the 22nd June, 1886, having been adopted by the Government, is published for general information.

This regulation applies to the notifications published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 19th March and 29th October, 1885, offering rewards for gold discoveries.

"The Native Land Administration Act, 1886."

To Persons having dealings with Natives for Land incomplete on the 1st day of January, 1887.

ATTENTION is hereby called to the provisions of sections 1, 24, and 25 of "The Native Land Administration Act, 1886," which said sections are set out in Schedule A herein.

A printed form of the notification mentioned in the said section 24 may be obtained on application to a Registrar of the Native Land Court.

The notification should be signed in duplicate by the person making it, and should contain such particulars of the purchase or lease intended to be notified as will show clearly the nature of the transaction alleged.

One of such duplicates should be delivered to a Commissioner under the above Act, and the other to the Chief Judge of the Native Land Court. Such delivery may be personal or by post in a registered letter.

The burden of proving delivery will be upon the party asserting it.

Notifications under section 24 must be so delivered as to reach the Commissioner and the Chief Judge of the Native Land Court respectively before the 1st day of April, 1887.

SCHEDULE A.

SECTION 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Native Land Administration Act, 1886." It shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

Section 24. A person who may claim to have heretofore purchased or leased the share or interest of some out of several owners of land (the title whereof was not at the time of such purchase or lease subject to any restriction precluding such purchase or lease) may, within three months after the coming into operation of this Act, notify the fact of such purchase or lease to the Commissioner and also to the Chief Judge of the Court, and it shall thereupon be a duty of a Judge to inquire into the circumstances thereof, and who, if satisfied that there had been a purchase or lease as alleged, and that the transaction was *bonâ fide*, and that a fair value or rent was given or reserved, may give his certificate to that effect to the person alleging himself to be such purchaser or lessee, who shall transmit the same to the Commissioner.

Section 25. Upon the grant of such certificate the person therein named,—

(a.) If a purchaser, shall be the owner of the share of his vendor in the land the subject of such purchase, and

shall be entitled to have partitioned to him in severalty such part of the land as the Court may deem just;

(b.) Or he may within one month after the date of the certificate give notice to the Commissioner that he is desirous of purchasing the shares or interests which he has not already acquired, and in such case he may, on obtaining a certificate from a Judge that such Judge is satisfied that he had, before the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, obtained the signature of one or more owner or owners to a writing purporting or agreeing to convey the share or interest of the persons signing, at any time within twelve months from the said first day of July, but not afterwards, purchase all or any of such shares or interests.

If all such outstanding shares or interests are not purchased, he shall be entitled to have partitioned to him such part of the land as the Court may deem just;

(c.) If a lessee, shall be entitled to have the share of his lessors in the land comprised in his lease ascertained, and partition made thereof to such lessors, and shall be entitled to hold his lease subject to the terms thereof until its expiry;

(d.) Or he may, within one month after the date of the certificate, give notice to the Commissioner that he is desirous of obtaining a lease of all or some of the owners who have not already granted him a lease, and in such case he may, on obtaining a certificate from a Judge that such Judge is satisfied that he had, before the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, obtained the signature of one or more owner or owners to a writing purporting to be or agreement to grant a lease of the land or of the share or interest of the person signing, at any time within twelve months from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, but not afterwards, obtain a lease of all or any of such shares or interests for the same term as he holds the shares or interests acquired before the coming into operation of this Act.

If a lease of all such outstanding shares or interests is not acquired within the said twelve months, he shall be entitled to have the shares of his then lessors ascertained and partition made thereof, and shall be entitled to hold his lease subject to the terms thereof until its expiry;

It shall be a duty of the Court to effect such partitions as aforesaid, the purchaser or lessee in whose interest it is made paying all Court fees and the charges for survey in respect of the land the subject of such purchase or lease.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 474 against 484 in December, a decrease of 10. The deaths in January were 199, an increase of 55 on the number for December. Of the total deaths, males contributed 114; females, 85. Ninety-three of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 46.73 per cent. of the whole number; 76 of these were under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—

The births in January were 277 against 242 in December, an increase of 35. The deaths in January were 108 against 88 in December, an increase of 20.

There were 4 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 2 males of 76 and 74, and a female of 75, died at Auckland; and a female of 72 at Wellington.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality from these diseases was more than double that in December, the number of deaths having increased from 11 to 23, and the proportions per cent. of the total deaths from 12.50 to 25.92. The increase is chiefly due to the mortality in Wellington from infantile diarrhoea. The total number of deaths from diarrhoeal diseases in these boroughs was 24 against 5 in the previous month. Of these, 12 occurred in Wellington (11 having been of infants)—no deaths from this cause having been registered there in the previous month. Seven deaths of children and 2 of adults occurred in Auckland from diarrhoeal diseases. The high mean temperature in the shade in Auckland and Wellington may account for the increase of infantile diarrhoea; but the contrast between the number of deaths from that cause in Auckland, and especially in Wellington, and the number in Christchurch and Dunedin—one in each of the latter—is very noticeable. Two deaths occurred at Auckland from typhoid fever; and 1 death at Wellington from diphtheria.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases caused 18 deaths against 20 in the previous month. Cancer only caused 2 deaths against 7 in December. Phthisis caused 9 deaths.

Local Diseases.—There was a slight increase in the total number of deaths from these diseases. Diseases of the circulatory system caused 8 deaths against 6 in the previous month; and diseases of the respiratory system were the cause of 6 deaths against 7 in December.

Violence.—Ten deaths occurred from accidents of various kinds: of these, 4 were caused by the fire at Messrs. Guthrie and Larnach's premises, Dunedin.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
