The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Wednesday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of

such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chair-

man.
7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Regulations for the Visiting of Industrial Schools.

Y virtue of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Industrial Schools Act, 1882," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth make the following regulations for the visiting of Government schools established or maintained under the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. THE Visitors of any "Government school" established emaintained under "The Industrial Schools Act, 1882," including all persons appointed by the Minister of Education to be Visitors of such school, all Members of the General Assembly, all Judges of the Supreme Court and of District Courts, all Justices of the Peace, all Chairmen of Hospital and Charitable Aid Boards, and all Inspectors of Industrial Schools, may hold a Visitors' meeting once in every calendar month. month.

nonth.

2. The date and place of the first Visitors' meeting for each Government industrial school shall be appointed by the Minister of Education, and notice of the same shall be given in the Zew Zealand Gazette at least one month before

the date of such meeting.

3. At each monthly meeting the Visitors present shall elect

3. At each monthly meeting the Visitors present shall elect a Chairman of the meeting.

4. At each monthly meeting the Visitors may determine the time and place of their next monthly meeting, or at any monthly meeting they may establish a rule to settle the time and place of ordinary monthly meetings.

5. Subject to the approval of the Minister, the Visitors at a monthly meeting may lay down rules affirming that business of certain kinds shall be transacted by them at their monthly meetings, and not at any other time; and they may choose one or more of their number to exercise on their hear monthly meetings, and not at any other time; and they may choose one or more of their number to exercise, on their behalf and exclusively, any powers that may be or become necessary to be exercised in the intervals between any two meetings or between meetings generally; provided that nothing may be done by the Visitors to curtail the authority that any Visitor possesses as a Visitor under the Industrial Schools Act.

6. The Minister may at his discretion if provided that

The Minister may at his discretion, if moved thereto by means of a resolution passed at a monthly meeting of Visitors, order that every proposal for the licensing of an immate shall be submitted to the Visitors—or to one or more of the Visitors chosen under regulation 5-before being sent to the Minister

HEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in Trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no Trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such Trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as Trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the real estate described or referred to in the fifth column, for estates therein derived as mentioned in the sixth column:

I AM commanded by my Lords Commissioners of the Ad-I am commanded by my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary for the Colonies, that, in view of the fact that there are at present four cadetships given annually to the sons of gentlemen of the colonies, my Lords have decided that in future three engineer studentships shall be offered annually under the same general regulations as are at present in force with regard to other candidates for these appointments.

Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for report.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.
