A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and fourth section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of averaging the control of t Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation.

And whereas the Land Board of Otago has passed a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred pay-

ments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:
Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Wednesday, the thirteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in the principal land office of the district.

And, in pursuance of the one hundred and tenth section of "The Land Act, 1885," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price stated in the Schedule hereto.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order that the Government work known as a road in the Omapere Survey District, Provincial District of Auckland, shall and may be constructed on or through the parcels of land mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

The Honourable the Colonial Treasurer presiding in Council.

Whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in Trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no Trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such Trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as Trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the area and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memori General.

WHEREAS by "The Public Trust Office Act Amendment Act, 1878," it is enacted that all moneys in the Public Trustee's Account, from whatever property arising, shall, except as regards moneys as to which special provision is made for the investment thereof by the trusts affecting the particular property, be for the purposes of investment one common fund, and the investments thereof shall not be made on account of or belong to any particular property, unless the Governor shall otherwise direct as to any particu-

lar property, and the interest accruing from investment of such moneys shall be divided amongst the properties from which the fund arises in such manner, and at such times, and in such proportions as shall be prescribed by regulations to be made for the purpose from time to time by the Governor in Council, and such regulations shall have the force of law as if included in that Act: And whereas the Governor did, by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, make regulations, amongst other things, in respect of interest on floating balances to credit of estates held in the Public Trust Office: And whereas the Administrator of the Government did, by Order in Council dated the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, amend the regulations made on the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, in part: And whereas it is expedient to further amend and alter the said regulations respectively:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and by and

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke and rescind the said amended regulations dated the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and so much of the regulations dated the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, as is comprised in Regulation four, intituled "In respect of Floating Balances," and, in lieu thereof respectively, and by and with the like advice and consent, and in exercise of the like power and authority, His Excellency the Governor doth hereby order and declare that, from and after the day of the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette, the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby prescribed for the purpose of providing in what manner, at what times, and in what proportions the interest in respect of the investment of floating balances in the Public Trustee's Account shall be divided amongst the properties from which the fund arises: Provided that nothing contained in such regulation with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the arises: Provided that nothing contained in such regulation shall affect moneys as to which special provision is made for the investment thereof by the trusts affecting the particular property.

SCHEDULE.

IN RESPECT OF FLOATING BALANCES.

ALL floating balances at the credit of estates shall bear interest at the rate of £4 per cent. per annum, subject to the

following provisions:

(1.) Interest on the balance of each estate shall be computed and allowed as to the 31st March, the 30th June, the 30th September, and the 31st December in each and every year on the minimum balance that shall have been at the credit estate at any time during the quarter ending on each of the days above mentioned, but no interest shall be allowed on any estate in respect of which there was not a balance in the office on the first day of each quarter.

(2.) No interest shall be allowed on any estate which has not had a balance at credit amounting to £50 at some period during the quarter.

during the quarter.

(3.) Notwithstanding the restriction contained in subsection 2 hereof, interest shall be allowed at the rate, times, and in manner aforementioned on all estates retained in the office by reason of the person or persons beneficially entitled thereto, or in whom the same are vested, being a minor or minors, and during the period only of his or their minority respectively, of which the aggregate minimum balance at credit

tively, of which the aggregate minimum balance at credit during the then current quarter shall not be less than £10.

(4.) Interest shall only be added to the balance at credit of an estate (so as to form part of the principal fund thereof) on the 31st December in each and every year.

(5.) When the balance at credit of an estate shall be withdrawn, such interest shall be added thereto as had accrued due up to the close of the quarter next preceding such withdrawn.

And these amended regulations shall form and be read as part of the regulations so first prescribed as aforesaid.

Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following
sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject

(1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ½d. and ½d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export

canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

Or he may within one month after the date of the certificate give notice to the Commissioner that he is desirous of purchasing the shares or interests which he has not already acquired, and in such case he may, on obtaining a certificate from a Judge that such Judge is satisfied that he had, before the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, obtained the signature of one or more owner or six, obtained the signature of one or more owner or owners to a writing purporting or agreeing to convey the share or interest of the persons signing, at any time within twelve months from the said first day of July, but not afterwards, purchase all or any of such shares or interests.

If all such outstanding shares or interests are not pur-

If all such outstanding shares or interests are not purchased, he shall be entitled to have partitioned to him such part of the land as the Court may deem just;

(c.) If a lessee, shall be entitled to have the share of his lessors in the land comprised in his lease ascertained, and partition made thereof to such lessors, and shall be entitled to hold his lease subject to the terms thereof until its expiry;

(d.) Or he may, within one month after the date of the certificate, give notice to the Commissioner that he is desirous of obtaining a lease of all or some of the owners who have not already granted him a lease, and in such case he may, on obtaining a certificate from a Judge that such Judge is satisfied that he had, before the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, obtained the signature of one or more owner or owners to a writing purporting to be or agreement to grant a lease of the land or of the share or interest of the person signing, at any time within twelve months from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, but not afterwards, but in a lease of the land or of the prevants. eight hundred and eighty-six, but not afterwards, obtain a lease of all or any of such shares or interests for the same term as he holds the shares or interests acquired before the coming into operation of this Act.
