Kermadec Islands declared to be Part of New Zealand.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and bearing date the eighteenth day of January, in the fiftieth year of the reign of Her Majesty Victoria, by the grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India, after reciting, among other things, that certain islands belonging to Her said Majesty, situated in the South Pacific Ocean, between the parallels of twenty-nine degrees and thirty-two degrees south latitude, and the meridians of one hundred and seventy-seven degrees and one hundred and eighty degrees west longitude, and commonly known as the Kermadec Group, should be annexed to and form part of the Colony of New Zealand, Her said Majesty did authorise the Governor for the time being of the said colony, by Proclamation under his hand and the Public Seal of the said colony, to declare that, from and after a day to be therein mentioned, the said islands should be annexed to and form part of the said colony; and by the now-reciting Letters Patent the said Governor was directed not to issue any such Proclamation as aforesaid unless the Legislature of the said Colony of New Zealand should have passed a law providing that the said islands should, on the day aforesaid, become part of the said colony, and subject to the laws in force therein:

And whereas on the sixth day of June now last past the Legislature of the Colony of New Zealand passed a law, the Short Title whereof is "The Kermadec Islands Act, 1887," providing that, from and after a day mentioned in a Proclamation to be issued by the Governor pursuant to the authority contained in the hereinbefore in part recited Letters Patent, the said group of islands, situated in the South Pacific Ocean and commonly known as the Kermadec Group, should become part of the Colony of New Zealand, subject to the laws in force therein: And whereas it is expedient that effect should be given to the said hereinbefore in part recited Letters Patent and to the said Act, as and in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the hereinbefore in part recited Letters Patent, do, by this Proclamation under my hand and the Public Seal of the said colony, declare that, from and after the first day of August next, the said group of islands, situated in the South Pacific Ocean and commonly known as the Kermadec Group, shall be annexed to and form part of the Colony of New Zealand.

Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

Treasury Department,
Wellington, 10th November, 1885.

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

JULIUS VOGEL.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

(1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively $\frac{1}{2}$ d. and $\frac{1}{4}$ d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial

workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—

The births in June were 273 against 275 in May, a decrease of 2. The deaths in June were 88 against 94 in May, a decrease of 6.

There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 4 males of 80, 69 (2), and 66, and a female of 73 died at Auckland; a male of 75 and a female of 70 at Wellington; 3 males of 84, 70, and 65, and a female of 67 at Christchurch.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The proportion per cent. of deaths from these causes fell from 23.40 in May to 15.91 in June, the numbers being 22 and 14 for the respective months. Deaths from cholera, diarrhœa, and dysentery fell from 11 to 4, the decrease being mainly at Auckland.

Developmental Diseases.—The reduced number for June is owing to there being no deaths from premature birth, 5 of which occurred in May.

Local Diseases.—The mortality at Auckland, 18 deaths, shows an increase on the May number of 9, and at Wellington of 6. At Auckland diseases of the respiratory system were more prevalent in June than in May.

Violent Deaths.—From accidental causes there were 5 deaths, and from suicide 1 death by shooting.

The mortality from all causes was somewhat higher at Auckland and Wellington in June than in May, at Christchurch slightly less, and at Dunedin exactly half for June of the number for May. The reduced number for Dunedin is noticeable, and the principal cause is fewer deaths from premature birth, old age, convulsions, and diseases of the digestive and urinary systems.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
