WHEREAS by "The Licensing Act, 1881," and "The Licensing Act Amendment Act, 1882," it is enacted that the Governor shall from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Acts, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same and may abolish any district:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Acts, do hereby abolish, from and after the eighteenth day of July next, the Licensing Districts of Matakohe, Paparoa, and Wairau, and do hereby alter and redefine the boundaries of the Albert and Mangapai Licensing Districts, which shall, from and after the eighteenth day of July next, be those described in the First Schedule hereto; and do hereby proclaim and define the part of the colony mentioned and described in the Second Schedule hereto to be, from and after the said eighteenth day of July next, ordinary licensing districts for the purposes of the said Act.

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority

2. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the wharf, and of ingress and egress thereon.

3. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

4. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

5. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repairs thereof; and that upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made. be made.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and

that are now or may hereafter be in force.
7. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for

- the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

  8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.
- 9. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council.

10. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

11. In case the Council shall—
(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein-

before set forth, or any of them; or
(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf;
then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and deter-mined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred,

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively \(\frac{1}{2}\dot{d}\), and \(\frac{1}{8}\ddot{d}\), a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000

10. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 496 against 440 in April, an increase of 56. The deaths in May were 162, a decrease of 13 on the number for April. Of the total deaths, males contributed 91; females, 71. Sixty-eight of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 41.98 per cent. of the whole number; 55 of these were under 1 year of age.

The births in May were 275 against 225 in April, an increase of 50. The deaths in May were 94 against 110 in April, a decrease of 16.

There were 8 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 3 males of 86, 76, and 67 died at Auckland; 1 male of 75 and 1 female of 65 at Christchurch; and 2 males of 75 and 74 and 1 female of 79 at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these causes were 2 less in number in May than in April, although, on account of the decrease in the total number of deaths, they caused a larger percentage of the total deaths. Of these deaths in May diphtheria caused 5, all in Christchurch. This is almost an exceptionally large number for any one borough. In one instance only has the number been exceeded in any borough, viz., in September, 1885, when there were 6 deaths from diphtheria in Wellington. Typhoid fever caused 5 deaths, 3 of which were in Wellington, making 7 deaths in that borough from typhoid fever in the two months of April and May. Diarrhœal diseases were unusually fatal for the month of May, having caused 10 deaths. Of these, 7, chiefly of children, occurred in Auckland.

Constitutional Diseases.—There was a considerable decrease in the mortality from these diseases in May as compared with April. Cancer, which caused 7 deaths in April, does not appear as a cause of death in May, and the deaths from phthisis were only 7 in number in May against 14 in the previous month.

Local Diseases.—These diseases caused an increased number of deaths from 28 in April to 37 in May. Of these the diseases of the circulatory system caused 5 deaths against 3, and diseases of the respiratory system 7 against 4, in

the previous month. The deaths from diseases of the reproductive system include 3 attributable to complaints incident to childbirth. Including 1 death from purporal peritonitis in the zymotic class, there were 4 deaths ensuing from childbirth.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
