List of Awards granted to Residents in New Zea-LAND, 1886-87, WITH PRÉCIS OF CASES.

MILLIAM AILIAN FISHER (aged thirty-three years), surgeon, saved the lives of Alice Maloney, aged nine years, and George Taylor, aged forty-three years, at Wairoa River, North Clyde, Hawke's Bay, on the 24th April, 1885. A ferry-boat upset in the middle of the river and all the occupants thrown into the water. Alice Maloney and George Taylor being unable to swim, and were kept affoat by Dr. Fisher and Thomas Carroll, until rescued by Mr. Large in a canoe. Awarded a certificate of merit. certificate of merit.

THOMAS CARROLL (aged thirty-five years), sheep-farmer, assisted to save the lives of Alice Maloney and George Taylor, on the 24th April, 1885, at the Wairoa River, by jumping in

on the 24th April, 1885, at the Wairoa River, by jumping in and helping to support the above named, as described in the preceding case. Awarded a certificate of merit.

DAVID GILMOUR STEPHENS (aged forty-three years), inspector of works, Dunedin, restored to consciousness Agnes Ferguson, aged ten years, at Dowling Bay, on the 6th September, 1885. Agnes Ferguson with others had been upset from a boat, and brought on shore apparently drowned. Mr. Stephens, by his exertions and encouragement, persistently

from a boat, and brought on shore apparently drowned. Mr. Stephens, by his exertions and encouragement, persistently maintained for upwards of two hours his efforts to restore animation, and was rewarded at last by life returning and ultimately consciousness being restored. The child was taken to her home. Awarded a certificate of commendation. Bella Daniel (aged fourteen years), a Maori girl, employed in household duties, endeavoured to rescue Tepeni Turi, a Maori, from drowning in Cook Strait, on the 21st December, 1885. A boat with two Maoris and the girl Daniel was returning to D'Urville Island from the mainland, when she was capsized; and the water was up to the gunwale, and in a sinking state. One of the Maoris shortly after died from exhaustion, the other tried to drown himself by leaping into the sea. Bella Daniel brought him back he died shortly after. She then lashed his body to the boat, and was herself rescued, with the two dead bodies, on the and was herself rescued, with the two dead bodies, on the following morning. Awarded a bronze medal.

following morning. Awarded a bronze medal.

CHARLES EDWARD MATTHEWS (aged fourteen years), a school-boy, saved the life of his brother, aged six years, a Pelorus Sound, Marlborough, on the 8th January, 1886. A boat, with six boys, who had been fishing, capsized: Matthews supported his brother on his shoulders on the bottom of the boat for upwards of two hours, the boat rolling and throwing them off; and, though completely exhausted with cold and fatigue, he pluckily held his brother till help arrived. Two boys were drowned. Awarded a certificate of merit.

WILLIAM PEAKE (aged twenty-nine years), a carpenter, saved the life of Albert Nicholas, at the Queen's Wharf,

Auckland, on the 19th May, 1886, by jumping off the wharf on a dark night, being heavily clad, catching hold of Nicholas, who was helpless, and swam with him to a ship, and supported him till rescued. There was a strong ebb tide running at the time. Awarded a bronze medal.

JAMES HENRY PARKER (aged thirty years), a clothier, saved the life of a man (unknown), at the Sumner Baths, near Christchurch, on the 28th February, 1886, by jumping into the baths to the rescue of a man seized with cramp, and, after a severe struggle, owing to the roughness of the sea and the strength of the current, succeeded in getting him to the pallisade and supporting him till aid came. Awarded a certificate of merit. tificate of merit.

James Duncan Fraser (aged fifteen years), a school-boy, saved the life of Stanley Dawson, a child of five years of age, at the River Avon, Christchurch, on the 26th July, 1886, by swimming half way across the river, and rescued the boy, who was being carried down by the stream, by holding him above the water till assistance arrived. Awarded a certificate of morit

WILLIAM TRUEMAN (aged 32 years), a fireman on the railway, saved the life of James Edward Hagan, an infant eighteen months old, near Silver Stream Railway-station, on the 19th September, 1885, by jumping from a heavily-lader train going about nine miles an hour, and, when only a few train going about nine miles an hour, and, when only a few feet intervened between the engine and the child, rushed in front of the engine and lifted the child off the line. Trueman was struck on the leg by the cow-catcher. Awarded a

was struck on the leg by the concentration bronze medal.

FREDERICK WILLIAM LARSEN (aged thirteen years), a farm-servant, for endeavouring to save Laura Emanuel, aged ten years, from drowning in the Buller River on the 27th February, 1886. Laura Emanuel and other girls were bathing, when the former got out of her depth. Hearing the cries, Larsen ran to the place, divested himself of some of his clothes, dived, but could not find the body; he again tried, brought it to the surface and to the bank. The river-bottom was covered with dead trees and roots, making it dangerous in diving. Emanuel was drowned. Awarded a bronze

medal.

Kairangi, a native of Manahiki, Cook's Group, serving as an able-seaman on board the schooner "Sybil," of Auckland, endeavoured to save the life of George Henry Trayte, the master, from drowning on the 28th July, 1886, at sea, twelve miles off the island. The occurrence took place at 8 o'clock, when it was quite dark. The captain fell overboard, when Kairangi, who was at the wheel, jumped overboard and swam to the captain's assistance. About twenty-five minutes elapsed from the time the captain fell overboard until he and the native were got into the boat. Kairangi was very exhausted in his endeavours to keep the captain afloat. Awarded a silver medal.

Thomas G. Reid (aged forty years), and Francis Bowe.

THOMAS G. REID (aged forty years), and Francis Rowe (aged twenty-five years), miners, endeavoured to save the lives of Hugh Hill and Thomas Casely who were overpowered lives of Hugh Hill and Thomas Casely who were overpowered with gas at No. 2 level of the Caledonian Mine, Thames, on the 28th April, 1886. The two miners, Hill and Casely, while working in the mine were overpowered with gas, about 600ft. to 700ft. from the shaft. Reid and Rowe, when they heard of it, at once went down to No. 2 level and groped their way through 200ft. of this poisonous gas to try and find the men. They had the greatest difficulty in returning. Rowe was brought to the surface in an unconscious state. Each awarded a bronze medal.

Samuel Hancock, James Outridge, Humphrey Outridge, William Campbell, John Rickard, and William Corin, miners, also endeavoured to save the lives of Hill and Casely, as mentioned in the preceding case. These men formed the second party and went down to No. 3 level, and, after proceeding some distance through the poisonous gas, they found the bodies of the men, and tried to get them out, but failed, owing to the gas overpowering them. Each awarded a bronze medal.

James Lawes, Benjamin Barker, John McInnis, Joseph

awarded a bronze medal.

James Lawes, Benjamin Barker, John McInnis, Joseph Dunn, and Charles Manuel, miners, with others before mentioned, endeavoured to save the lives of Hill and Casely as already stated. These men formed the third party, and went down into the drive at the mine after those of the second party had been driven back by the gas. This party was twice driven back by the gas; but ultimately, by their determination and courage, they succeeded in recovering the bodies of Hill and Casely. Each awarded a bronze medal.

Alfred Wade (aged sixteen years), employed at farmwork, rescued his father from being gored by a bull, at Mangorei, Taranaki, on the 15th November, 1886. Wade saw the bull rush at and attack his father, and he immediately ran to his help and drove the bull off, without any weapon of self-defence. He stood over and protected his father in the

nis help and drove the buil off, without any weapon of self-defence. He stood over and protected his father in the middle of a field until a rope was brought, by which the bull was secured. Awarded a certificate of merit.

CHARLES ROBINSON (aged thirty-five years), steward on board s.s. "Hinemoa," rescued George Howler, aged five and a half years, from drowning, at the Railway Wharf, Wellington, on the 4th December, 1886. A small boy fell from the wharf

into the harbour, Charles Robinson jumped from the wharf, and dived, and ultimately rescued the boy. Awarded a bronze medal.

Van Mollier (aged thirty-five years), a lumper and seaman, saved Robert Wilson, aged seven and a half years, from drowning at the Railway Wharf, Wellington, on the 30th December, 1886. The boy fell into the water from the wharf, about noon, and, not being able to swim, was sinking, when Mollier, who was working in a ship's hold, came to his rescue, and jumped off the wharf and saved him from drowning. Awarded a bronze medal.

prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

(1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of Id. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ¼d. and ¾d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required. will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.
