*Regulations under "The Mining Act, 1886," for Prospecting Licenses and Prospectors' Mining Leases granted outside Mining Districts.*

A PROCLAMATION.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by sections one hundred and thirty-one and one hundred and thirty-two of "The Mining Act, 1886," and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the granting of prospecting licenses in respect of Crown lands outside a mining district, and prescribing the form, time, and manner of making applications for leases of such lands, and the form of such leases respectively.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

1. EVERY person desirous of obtaining a prospecting license to search and prospect for gold, silver, or any metal or mineral upon any Crown lands outside mining districts shall apply for such license to the Governor, by delivering to the Commissioner of Crown Lands of the district in which the land is situated an application containing the name of the locality, with boundaries within which he desires to prospect.

2. The fee (payable on application) for every prospecting license shall be £1.

3. The license shall be for any term not exceeding twelve months, and shall be in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

4. Any holder of a prospecting license, who shall be the *bonâ fide* discoverer of any gold, silver, or metal or mineral on Crown land not being within a mining district, and who shall be desirous of obtaining a lease (hereinafter termed "a prospector's mining lease") of the said land, shall make application in writing to the Governor, by delivering such writing to the Commissioner of Crown Lands of the district in which such land is situated.

5. Previous to doing so the applicant shall mark the boundaries of the said land as hereinafter prescribed.

6. *Boundaries of Land applied for to be defined.*—Persons intending to apply for a prospector's mining lease shall, previous to making application as hereinafter directed, erect or cause to be erected at each angle of the land proposed to be licensed a post not less than 3in. in diameter, and standing at least 2ft. in height above the surface of the ground, or, where that is not practicable, a cairn of stones not less than 2ft. in height shall be erected at each corner of the land, and trenches not less than 6in. in depth by 10in. in width shall be cut for a distance of 5ft. on either side of such cairns, stacks, or posts, in the direction of the boundaries of the land proposed to be applied for; and, if in bush, one end-line shall be cleared and the trees blazed on such line from peg to peg. And all such posts and lines shall be maintained free from rubbish and clear during the whole of the time the land shall be held under lease as herein provided, so as to be readily observed; and such posts, cairns, and trenches shall be maintained at the expense of the applicant until the application shall have been granted or refused.

7. *Mode of Application.*—Every application for a prospector's mining lease shall be made in triplicate, in the form in the First Schedule hereto, to the Commissioner of Crown Lands of the district within which the land so applied for is situated, and shall be lodged in the office of such Commissioner by the applicant in person or his agent.

8. *Costs of Survey to be paid by the Applicant.*—The applicant, on making his application for a prospector's mining lease, shall deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for

the district within which the land applied for is situate the sum of £20 to cover the cost of survey and any other expenses that may be incurred by or on behalf of the Crown in connection with such application. Any portion of such sum which shall remain after defraying such costs and expenses shall be returned to the applicant; but, if the applicant shall neglect or refuse to execute or take delivery of the lease for a period of fourteen days after notice shall have been given to him that the lease is ready for execution, then the whole sum remaining in the hands of the said Receiver shall be forfeited.

9. *Withdrawal of Application.*—Any applicant for a prospector's mining lease may withdraw his application by giving notice in writing to that effect to the Commissioner of Crown Lands; and, should any such application be so withdrawn before any expense of survey has been incurred, the applicant shall be entitled to receive back one-half of any money he may have paid as survey-fees, and also his deposit, after deducting any expenses incurred.

10. *Priority of Application.*—In the event of more than one application being made for the same land, or any part thereof, the Commissioner of Crown Lands shall determine which of the applicants has the prior right, and in so doing shall be guided by priority of occupation; provided that it shall be shown that the prior occupant has used reasonable diligence in lodging his application.

11. *Protection during Application.*—All lands for which application shall have been made in the manner aforesaid shall be exempt from occupation from the date of such application until the same shall have been granted or refused.

12. *Survey, and Report to Commissioner.*—Upon receipt of any application the Commissioner of Crown Lands shall forward a copy of the same to the Chief Surveyor of the provincial district, who shall make or cause to be made a survey and furnish a plan of the ground to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, with a report as to the area, boundaries, description, and character of the ground, and as to the likelihood of any river, creek, or permanent water, spring, or artificial reservoir which may be included within the boundaries of the said land being required for, or the feasibility of the same being applied to, public purposes, or for the use of the miners of the district generally for gold-mining purposes, and also as to any claims to prior occupancy which shall come to his knowledge (inquiry as to which it shall be his duty to make while making the said survey); and the surveyor shall also furnish to the Commissioner of Crown Lands a plan of such land, together with a tracing of so much of the general map of the district as will be sufficient to connect the particular area applied for with at least one trigonometrical station, or, in the absence of any such, with some fixed point.

*Exceptions to Prospectors' Mining Leases outside Mining Districts.*

13. The exceptions next hereinafter appearing shall be made from all prospectors' mining leases outside mining districts granted under "The Mining Act, 1886," and the covenants, clauses, provisos, conditions, and agreements next hereinafter appearing shall be applicable to and shall be implied in all such leases, that is to say,—

(a.) *Right of Ingress and Egress.*—Her Majesty reserves to her Government of New Zealand, and all officers and servants thereof, the right of ingress, egress, and regress to, from, and across the land hereby held as a prospector's mining lease, and the mines thereon or thereunder, and of granting to any person or persons, or to the public, such right of ingress, egress, and regress, and of granting to any person the privilege of entering on such land for the purpose of constructing tunnels, shafts, water-races, tail-races, storm-channels, sludge-channels, tramways, or flood-races over, under, or through the said land, provided that the mining operations of the lessee are not injuriously affected thereby; also the right to lead head-water or tail-water through the same: Provided always that all such operations shall be sanctioned by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, and due compensation given to the said lessee or lessees, his or their heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, for any injury or damage sustained thereby.

(b.) Will at all times during the continuance of the lease permit the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or any person authorised by him in writing, to inspect the mine or mines on the said premises, and to take plans and drawings of the same, if required.

(c.) *Rent in Arrear, to distrain Machinery, Tools, &c.*—Provided also that, if the rents, payments, dues, or duties reserved in or payable under this lease shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of twenty-one days next after any of the days hereinbefore fixed for payment thereof, it shall be lawful for the said lessor, or any person duly authorised in that behalf, to enter upon the premises hereby held as a mining lease, and to distrain the machinery, tools, buildings, or other property of the said lessee for the time being in, under, or upon any part of the premises hereby held as a prospector's mining lease for or in respect of any such rent,

dues, or duties which ought to have been paid to the lessor or any person duly authorised to receive the same; and, should such default continue for the space of sixty days, then to determine the interest of the lessee in the premises so held as aforesaid, and that without releasing such lessee or lessees, his executors, administrators, or assigns, from his or their liability in respect of any rent, payments, or duties then due.

(d.) *Plan or Section of Mine.*—Provided also that they, the said lessee or lessees, his or their executors, administrators, or assigns, will and shall, at all times during the continuance of his or their mining lease, if required so to do by the said lessor or any person duly authorised in that behalf, prepare and keep a proper plan or section of all the workings, and actual condition, of the mines and premises held under mining lease, and will upon demand produce the said plan or section to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, and will permit him to take a copy or copies of the same.

(e.) *Number of Men to be employed.*—Provided also that he or they, the said lessee or lessees, his or their executors, administrators, or assigns, will and shall, at all times during the continuance of the mining lease, employ in or about the mines and premises hereby held as a mining lease a number of men being in the proportion of not less than one man to every full area of two acres of the lands hereby held, or the number of men mentioned in such mining lease.

(f.) *To furnish Returns, &c.*—Provided also that he or they, the said lessee or lessees, his or their executors, administrators, or assigns, shall and will at all times during the continuance of the mining lease furnish true and accurate half-yearly returns to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or other officer duly authorised in that behalf, of the average number of men on or about the mine and premises hereby held as a mining lease, and shall from time to time, whenever so required by the Commissioner of Crown Lands or other person duly authorised by the lessor, furnish a true and accurate account, certified as aforesaid, of the amount expended up to the date fixed for the expenditure of the full sum hereby agreed to be expended in and about the said mine and premises.

14. In any case in which an application shall have been made in pursuance of these regulations for a prospector's mining lease in respect of land whereon or on any part of which any person other than the applicant or applicants may be entitled under any license to cut, construct, or use any race or dam, or to enjoy any other easement for mining or other purposes, the Commissioner of Crown Lands may, if he think fit, authorise the issue of a prospector's mining lease of such land, subject to all existing rights in, to, or to the use of such race, dam, or other easement, and impose such terms as the said Commissioner may think fit, in order to secure the enjoyment of the same, or to secure compensation for any injury or inconvenience likely to arise to such person by reason of the issue of such license: Provided always that the Commissioner of Crown Lands may, if he think fit, authorise the construction in or upon any land comprised in any prospector's mining lease under these regulations of any race, dam, tunnel, or shaft, road, canal, railway, tramway, or other works which may be required for mining purposes or for public convenience.

15. *Surrender.*—Should the lessee be desirous of determining or surrendering his lease he shall be at liberty so to do on giving notice in writing to the Commissioner of Crown Lands of his desire to surrender, and on making all payments due or accruing due under the said lease at the date of such notice.

16. The Commissioner of Crown Lands, on being satisfied that the applicant is entitled to a prospector's mining lease of the land applied for, shall make out a lease in triplicate in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall, after obtaining the lessee's signature thereto, forward the same to the Minister of Mines for the approval of the Governor, together with a report upon the application.

17. The Commissioner of Crown Lands for the land district within which any lease has been granted under these regulations may, when authorised in writing by the Governor, exercise in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen in respect of the lands comprised in such lease the same powers as are by subsections (d), (e), (f), (h), and (i) of section 22 of "The Mining Act, 1886," conferred upon a Commissioner of Crown Lands; and any such authority by the Governor may be either general or confined to a particular case or cases.

## A PROCLAMATION.

IN exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by subsection five of section two hundred and seventy-five of "The Mining Act, 1886," His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby make the following regulations, and doth hereby proclaim and declare that the same shall take effect in all mining districts throughout the colony, as from the date of the publication of the said regulations in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

## REGULATIONS.

*Interpretation.*

IN these regulations the words and expressions following shall, if not inconsistent with the context, have the meanings hereby attached to them, viz.: "Great cattle" shall be construed to mean and include horned cattle, horses, mules, asses, male and female, and their offspring above six months of age; "small cattle" shall mean sheep, male and female, and the weaned offspring thereof; "cattle" shall mean and include "great cattle" and "small cattle" as above defined; and "district" shall mean any district constituted a mining district under the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1886."

*Right to depasture Cattle.*

1. Every holder of a miner's right and every holder of a business license occupying land by virtue of such right or license within any district, and also any person or persons occupying land as a licensed holding, special claim, or mineral lease within any district, shall be entitled to run one head of great cattle free of assessment fees on any Crown lands within a district which are not held under a lease or license for depasturing purposes; *Provided that, if more than four persons hold or occupy land as a licensed holding or special claim, they shall not be entitled to run more than four head of great cattle in respect of every such licensed holding or special claim.*

*Agricultural Leases.*

2. Any holder of an agricultural lease within any district shall be entitled to run great cattle free of assessment fees in proportion to the acreage of the land held under such lease, as follows: For a lease of 50 acres, or any less quantity, one head; for any additional fifty acres, one head.

*Depasturing License.*

3. Every holder of a miner's right, business license, licensed holding, special claim, agricultural lease, or mineral lease, may, subject to these regulations, run cattle upon any Crown lands, not held as aforesaid, within any district, in excess of the number which he is entitled to run free of assessment fees hereunder, on obtaining a depasturing license in the form contained in the First Schedule hereto; and any other person resident in a district may so run cattle within such district, on obtaining such a license as aforesaid.

*Application to be made.*

4. Any person desirous of obtaining a depasturing license shall lodge with the Clerk of the County Council having jurisdiction over that portion of the district in which he desires the depasturing license to take effect an application in writing in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, and shall deposit therewith the assessment and registration fees payable under these regulations. If such application is refused, the assessment and registration fees will be repaid to the applicant, but not otherwise. No depasturing license will in any case be granted to any applicant under the age of eighteen years.

*Application, how dealt with.*

5. If the application shall be to depasture not more than five head of great cattle, the Clerk of the County Council may, with the consent and approval of the Chairman, forthwith issue a depasturing license, in the form of the Third Schedule hereto annexed, to the applicant; but if such application shall be for depasturing any larger number of great cattle, or for depasturing small cattle, the Clerk shall submit the same to the County Council at the next ordinary meeting thereof, and the County Council shall determine how such application shall be dealt with.

*Assessment Fees.*

6. The assessment fees to be paid annually under these regulations shall be for every head of great cattle, 4s.; for every head of small cattle, 1s.

The licensing period shall be from the 1st January to the 31st December in each year: *Provided always that for licenses issued after the 30th June only half-fees will be charged for the then current year.*

*Registration.*

7. All cattle depastured upon lands under these regulations, whether running free of assessment or by virtue of a depasturing license, must be branded, and the brands and a description of the cattle must be registered with the Clerk of the Council of the county within which such lands are situated. The fee for every such registration shall be 1s.; and a certificate of registration in the form contained in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be given by the said Clerk to all persons paying any such last-mentioned fee.

*Register to be kept.*

8. The Clerk of the County Council within any district shall keep a register of brands and a list of depasturing licenses and registration certificates issued, with the date of issue and the names of the licensees and certificate-holders; and such register shall be kept in the Council offices, and may be inspected at any time by the public on payment of a fee of 1s.

*Brands previously registered.*

9. If a brand described in any application has been previously registered by any other person, the applicant shall amend his application by inserting therein some other brand not previously registered.

*Penalty for depasturing Cattle whose Brands are not registered or without a Depasturing License.*

10. Any person depasturing great or small cattle in any district which are not branded or whose brands are not registered, or without a certificate or license authorising the holder thereof in that behalf, and any person depasturing thereon a greater number of cattle than he is entitled to by virtue of such license or certificate, shall, upon conviction, for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s. per head for every head of cattle so depastured or not registered or branded.

*Diseased Cattle.*

11. No diseased cattle shall be depastured upon, nor shall any pigs or goats be allowed at large within, any district; and any person or persons who shall turn out or depasture any diseased cattle, or suffer any pig or goat to be allowed at large within any district, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding £10 for the first offence and £20 for every second or subsequent offence.

*Depasturing of Bulls prohibited.*

12. No bull or any entire horse above the age of twelve months shall be turned out or depastured or allowed to run at large upon any land subject to these regulations without the written authority of the County Council having jurisdiction over such lands, or its authorised officer; or if any person shall, without the written authority aforesaid, turn out or depasture upon any of the said lands any bull or entire horse, or shall suffer or allow any bull or entire horse belonging to him or in his care or custody to be at large upon any lands subject to these regulations, he shall be liable to a penalty of £10 for the first offence and a penalty of £20 for any second or subsequent offence.

*Stock not to be unnecessarily disturbed.*

13. No person shall drive, harass, or unnecessarily disturb any cattle lawfully depasturing upon any land subject to these regulations; and if any person shall unlawfully drive, harass, or unnecessarily disturb any cattle so depasturing as aforesaid he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence.

*Removal of Cattle.*

14. No person shall remove any cattle (excepting such as his own property) from any lands subject to these regulations without the written sanction of the owner of such cattle.

Any person desirous of removing cattle shall drive all the cattle collected by him into the nearest stock-yard, and there examine them carefully, and shall then separate from his own cattle any cattle he may have collected which do not belong to him, and he shall forthwith drive the latter back to the place from whence they were taken. Any person committing any breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

*Cattle not to be removed between the Hours of Sunset and Sunrise.*

15. No person shall muster or remove cattle upon or from any lands subject to these regulations between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

Any person committing a breach of this regulation, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence.

*Mustering Cattle.*

16. The Council of the county within which any lands subject to these regulations are situated may authorise any Ranger or any other person it may think fit to muster the cattle depasturing upon any such lands for the purpose of



ascertaining whether there are among them any unbranded or unregistered cattle or any cattle depasturing contrary to these regulations, and every depasturing license issued under these regulations shall be deemed to have contained therein the reservation of such a right as aforesaid.

*Unbranded or Unregistered Cattle.*

17. If any unbranded or unregistered cattle shall at any time be found on any lands subject to these regulations, or if any cattle shall be found illegally depasturing upon such lands, the owner of such cattle shall, in addition to any penalty otherwise provided by these regulations, be liable to pay, and shall pay, to the county authorities having jurisdiction over such lands all cost and charges incident to the collecting and recovering of such cattle.

*Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.*

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

- (1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively  $\frac{1}{4}$ d. and  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

1. The maximum sum offered as a reward for any proved discovery of a new goldfield in accordance with these conditions is £500; but, if the total sum claimed as rewards in any one year exceeds the parliamentary vote, the amount available only will be divided equally.

2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

DESCRIPTION OF SECTIONS.

The sections in Blocks XII., XV., and XVI., Tiriraukawa, form part of the Otairi Block, about seven and twenty-three miles north of Hunterville and Marton respectively, on or adjacent to the Marton-Murimotu Road and the track made by the Public Works Department from Pokiore to the Rangitikei River.
