

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the twenty-fifth section of "The Licen-sing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor, on the application of the owners of any block or area of Native land on which no publican's license has been hitherto granted, may, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, declare that no license shall be granted within such block or area, and it shall not be lawful for the Licensing Committee to issue any license to take effect within any block or area so pro-claimed : claimed :

claimed: And whereas the owners of the Native land described in the Schedule hereto, and on which no publican's license has hitherto been granted, have applied to have the said section brought into force within the boundaries of the said land: Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do, in pursu-ance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, hereby proclaim and declare that no license shall be granted within the area of Native land described in the said Schedule.

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ¼d. and ¼d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two hast subsections.

Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an applica-tion for reward tion for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.
Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.


