Description of Race No. 1.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in exercise of the powers conferred by section two hundred and sixty-seven of "The Counties Act, 1886" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor, at the request of the Geraldine County Council, did, by Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of March last past, proclaim and declare the lands described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation to be water-races, by the name of the Seadown Water-races: And whereas the said Geraldine County Council has requested that the boundaries and limits of the water-race described as Water-race No. 1 in the said Schedule should be altered in the manner hereinafter appearing, and it appears expedient to make such alteration

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, and acting at the request of the said Geraldine County Council, doth hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of Water-race No. 1 of the said Seadown Water-races shall henceforth be those described in the Schedule hereto, in lieu of the boundaries heretofore assigned to the said water-race, and described in the Schedule to the above-recited Proclamation of the thirteenth day of March aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

SEADOWN WATER-RACES.

Race No. 1.

ALL that area, 100 link in width, situate in the Pareora and Arowhenua Survey Districts, County of Geraldine, commencing at a point on the right bank of the Opihi River in Rural Section No. 21122, and proceeding generally in an easterly direction intersecting said Section No. 21122; thence, 50 links in width, intersecting Sections Nos. 10454, 12448, 9854, 9855, and 15657, to the road forming the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section; thence, 12½ links in width, across that road, and intersecting Sections Nos. 8853, 19100, 10728, 10895, 10331, and 10806, to the road forming the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section; thence across that road, and intersecting Sections Nos. 10716, 11234, and 4828, across the road forming the southern boundary of the last-mentioned section, to the northern boundary of Section No. 15607, intersecting that section to the road forming its eastern boundary; thence across that road, and proceeding along the southern side of the road forming the northern boundary of Section No. 15606, crossing that road,

and again intersecting the said Sections Nos. 4828 and 4829 to the road forming the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section; thence across that road, and intersecting Sections Nos. 4816, 5345, and 5638, across the road forming the southern boundary of the last-mentioned section, and intersecting Sections Nos. 9833, 4514, 4226, 4129, and 4225, to the sea.

BY-LAWS for the Regulating and Licensing of Vehicles plying for Hire for the Carriage of Goods within the Bay of Islands County.

Definition.

1. WITHIN the meaning of these by-laws a "vehicle" shall be deemed to be any coach, cart, dray, wagon, hand-cart, or any other conveyance by which goods may be removed upon land from place to place.

"Persons" includes half-castes and Natives.

License and fee.

2. In respect of every vehicle plying for hire for the carriage of goods an annual license-fee shall be paid of £1, which license-fee shall entitle the owner of such vehicle to ply for hire with such vehicle for the carriage of goods from the 1st January to the 31st December in each year.

Penalty.

3. Any person who shall receive or demand payment for the carriage of goods in any vehicle, as before defined, without being duly licensed at the date thereof, shall be liable to a penalty of £2.

License-number and penalty.

4. On a license-fee being paid a number will be allotted to the license, which number must be distinctly marked on the outside of the vehicle licensed. Any person driving a licensed vehicle not bearing the license-number shall be liable to a penalty of £2.

Come into force.

5. These by-laws shall come into operation on approval by the Governor, signified by notice published in the *Gazette*.

Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

- (1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ½d. and ¼d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

No reward shall be paid for any discovery that may be made upon Native land without the consent of the Native owners and the approval of the Minister of Mines.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 441, against 453 in February, a decrease of 12. The deaths in March were 145, a decrease of 59 on the number for February. Of the total deaths, males contributed 80; females, 65. Seventy-four of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 51.03 per cent. of the whole number; 53 of these were under 1 year of age.

* The population for Auckland is that estimated for the 1st January, 1887. The information supplied as to the number of inhabited houses in January of the present year is not sufficiently accurate to be used in calculating population. The figures for 1887 are believed to be in excess of the actual fact. It has been deemed unsafe to give any death-rate, as the proportion could not be relied upon.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—

The births in March were 210, against 242 in February, a decrease of 32. The deaths in March were 85, against 130 in February, a decrease of 45.

There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: three males of 71, 77, and 82, and two females of 73 and 75, died at Auckland; a male of 70 at Wellington; a male of 79 at Christchurch; two males of 65 and 66, and two females of 63 and 77, at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from diseases of this class were only 17 in March, against 32 in February. The decrease was owing to the smaller number of deaths from typhoid fever (2 in March and 8 in February), and from diarrhoea, the latter having caused 10 deaths in March, against 17 in the previous month. The mortality from diseases in this class was unprecedentedly low for the month of March last—due, doubtless, to the lower average temperature. In March, 1885, the deaths were 38. Of these, 4 were from enteric fever and 26 from diarrhoeal diseases. In March, 1886, the deaths were 63, 9 having been from enteric fever and 46 from diarrhoeal. In March, 1887, the deaths were 76, of which 9 were from typhoid fever and 56 were diarrhoeal.

Constitutional Diseases.—There was a large decrease in the number of deaths in this class in March, the number having been 13, against 25 in February. Cancer, which caused 7 deaths in February, caused 2 in March. The mortality from phthisis fell from 11 to 7; and tabes mesenterica, a cause of 5 deaths in February, is not on the list of causes of death in March.

Local Diseases.—These diseases caused 41 deaths in March, against 45 in February. Of these, diseases of the nervous system, diseases of the circulatory system, and diseases of the respiratory system were all less fatal; but there was a slight increase in the number of deaths from diseases of the digestive system.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
