A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," section twenty-seven, it is enacted that, if not less than one-fourth of the burgesses of a borough petition the Governor, praying him to divide such borough into wards, the Governor may, by Proclamation, divide such borough into not more than six wards, and shall in such Proclamation assign such names and boundaries to each ward as he thinks fit: And whereas not less than one-fourth of the burgesses of the Borough of Brunner have petitioned me to divide such borough into wards:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore recited authority, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Borough of Brunner shall be and the same is hereby divided into three wards, with the names and boundaries set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

BOROUGH OF BRUNNER.

NORTH Ward is bounded towards the north by the northern boundary-line of the Borough of Brunner; towards the north-east by Section No. 2A, Mawheranui Survey District; towards the south-east and south by the Grey River; and towards the west by the western boundary-line of the Borough of Brunner.

South Ward is bounded towards the north-west by North Ward, hereinbefore described; towards the east by a right line due south from the bridge at Brunnerton to the southern boundary-line of the Borough of Brunner; and towards the south and west by the southern and western boundary-lines of the Borough of Brunner.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jerovis, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant-ships for the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's Dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1876," it is enacted that "where Her Majesty has power, under 'The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854,' or any Act passed or hereafter to be passed amending the same, to make an Order in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time to make such Order in Council, and by Order in Council to revoke, alter, or add to any order so made:"

And whereas it was made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant-ships in force under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," had been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of the Netherlands, with the exception of a difference in the mode in certain steamers of estimating the allowance for engine room, and such rules were in force in that country, and came into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, Her Majesty was pleased to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing-ships, that merchant sailing-ships of the said Kingdom of the Netherlands, the measurement whereof should, after the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing-ships, testified by the date thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing-ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steamships, that merchant-ships belonging to the said Kingdom of the Netherlands which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof should, after the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steamships, testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on such registers or other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships: Provided, nevertheless, that, should the owner or master of any such Dutch steamship desire the deduction for engine room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the Dutch rule, the engine room should be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty

that a new Royal ordinance, which came into operation on the sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, stipulates that the owners of Dutch steamships may have the net tonnage of their vessels calculated according to British as well as according to Dutch rules, and shall have issued to them a separate certificate, to be used in foreign countries, showing the net tonnage calculated according to British rules :

And whereas it has been made to appear desirable to Her Majesty that the provisions of the said recited Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, should be revoked, and a new Order in Council made and substituted in lieu thereof :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in her by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the said recited order of the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, shall be and the same is hereby revoked, and in lieu thereof and in substitution thereof Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing-ships, that merchant sailing-ships of the said Kingdom of the Netherlands, the measurement whereof, after the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing-ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing-ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steamships, that merchant-ships belonging to the said Kingdom of the Netherlands which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steamships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on such registers or other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships: Provided, nevertheless, that, if the owner or master of any such Dutch steamship desires the deduction for engine room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the Dutch rule, the engine room shall be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules; and that, in the event of any such steamship possessing a certificate of tonnage or other national paper issued as aforesaid on or after the sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, denoting the net registered tonnage of such ship under the British rules, the ship shall be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted thereon.
