HEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-seventh section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony

of New Zealand has, by Proclamation, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto for sale as a village settlement:

3. The lands which are disposed of by sale upon deferred payments shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1885."

4. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one allotment not exceeding an area of five acres.

5. The price stated in the Schedule hereto shall be the price at which the lands shall be open for application.

6. If there should be more than one application for any allotment, the right to occupy the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

7. Each applicant will be required to make the declaration prescribed by section one hundred and thirteen of "The Land Act, 1885," and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the Canterbury Land District one-tenth of the price of the allotment. Such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee for the six months due on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

WHEREAS certain regulations for fishing for trout and WHEREAS certain regulations for fishing for trout and perch in the Ashburton County, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and in the waters thereof, were made by Order in Council dated the twelfth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and published in the New Zealand Gazette number forty-five, of the fourteenth day of the same month: And whereas it is desirable to make additional regulations for fishing for trout and perch in the said county and in the waters thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," and "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Ashburton County, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and in the waters thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatisation Society may indorse any license to fish issued by any other acclimatisation society, and upon such indorsement being made the person in whose favour it was issued shall be entitled to the person in whose favour it was issued shall be entitled to fish for trout and perch in any of the waters within the County of Ashburton without payment by such person of any further fee, but subject in all other respects to the regulations with regard to fishing for trout and perch in force within the said county.

2. Licenses to fish for trout and perch in any of the waters in the County of Ashburton for a period not exceeding one month from the date of issue may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatisation Society to persons visiting the county, and for every such license a fee of five shillings will be charged.

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ½d. and ½d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required. will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

Descriptions of Sections.

The sections in Blocks VIII., XI., and XII., Mangaone urvey District, are situated near Alfredton, between the Mangaone settlements and the Ihuraua River, and comprise hilly and flat country of fair and good quality, covered generally with light mixed bush, and on some of the Ihuraua flats with manuka.
