THE following special order, made by the Hokianga County Council, is published in accordance with "The Counties Act, 1886." T. W. HISLOP.

SPECIAL ORDER.

That, in order to have the ratepayers represented in a more satisfactory manner than at present, it is desirable to form the county into a greater number of ridings than two. That on and after the 1st day of August, 1888, the county be divided into six ridings (as per Schedule at foot), the said ridings to be represented as follows: (1) Whangape Riding,

one member; (2) Kohukohu Riding, two members; (3) Waihou Riding, one member; (4) Taheke Riding, one member; (5) Rawene Riding, two members; (6) Omapere Riding, two members: total, nine members.

SCHEDULE OF BOUNDARIES.

1. Whangape Riding (One Member).

Bounded towards the west by the sea, from Hokianga, North Head to Herekino River; thence by the county boundary to Raetea Trig. 
