The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 467, against 462 in April, an increase of 5. The deaths in May were 150, a decrease of 47 on the number for April. Of the total deaths, males contributed 79; females, 71. Fifty-three of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 35:33 per cent. of the whole number; 44 of these were under 1 year of age.

* The population for Auckland is that estimated for the 1st January, 1887. The information supplied as to the number of inhabited houses in January of the present year is not sufficiently accurate to be used in calculating population. The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—
The births in May were 264, against 246 in April, an increase of 18. The deaths in May were 95, against 128 in April, a decrease of 33.
There were 7 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: three females of 84, 76, and 72 died at Auckland; a male of 77, and a female of 73, at Wellington; a female of 66 at Christchurch; and a male of 87 at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—These diseases caused 15 deaths in May, against 28 in April. The decrease was chiefly attributable to the smaller number of deaths from diarrhœal diseases (13 in April and 7 in May), from typhoid fever (7 in April and 5 in May), and to an absence of any deaths in May from venereal diseases.

Constitutional Diseases.—There was a small decrease in the number of deaths in this class—20 in April, 17 in May. Cancer, however, caused the comparatively large number of 7 deaths, the same as in the previous month, and phthisis caused 8 deaths, against 7 in April.

Local Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases numbered 47 in May, against 55 in the previous month. The deaths from diseases of the nervous system decreased in number from 15 to 13, and those from diseases of the circulatory system (heart disease, &c.) from 13 to 7. Diseases of the respiratory system were slightly more fatal; of these, bronchitis and pneumonia assumed greater prominence, the deaths from these two diseases having increased from 6 to 10. Three deaths occurred through childbirth.

Violence.—There were seven deaths in this class in May, an increase of 2 on the number in the previous month.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
