WHEREAS the North Island Main Trunk Line of Railway, from a point at or near Marton te Te Awamutu, viá Murimotu, Taumaranui, and the Ongaruhe River Vailey, vià Murimotu, Taumaranui, and the Ongarune River Vailey, is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Railways Authorisation Act, 1884," and which Act is, in the eighth section thereof, declared to be a special Act authorising the construction of such railway; and such railway is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of the same, namely, Poro-o-tarao Section:

## A PROCLAMATION.

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WHEREAS by section twenty of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1887," it is enacted, inter alia, that the Council of any county may, by special order, declare that all or any part of any district road shall, from and after a date to be fixed therein, be under the exclusive control of such local authority within the county as shall be mentioned in such special order, and may, by the same special order, direct that the cost of constructing and maintaining any such road or part of a road shall be borne either by the local authority to which the exclusive control thereof is given, or that a proportion of such cost, to be fixed in and by such special order, shall be borne by any other local authorities; and that wherever the operation of "The Counties Act, 1876," or of any Act repealing or amending the same, is suspended, the Governor shall have and may exercise all the functions vested in a County Council under this section: this section:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the fifteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the Auckland Great South Road and the Auckland to Onehunga Road were declared to be district roads:

And whereas portions of the said roads are situated in the County of Eden, in which county the operation of "The Counties Act, 1876," is suspended, and it is desirable that the said roads should be placed under the exclusive control of such of the local authorities within the said county as are mentioned in the Schedule hereto:

2. The day upon which the land shall be open for application shall be Wednesday, the twenty-second day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, at the Land

Office, Dunedin.

3. The land enumerated in the Schedule to the Proclamation aforesaid shall be sold on deferred payments, at the price stated in the said Schedule, and shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Tand Act 1885" Land Act. 1885.'

4. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one

section.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 444, against 467 in May, a decrease of 23. The deaths in June were 147, a decrease of 3 on the number for May. Of the total deaths, males contributed 83; females, 64. Forty-six of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 31.29 per cent. of the whole number; 34 of these were under 1 year of age.

\* The population for Auckland is that estimated for the 1st January, 1887. The information supplied as to the number of inhabited houses in January of the present year is not sufficiently accurate to be used in calculating population. The figures for 1887 are believed to be in excess of the actual fact. It has been deemed unsafe to give any death-rate, as the proportion could not be relied upon.

There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: four males of 82, 73, 72, and 70, and a female of 75, died at Auckland; a male of 66, and a female of 67, at Wellington; a female of 83 at Christchurch; and three males of 83, 82, and 68, at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—There were 11 deaths from this class in June, against 15 in May. The deaths in this class are generally fewest in the winter and early spring months, owing to the smaller number of cases of diarrhœal disease. The mortality is greatest in the summer months. Of the 11 deaths in June, 5 occurred from diphtheria, of which 3 were in Wellington. Two of the deaths were from typhoid fever—one in Auckland and one in Dunedin. It will be observed that no death occurred from diarrhœal diseases.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases increased in number from 17 in May to 25 in June. Cancer caused 4 deaths in June, against 7 in the previous month. Phthisis was more fatal, having caused 10 deaths, against 8 in May; and other tubercular diseases caused 7 deaths in June, against 1 in May.

Local Diseases.—These diseases caused 40 deaths in June, against 45 in May. There was a slight decrease in the number of deaths from diseases of the circulatory system, viz., 7 in May and 5 in June, and an almost entire absence of deaths from diseases of the digestive system, the number having fallen from 9 in May to 1 in June, the last having been from hernia. Diseases of the nervous and of the respiratory system, respectively, caused the same number of deaths in each month, viz., 13 and 12.

Violence.—Five deaths in this class were recorded in June. Of these, 2 were from drowning and 2 were suicidal.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
