*Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Auckland.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and fourth section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Auckland has passed a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Wednesday, the sixteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in the principal land office of the district.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the Marlborough Sheep District, as at present constituted, should be altered and reconstituted, and that a new district, to be called the Omaka Sheep District, should be constituted:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eighth section of "The Sheep Act, 1878," do hereby constitute anew the Marlborough Sheep District, and the subdivisions thereof respectively, and hereby constitute a new district to be called the Omaka Sheep District; and I do hereby declare that, for the purposes of the said Act, the said districts and the subdivisions of the Marlborough Sheep District shall hereafter be as the same are described in the Schedule hereto, including in such districts or subdivisions all boroughs within the territorial area comprised within the external boundaries of any such district or subdivision as defined in the said Schedule, although such boroughs do not actually form part of any county therein mentioned; and that such districts and subdivisions shall be known by the names set over each such district and subdivision respectively in the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

MARLBOROUGH SHEEP DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Provincial Districts of Marlborough and Nelson bounded generally towards the West, North-east, and East by the ocean from the head of Croiselles Harbour to the mouth of the Conway River; thence towards the South-west generally by that river to its source; thence towards the South by a straight line in the direction of the confluence of the Acheron and the Dillon Rivers as far as the western boundary-line of Run No. 1, Terako Survey District; thence again towards the East by the said Run No. 1; again towards the South by Run No. 84, Square 81, Percival Survey District; again towards the East generally by the said Run No. 84 and Runs Nos. 97 and 59 of Square 81 to the Hanmer River; thence again towards the South by that river and the Waiau River to the confluence of the Boyle River with the

said Waiau River; thence towards the West by the last-mentioned river to its confluence with the River Henry; thence again towards the South-west and towards the North-west generally by the southern, western, and north-western boundaries of Section No. 16, Square 183, Dillon Survey District, the western boundary-line of Section No. 14, Square 183, Maling Survey District, the south-western boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 15 and 9, Square 183, and the western boundary-line of the last-mentioned section; again towards the North-east by the north-eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 9 and 15 aforesaid; thence again towards the North-west generally by the north-western and northern boundary-lines of Section No. 12, the northern and north-eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 11, and the north-eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 10A and 10, Square 103, Maling Survey District; thence by lines so as to include Runs Nos. 99 and 106 to Lake Tennyson; thence by that lake, the northern boundary-line of Run No. 1, Square 72, Alma Survey District, and the north-western and north-eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 1, Square 71, to Serpentine Creek; thence by the right bank of that creek to its source; thence by a straight line to the source of the Wairau River; thence by the left bank of the said Wairau River to a reserve of 13,000 acres in the Wairau Survey District; thence by the western, north-western, north-eastern, and eastern boundary-lines of that reserve to Run No. 3, Square 70, Wairau Survey District aforesaid; and thence by the north-western boundary-lines of Runs Nos. 3 aforesaid and 4 to the boundary between the Provincial Districts of Nelson and Marlborough; thence again towards the South-west by the Provincial District of Nelson to the Wairau River; thence again towards the South-east by the said Wairau River to the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 6, Wiesenhaven Run; thence again towards the South-west and North-west by the south-western and north-western boundary-lines of the said Section No. 6, the north-western boundary-line of Section No. 3, the south-western and north-western boundary-lines of Section No. 4, and the north-western boundary-line of Section No. 7, all of Wiesenhaven Run aforesaid, to Ward's Pass; thence by the summit of the watershed between the Wairau River and Tasman Bay to the source of the Pelorus River; thence by that river to its confluence with the Heringa River; thence by that river to its source; thence by a right line to Saddle Hill; thence by the summit of the watershed between the Pelorus and Tasman Bay to Mount McLaren; and thence by a right line to the head of Croiselles Harbour: including D'Urville Island, Arapawa Island, and Forsyth and Chetwode Islands, and all islands adjacent thereto; excluding therefrom the Omaka Sheep District; and shall comprise the following subdivisions:—

*The Picton Subdivision.*

Bounded generally towards the West, North-east, and South-east by the sea from the head of Croiselles Harbour to White's Bay at the north-east corner of the Native reserve; towards the South-east generally by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 37, Picton Suburban; thence by the northern boundary of that section produced to the Tuamarina River; thence by the northern boundary of the Raydale Run to the north-western corner of that run; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 9, Okaramio Valley; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 72, Havelock Suburban; thence by a right line to the south-west corner of Section No. 85, Havelock Suburban; thence by the summit of the watershed between the Atuhau Stream and the Kaituna River to the watershed between the Wairau and Pelorus Valleys, and by the summit of that watershed to the watershed between the Wairau River and Blind Bay; thence generally towards the north-west by the Nelson Sheep District to the head of Croiselles Harbour, the starting-point: including D'Urville Island, Arapawa Island, and Forsyth and Chetwode Islands.

*The Blenheim Subdivision.*

Bounded towards the East by the sea from the mouth of the Awatere River to the north-east corner of Native reserve at White's Bay; towards the North by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 37, Picton Suburban; thence by the northern boundary of that section produced to the Tuamarina River; thence by the northern boundary of the Raydale Run to the north-western corner of that run; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 9, Okaramio Valley; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 72, Havelock Suburban; thence by a right line to the south-west corner of Section No. 85, Havelock Suburban; thence by the watershed between the Atuhau Stream and the Kaituna River to the watershed between the Wairau and Pelorus Valleys, and by that watershed to the watershed between the Wairau River and Blind Bay; towards the North-west by that watershed over Mount Rintoul to Ward's Pass; thence along the northern and western boundaries of Sections Nos. 7, 4, and 3, Wiesen-

haven Run, known as the "Red Hills Reserve," to the Wairau River; thence northerly along the right bank of that river to a point in line with Tophouse and Barefell Pass; towards the West by a right line from thence to the Awatere Subdivision, hereinafter described; and towards the South by the said Awatere Subdivision to the mouth of the Awatere River, the starting-point: excluding therefrom the Omaka Sheep District.

*The Awatere Subdivision.*

Bounded towards the East by the sea from the mouth of the Kekerangu River to the mouth of the Awatere River; thence on the North and West by the Awatere River from its mouth to a point on Section No. 30, Wakefield Downs (being the south-western corner of the Vernon Run); thence by a right line to the south-western corner of Section No. 29, Wakefield Downs; thence by the eastern side of the road between Sections Nos. 33 and 29, Wakefield Downs, and Sections Nos. 4 and 2 of Block I., District of Awatere, to the Utawai Stream; thence by the Utawai Stream to the northern boundary of Section No. 2 of Block I., District of Awatere; thence along that boundary to Maxwell Pass Stream; thence by the Maxwell Pass Stream to the watershed; thence by a tributary of the Taylor River to the Taylor River at the base of a hill called the "Maori;" thence by the northern boundaries of the Dumgree and Blairich Runs to the summit of the dividing range between the Awatere and Wairau Valleys to Langridge Run No. 2; thence by the western boundary of that run to the summit of the range; thence by the said summit to Saxon's Pass; thence by the stream running out of Saxon's Pass to the Acheron River; thence by that river to the junction of the Saxon; thence by the Saxon for a distance of 210 chains; thence by a line due east and west to intersect a right line drawn from Tophouse to Barefell Pass; thence by part of said line to Barefell Pass; thence by the Guide River to its confluence with the Acheron River; thence by that river to its confluence with the Clarence River; thence towards the South by a right line to a point on the Clarence River where a right line drawn from the junction of the Acheron and Clarence Rivers to the source of the River Conway intersects it; thence towards the South-east by the Kaikoura Subdivision, hereinafter described, to the mouth of the Kekerangu River, the starting-point.

*The Kaikoura Subdivision.*

Bounded towards the East by the sea from the mouth of the River Conway to the mouth of the River Kekerangu; thence North by the River Kekerangu to the junction of Benmore Stream; thence by that stream to its source; thence by a tributary of the River Ure to the southern boundary of the Chalk Range Run; thence by the southern boundary of the Chalk Range Run to the Upton Fells Run; thence by the southern boundary of Upton Fells Run to Upton Fells Run No. 2; thence by the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Upton Fells Run No. 2 to Section No. 11 on the Upton Fells Run; thence by that section to the eastern boundary of the Camden Run No. 2; thence by that boundary and the southern boundaries of Camden Run No. 2 to the summit of the dividing range between the Awatere and Clarence Valleys; thence on the West by a line along the said summit to Lake McRae Run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run to a point where a right line drawn from the junction of the Acheron and Clarence Rivers to where the source of the Conway River intersects it; thence by a right line to the source of the River Conway; and thence by the right bank of that river to its mouth, the starting-point.

*The Hopefield Subdivision.*

All that area in the Provincial District of Nelson bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of the Rivers Boyle and Waiau, and proceeding northerly along the Waiau River to its confluence with the River Henry; thence along the left bank of the said River Henry to the western boundary-line of Section No. 16, Square 183, Dillon Survey District; thence along the western, north-western, and north-eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 16 aforesaid, along the western boundary-line of Section No. 14, Square 183, Maling Survey District, along the south-western boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 15 and 9, Square 183, along the western boundary-line of the said Section No. 9, and along the northern and north-eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 9 and 15 aforesaid of Maling Survey District, along the western and northern boundary-lines of Section No. 12, along the northern and north-eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 11, and along the eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 10A and 10, Square 103, Maling Survey District aforesaid, along the north-western, western, north-eastern, and south-western boundary-lines of Run No. 99, and along the western and northern boundary-lines of Run No. 186 to Lake Tennyson; thence southerly along the shore of that lake to Run No. 1, Square 72, Alma Survey District; thence northerly generally along the northern and eastern boundary-lines of Run No. 1 aforesaid, and of Section No. 1, Square 71, to Serpentine

Creek; thence along the right bank of that creek to its source; thence along a straight line to the source of the Wairau River, and along the left bank of that river to a reserve of 13,000 acres in the Wairau Survey District; thence along the western, north-western, north-eastern, and eastern boundary-lines of that reserve to Run No. 3, Square 70, Wairau Survey District aforesaid; thence easterly along the northern boundary-line of Run No. 4 to the boundary between the Provincial Districts of Nelson and Marlborough; thence southerly, westerly, and easterly along the Provincial District boundary to Run No. 1, Terako Survey District; thence southerly along the western boundary-line of that run, along the northern and western boundary-lines of Run No. 84 to Run No. 59, Square 81; thence along the north-western and south-western boundary-lines of Runs Nos. 59 and 97, Square 81, Percival Survey District, to the Hammer River; and thence westerly along that river and the Wairau River aforesaid to the place of commencement.

OMAKA SHEEP DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial District of Marlborough bounded generally towards the North and West by the Omake River from the Renwick New Road to the dividing fence between the Hawkesbury Run and land in the occupation of John Newman; thence generally towards the South and West by that dividing fence to the southern boundary of Section No. 7, Block I., Avon Survey District; thence by that boundary, the dividing fence between the Brookby and Tyntesfield Runs, the southern boundaries of Sections Nos. 110, Avon Survey District, 109, 39 of Square 42, 107 and 106, Taylor Pass Survey District, and a tributary of the Fairhall River to the Fairhall River; thence generally towards the East and North by that river to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 108, Taylor Pass Survey District; thence by a public road across the Fairhall River to its junction with another public road intersecting Sections Nos. 15 and 16, Block I., Taylor Pass Survey District; thence by that road to a point in Section No. 102, Taylor Pass Survey District, 1375 links from its southern boundary; thence by a line parallel to the southern boundary of said Section No. 102 to the Fairhall River aforesaid, and by that river to the dividing fence between the Hawkesbury Run and land in the occupation of Edward Fairhall; thence by that dividing fence to the Renwick New Road aforesaid, and by that road to the Omake River aforesaid.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His

Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the twenty-second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to

The OTAHUHU ROAD BOARD,

which shall be known as the Otahuhu Public Domain Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Monday in each month, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., at the Road Board Office, Otahuhu, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the twenty-first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the third Monday in December in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Hawke's Bay Acclimatisation District, and the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout and perch in all waters within that district or part of the North Island known as the Hawke's Bay Acclimatisation District, comprising the Counties of Waipawa and Patangata, Hawke's Bay and Wairoa, may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of

the Hawke's Bay Acclimatisation Society (hereinafter termed "the said society"), or any one authorised by the said Secretary in that behalf: Provided that it shall not be obligatory on the said Secretary or his deputy to issue a license.

2. For every such license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged. Licenses may also be issued to boys of the age of sixteen years or under at a reduced fee of ten shillings for each license so issued; but no license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. The Secretary of the said society may issue day licenses to *bonâ fide* travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid, on their introduction to him by any two members of the said society, and on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each day's fishing: Provided that this payment may be remitted if the applicant be a member of or hold a valid license from any other society in New Zealand which grants the like privilege.

4. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line for trout and perch, and may use a landing-net or gaff to secure any trout or perch caught with such rod and line, in the above-named waters, from the first day of October in any year to the third day of April in any year, both inclusive; but every such license shall be for one season only, and shall expire on the third day of April following the date on which it is issued.

5. No license shall authorise any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that with natural or artificial fly, insect, or fish only.

6. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the twelfth day of April and the thirtieth day of September, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the said society for purposes of acclimatisation.

7. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river or stream, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

8. No person shall take, fish for, catch or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

9. No person shall fish for trout or perch without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the said society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout or perch.

10. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

11. No person shall take, catch, or kill any perch under eight inches in length, nor shall perch be taken, caught, or killed at all, or had in possession of any person, between the fourth day of April and the thirtieth day of November in any year.

12. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout or perch, nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

13. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking salmon, or trout, or perch in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream.

14. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of one-quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low-water.

15. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any salmon, trout, or perch, or any part thereof.

16. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

17. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

## REGULATIONS.

1. ANY holder of a license as hereinafter mentioned may fish for trout with rod and line, and may use a landing-net to secure any trout caught with such rod and line, in each river or stream in the Provincial District of Nelson which flows into Blind Bay, from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, both inclusive. Such licenses will be issued under the hand of the Honorary Secretary of the Nelson Acclimatisation Society, and for every such license a fee of ten shillings will be charged.

2. The Secretary of the said society may issue day licenses to *bonâ fide* travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid, on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each day's fishing.

3. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line for trout, and may use a landing-net to secure any trout caught with such rod and line, in the above-named rivers, from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, both inclusive.

4. No license shall authorise any person other than the person named therein to fish.

5. Any person fishing either without a license, or who shall, on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on demand of any ranger, police officer, or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, ranger, police officer, or constable his license, or the contents of his creel, basket, or bag, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than twenty shillings and not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout.

7. All trout not exceeding seven inches in length taken by any person shall be immediately returned alive to the water; and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than twenty shillings and not exceeding twenty pounds.

8. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream; and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than forty shillings and not exceeding fifty pounds.

9. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of one-quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low-water.

10. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river or stream in the said district, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than forty shillings and not exceeding fifty pounds.

11. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations the license, if any, held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

12. These regulations shall come into force as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no Trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such Trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

#### A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-third year of our reign, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to the Coinage and Her Majesty's Mint, it is, amongst other things, enacted that We, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, shall, from time to time, by Proclamation, determine the design for any coin:

We have therefore thought fit to order that certain of the coins made at the Mint, mentioned in the First Schedule to the aforesaid Act, of the weight and fineness specified in that Schedule, shall bear designs as follows:—

That every five-pound piece should have for the obverse impression our effigy, with the inscription "Victoria D.G. Britt: Reg: F.D.," and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every two-pound piece should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every sovereign should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every half-sovereign should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia," and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a garnished shield surmounted by the Royal crown, with the inscription "Britanniarum Regina Fid: Def:" and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every crown should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every half-crown should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia," and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a plain shield surrounded by the Garter bearing the motto, "Honi soit qui mal y pense," and the collar of the Garter with the inscription "Britanniarum Regina Fid: Def:," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every florin should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia," and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom contained in four shields arranged cross-wise, each shield crowned, and between the shields four sceptres surmounted by orbs, a thistle, and a harp, and a star of the Garter in the centre, with the inscription "Britt: Reg: Fid: Def:" and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every shilling should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia Britt: Regina F.D.," and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a plain shield surrounded by the Garter bearing the motto "Honi soit qui mal y pense," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every sixpence should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the shilling, with a graining upon the edge; and that certain other pieces of silver money called "The Queen's Maundy Monies," of fourpence, threepence, twopence, and one penny, should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia Britt: Regina F.D.," and for the reverse the respective figures "4," "3," "2," "1" (according to the denomination or value of the piece) in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled by an oak wreath surmounted by the Royal crown, with a plain edge.

And whereas by the aforesaid Act it is also enacted that

it shall be lawful for Us, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, from time to time, by Proclamation, to determine the denominations of coins to be coined at the Mint, and it is by the said Act provided that any coin of gold, silver, or bronze, of any other denomination than that of the coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the aforesaid Act, which is hereafter coined at the Mint, shall be of a weight and fineness bearing the same proportion to the weight and fineness specified in that Schedule as the denomination of such coin bears to the denominations mentioned in that Schedule:

We have, therefore, further thought fit to order that a new coin, to be called a double florin, should be coined, of the standard weight of 349.09090 grains, and of the fineness of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy, and should pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, at the rate of four shillings or one-fifth of a pound; and that every such coin should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the florin, with a graining upon the edge.

And whereas pieces of money of the above descriptions respectively have been coined at our Mint, and will be coined there in pursuance of orders which We have given for that purpose:

We have, therefore, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said pieces of money respectively so coined and to be coined as aforesaid shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and this our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation on the date hereof.

Given at our Court, at Windsor, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of our reign.

*Patea Industrial Exhibition.*

*Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.*

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

- (1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ¼d. and ½d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

AMENDED CONDITIONS.

1. THE maximum sum offered as a reward for any proved discovery of a new goldfield in accordance with these conditions is £500; but, if the total sum claimed as rewards in any one year exceeds the parliamentary vote, the amount available only will be divided equally.

2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

## DESCRIPTION OF SECTIONS.

The sections in Blocks XII., XV., and XVI., Tiriraukawa, form part of the Otari Block, about seven and twenty-three miles north of Hunterville and Marton respectively, on or adjacent to the Marton-Murimotu Road and the track made by the Public Works Department from Pekiore to the Rangitikei River. The country is generally of a hilly broken character, with flats and undulating land on some of the sections; the soil on the flats is generally fair or good, but on the hills it varies from poor to fair quality; the forest comprises generally birch on the hills, rata, rimu, kahikatea, &c., on the flats, and the ordinary undergrowth of scrub; there is some totara on Section 9 of Block XVI.
