Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

(1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of \$\frac{1}{2}d\$. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively \$\frac{1}{2}d\$. and \$\frac{1}{2}d\$. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Descriptions of Sections.

The sections in Blocks VIII., XI., and XII., Mangaone Survey District, are situated near Alfredton, between the Mangaone settlements and the Ihuraua River, and comprise hilly and flat country of fair and good quality, covered generally with light mixed bush, and on some of the Ihuraua flats with manuka. Most of the sections are well watered. Attention is directed to Sections 213 and 215, which include natural clearings natural clearings.

The small-farm sections comprise portions of the land originally surveyed as the Township of Alfredton; the southern half consists of flats covered with manuka, flax, &c.; the back part is hilly light bush land; the quality of

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 490 against 511 in June, a decrease of 21. The deaths in July were 155, a decrease of 10 on the number for June. Of the total deaths, males contributed 82; females, 73. Fifty-two of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 33.55 per cent. of the whole number; 31 of these were under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—
The births in July were 264 against 273 in June, a decrease of 9. The deaths in July were 96 against 88 in June,

an increase of 8.

There were 12 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 3 males of 87, 80, and 67, and a female of 81 died at Auckland; 3 males of 79, 73, and 67, and a female of 80 at Wellington; a male of 70 and 2 females of 77 and 73 at Christ-church; and a male of 68 at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—There were only 9 deaths from this class of disease in July, including one case

of scarlatina at Auckland.

Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality at the four towns was 20 deaths. Phthisis, from which there was only 1 death in June, caused 9 in July, 4 of which occurred at Wellington.

Local Diseases.—Of a total of 44 deaths 18 resulted from diseases of the respiratory system, including 9 cases of pneumonia against 1 in June. No deaths were caused by diseases of the urinary system, while 7 were registered in June which lowers the mortality from all local diseases in comparison with that of the previous month.

Ill-defined Causes.—10 deaths of children from debility, inanition, and marasmus are included. This large number raised the proportion per cent. of deaths from these causes from 1·14 in June to 12·50 in July.

The total mortality at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch for June and July does not differ greatly. It is noticed, however, that at Wellington phthisis, asthma, bronchitis, and pneumonia caused 11 deaths in the later month, but only 3 in the earlier.

The total of deaths at Dunedin for July is 21 against 12 for June 2 and 11 deaths in the later month, but only 3

The total of deaths at Dunedin for July is 21, against 12 for June, a small increase being found for each class of disease except dietetic.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
