In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by "The Sheriffs Act, 1883," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby alter and redefine the boundaries of the Sheriff's District of Southland and the Sheriff's District of Otago, and do proclaim and declare that the same shall, from and after the first day of October next, be those described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

THE SHERIFF'S DISTRICT OF SOUTHLAND.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago bounded towards the north by a right line from the mouth of the Awarua River, in Big Bay, in the direction of Mount Aspiring, to a point at which it is intersected by a line drawn due north from Cosmos Peak; thence towards the east by the latter line to the said Cosmos Peak; thence towards the north-east generally by the northern and western watersheds of Lake Wakatipu, over David Peaks, Round Peaks, the Thomson Mountains, Mount Lookup, and Hummock Peak to Eyre Peak; thence by a right line to the nearest source of the Mataura River; thence by that river to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of Wendon Survey District; thence again towards the north by the said survey district to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 7, Block III.; thence towards the north-west generally by the said Section No. 7, and Section No. 10, Block VIII., Wendon Survey District, to the north-eastern corner of the latter section: thence by the watershed of the western branch of the Waikaka River, over Trig. Station E, Greenvale Survey District; thence by the road traversing Section No. 1, Block VII., Greenvale Survey District, and by that road continued past Sections Nos. 28, 27, 6, 5, 7, 8, and 9, Block I., Glenkenich Survey District, Sections Nos. 24, 26, 27, 12, 28, 10, and 9 of Block V., Sections Nos. 16, 14, 13, 12, 7, 6, 38, 39, and 40, Block IX., Glenkenich Survey District; Sections Nos. 4, 3, 2, 5, 6, 7, and 8, Block IX., Waipahi Survey District, to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by Sections Nos. 9 and 18, Block IX., Waipahi Survey District, and by the road forming the eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 9 and 8, Block X., of the last-mentioned survey district, to the southernmost corner of the said Section No. 8; thence by a right line to the northernmost corner of Section No. 29 of the said Block X., and by that section to the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 22, Block X., aforesaid; thence by that road and its continuation past Sections Nos. 21 and 20 to Section No. 5, Block XI., Waipahi Survey District; thence by the last-mentioned section to the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 34, Block IX., Waikaka Survey District; thence by that road and its continuation past Sections Nos. 23, 33, 28, 29, 5, 8, 9, and 10 of the last-mentioned block to the south-western corner of the said Section No. 10; thence by Section No. 11, Block IX., Waikaka Survey District, and Section No. 12, Block IX., Waikaka Survey District, to the Main South Road; thence across and by the Main South Road to the Kaiwera; thence by that stream to the road intersecting Section No. 25, Block II., Slopedown Survey District, thence by a right line to Trig. Station G (the Cairn), Block II., and Section No. 16, Block II., Slopedown Survey District, to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to Chasland's Mistake; and towards t and long. 180° E.

Times and Places for Payment of Duties under "The Property tax Act, 1888."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eleventh day of September, 1888.

Prosent: HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

N pursuance of the power and authority vested in him under "The Property-tax Act, 1888," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and direct that the several duties leviable under the said Act shall be paid on the days and in the manner hereinafter particularly mentioned, that is to

say,—
1. In respect of the duty of one penny, where the amount of such duty shall be under fifteen pounds, the same shall

be paid on the sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight; and where such duty amounts to fifteen pounds, or exceeds that sum, the same shall be paid in two equal instalments, the first of such instalments being payable on the said sixth day of November, and the second of such instalments on the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

2. In respect of the duty on fire maxing accident fidelity.

2. In respect of the duty on fire, marine, accident, fidelity, live-stock, plate-glass, or guarantee policies, issued by any insurance company, the same shall be paid on the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

And doth also direct that the places where the said tax shall be paid shall be any post office which is also a money-order office, and at the office of the Property-tax Commissioner, at the Government Buildings, Wellington; and that notice to the foregoing effect shall be given by the said Commissioner accordingly. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fifth day of September, 1888.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

Whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 40, of the same year, and made under the authority of "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," the exportation from New Zealand to any of the South Sea Islands of all firearms, gunpowder, munitions of war, and warlike stores was absolutely prohibited: And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 119, of the same year, and made under the authority of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, the exportation of dynamite to the South Sea Islands was absolutely prohibited: And whereas it has been made to appear to His Excellency in Council that firearms, gunpowder, munitions of war, warlike stores, and dynamite are not prohibited to be exported to the South Sea Islands from any of the Australasian Colonies: And whereas the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific did, on the fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, in the name and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty, make a regulation, under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879, to prohibit the supply of arms, ammunition, and explosive substances to natives of the Western Pacific Islands, which said regulation was published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 73, of 1884: And whereas by "The Customs Duties Consolidation Act, 1882," it is, among other things, enacted that, notwithstanding the repeal of "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," all Orders in Council issued or made under the said repealed Act, and in force at the commencement of "The Customs Duties Consolidation Act, 1882," should continue in force as if the same had been issued or made under the authority of the last-mentioned Act; and also that any Order in Council prohibiting the exportation of any goods shall be revocable at any time: And whereas it is expedient to r

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore in part recited authority, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke and determine the said respective Orders in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Drawback of Duty on Goods exported from the Colony.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fifth day of September, 1888.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS it is enacted by the ninth section of "The Customs Duties Consolidation Act, 1882," that the

Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time, specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into New Zealand may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the rate of drawback to be so allowed; tion therefrom, and the rate of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter and cancel any such order, and may approve of regulations and conditions under which drawbacks may be allowed: And whereas the ninth section of "The Customs and Excise Duties Act, 1888," provides that a drawback of duty paid on New-Zealand-brewed beer may be allowed on the exportation thereof in bottle, and such drawback shall be subject to the same regulations and conditions as are applicable to drawback allowed under the ninth section of "The Customs Duties Consolidation Act, 1882:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, doth order that, on and after the date hereof, there shall be allowed on all goods exported from the colony (except goods for ship stores and those mentioned in the said section upon which no drawback is to be allowed) a drawback of duty paid on or after the thirtieth day of May last on importation, such drawback to be reid according to the following seek a member as more discovery. to be paid according to the following scale, namely :-

CLASS A.

Upon repacked goods liable to duty ad valorem:—At the rate of 5 per cent., a drawback of 3½ per cent.

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Upon repacked goods liable to duty at specific rates other than ad valorem, a drawback of the full amount of duty paid: Provided, however, that no drawback of duty shall be allowed on second-hand goods subject to such specific rates of duty.

CLASS B.

Upon goods made up in the colony, not mainly from ma-terial manufactured in the colony, nor of material free of duty, provided that the principal material thereof paid duty

At the rate of 5 per cent., a drawback of 13 per cent.

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If at specific rates, other than ad valorem, then drawback equal to the amount of duty paid on the materials therein, on proof of such payment to the satisfaction of the Collector.

In addition to the above allowances, there shall be paid on all repacked goods exported a drawback of primage duty as follows, viz.

For goods under Class A, 3 per cent.

CLASS D.

There shall be allowed on the exportation of New-Zealand-brewed beer, in bottles, a drawback of the Excise duty paid thereon, on proof of such payment to the satisfaction of the Collector.

And, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, the Governor doth hereby approve of the following regulations and conditions under which the drawbacks hereinbefore provided for may be allowed, that is to say,—

1. Drawbacks shall only be allowed upon articles included in Class A when the same are goods of known foreign production or manufacture.

2. The value of goods upon which drawback shall be payable shall not exceed the fair market value at the time of exportation of like goods when sold for home consumption at the port at which the goods are entered for drawback.

3. At the time of passing export entry for drawback on goods included in Classes A and B, there shall be produced to the proper officer invoices, in duplicate, for the goods described therein, specifying separately—

Goods liable to specific rates of duty on importation;
Goods liable to ad valorem duties on importation;
Goods manufactured in New Zealand;
and setting forth legibly, in respect of each class of goods.

and setting forth legibly, in respect of each class of goods, the actual price received or to be received from the purchaser

the actual price received or to be received from the purchaser of the goods upon which drawback is claimed.

4. The said invoices shall be dated and signed by the exporter; and, if the proper officer shall so require, there shall also be produced to him the invoice or invoices for the goods which were produced at the time when the goods were entered for duty.

5. The export invoices, after being compared with the entry, and with the goods if required by the Collector or proper officer, shall be stamped at the Customhouse, and one

shall be returned to the exporter or his agent, and the other shall be attached to the drawback debenture.

6. The debenture for payment of drawback, whether on goods included in this order or on goods exported in original packages as imported, as provided for in section 146 of "The Customs Laws Consolidation Act, 1882," shall be in the form

Customs Laws Consolidation Act, 1882," shall be in the form set forth in the Order in Council made on the nineteenth day of December, 1881, and shall be made out in duplicate, signed, declared to, and presented to the Collector for payment by the person entitled to the drawback.

7. No debenture shall be paid until the expiration of seven days after the departure from the colony of the vessel upon which the drawback goods were shipped, nor unless the proper officer shall in every case have satisfied himself, and certified on the entry for drawback, that such goods are of the number, quantity, or value set forth in the entry, and that the law and regulations in respect thereof have been duly complied with.

8. Exporters of goods for drawback of duty shall pay to the

8. Exporters of goods for drawback of duty shall pay to the Collector a charge of one shilling and sixpence per hour, or any portion of an hour, for the time an officer is employed under these regulations, together with any other expense incurred as certified by the Collector; and no debenture shall be passed for payment until such expenses shall have been paid.

9. Upon completing the packing of goods for drawback of duty the packages shall be secured and sealed by an officer of Customs, and be forthwith conveyed to the place of shipment by a carrier licensed under the Customs Acts, there to be shipped in the presence of the proper officer; or, if not so forthwith conveyed and shipped, the packages shall be removed to some place of security approved by the Collector.

10. For the purposes of this Order in Council goods cleared from the warehouse for home consumption shall be deemed to have been duty-paid on importation.

11. Nothing in this Order in Council shall be deemed to authorise any allowance of drawback upon any goods which shall be of less value than the amount of drawback claimed in respect thereof, or to allow any drawback in excess of the amount of duty paid.

THE REAS by the seventeenth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time constitute, vary, and abolish Native licensing districts: And whereas it is expedient to constitute the Native Licensing District of Kirikiri:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of all powers enabling him in this behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Content of New Zealand, doth hereby constitute and define the por-tion of the colony mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto to be a Native licensing district from and after the first day of October next.

ALL that area in the County of Thames bounded towards the north-west by the Kauaeranga and the Waiwhakarunga Rivers respectively, from the Frith of Thames to the northernmost corner of the Kahe Block; thence towards the east and south-east by the eastern and south-eastern boundary-lines of the said Kahe Block to the northern boundary-line of Taparahi No. 3 Block; thence towards the north generally by the northern boundary-lines of the Taparahi Blocks Nos. 3 and 2 respectively to the north-western corner of Taparahi Block No. 1; thence towards the north-east generally by the last-mentioned block to the road at the southeastern boundary of that block; thence again towards the south-east generally by the said road and its continuation through the Pakirarahi Block No. 2, the Taupapa Block, Block No. 2905, and Native land to the Puriri River; thence

by the said Puriri River to the Waihou River; and thence towards the south by the latter river; and towards the west by the Waihou River aforesaid and the Frith of Thames to the Kauaeranga River aforesaid.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Provincial District of Nelson, and the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

REGULATIONS.

1. ANY holder of a license as hereinafter mentioned may fish 1. Any holder of a license as hereinafter mentioned may fish for trout with rod and line, and may use a landing-net to secure any trout caught with such rod and line, in each river or stream in the Provincial District of Nelson which, flows into Blind Bay, from the first day of October in any one year to the thirty-first day of March in the following year, both inclusive. Such licenses will be issued under the hand of the Honorary Secretary of the Nelson Acclimatisation Society, and for every such license a fee of ten shillings will be charged. be charged.

2. The Secretary of the said society may issue day licenses to bona fide travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid, on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each day's fishing.

3. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line

for trout, and may use a landing-net to secure any trout caught with such rod and line, in the above-named rivers, from the first day of October in any one year to the thirty-first day of March in the following year, both inclusive.

4. No license shall authorise any person other than the

person named therein to fish.

5. Any person fishing either without a license, or who shall, 5. Any person fishing either without a license, or who shall, on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on demand of any ranger, police officer, or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, ranger, police officer, or constable his license, or the contents of his creel, basket, or bag, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than twenty shillings and not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout.

sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout.

7. All trout not exceeding seven inches in length taken by any person shall be immediately returned alive to the water; and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than twenty shillings and not exceeding twenty pounds.

8. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream; and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than forty shillings and not exceeding fifty pounds.

9. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets,

outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of one-quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low-water.

10. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river or stream in the said district, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than forty shillings and not exceeding fifty pounds.

11. If any person shall be convicted of any effective or stream.

11. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations the license, if any, held by the offender

shall thereupon become void.

12. These regulations shall come into force as from the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout and perch in all waters within that district or part of the North Island known as "the Wellington Acclimatisation District" which lies to the southward of the following boundary-line—commencing from the mouth of the Manawatu River and following the course of that river to the Manawatu Gorge; thence in a direct line from such gorge to the mouth of the Waimata River, on the East Coast—may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Wellington Acclimatisation Society (hereinafter termed "the said society"), or any one authorised by the said Secretary in that behalf.

2. For every such license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged. Licenses may also be issued to boys of the age of fifteen years or under at a reduced fee of ten shillings for each license so issued: Provided it shall not be obligatory upon the said Secretary or his deputy to issue a license.

3. The Secretary of the said society may issue day licenses to bonâ fide travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid, on their introduction to him by any two members of the said society, and on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each day's fishing: Provided that this payment may be remitted if the applicant be a member of or hold a valid license from any other society in New Zealand which grants the like privilege.

4. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line for trout and perch, and may use a landing-net or gaff to secure any trout or perch caught with such rod and line, in the above-named waters, from the first day of October in any one year to the thirty-first day of March in the year following, both inclusive.

5. No license shall authorise any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that with natural or artificial fly, insect, or fish only.

6. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonide or trout between the third day of April and the thirtieth day of September, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the said society for purposes of acclimatisation.

7. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river or stream, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

8. No person shall take, fish for, catch or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

9. No person shall fish for trout or perch without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the said society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout or perch.

10. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from killing such trout or perch.

10. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

11. No person shall take, catch, or kill any perch under six inches in length, nor shall perch be taken, caught, or killed at all, or had in possession of any person, between the fourth day of April and the thirtieth day of November in

any year.

12. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for for the purpose of

taking, catching, or killing trout or perch; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or

chemical preparation whatever.

13. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream.

14. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every

every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of one-quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low-water.

15. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any salmon, trout, or perch, or any part thereof.

16. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

17. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout and perch in all the waters in the County of Ashburton, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatisation Society, at Ashburton, and for every such license the following scale of fees will be charged: For adults, for the season, twenty shillings; for adults, from the twentieth day of December, ten shillings; for youths under sixteen years of age, for the season, ten shillings; for youths under sixteen years of age, from the twentieth day of December, five shillings: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the said Secretary to issue a license.

2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish for trout in any of the said waters from the first day of October in any one year to the fifteenth day of April in the year following, inclusive, and for perch from the fifteenth day of December in any one year to the thirtieth day of June in the year following, inclusive; but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

8. No person shall fish for take catch or kill or bear in his

without his consent.

without his consent.

3. No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill, or have in his possession, or attempt to fish for, take, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, any of the salmonidæ, or trout, or perch, except during the above-mentioned periods.

4. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish with one rod and line only, and with the following baits, namely: natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, silveries, bullies (Electris gobioides), grasshoppers, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, and worms.

5. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort or kind whatever, for the purpose of fishing for, taking, catching, or killing trout or perch, except a rod and line, and a landing-net or gaff for fish taken with rod and line.

with rod and line.

6. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout or perch; nor shall any of the baits above mentioned be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

7. No person shall fish without a license and every person

preparation whatever.
7. No person shall fish without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, or member of the Acclimatisation Society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable,

or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing trout, perch, or tench.

8. Every trout under ten inches in length, and every perch under six inches in length from nose to tip of the tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

9. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any of the said waters, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

10. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

11. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the district to which these regulations relate, any of the salmonidæ, trout, or perch, or take, fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ, trout, or perch in order to make sale of the same, for a period of one year from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

12. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ, trout, perch, or tench during the period appointed for a close season for any of such fish.

13. The Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatisation Society may indorse any license to fish issued by any other Acclimatisation Society, and upon such indorsement being made the person in whose favour it was issued shall be entitled to fish for trout and perch in any of the waters within the County of Ashburton without payment by such person of any further fee; but subject in all other respects to the regulations with regard to the fishing for trout and perch in force within the said county.

14. Licenses to fish for trout and perch in any of the experient the County of Ashburton for a period not exceed.

14. Licenses to fish for trout and perch in any of the waters in the County of Ashburton, for a period not exceeding one month from the date of issue, may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatisation

Society to persons visiting the county, and for every such license a fee of five shillings will be charged.

15. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than twenty shillings or more than fifty

pounds.

WHEREAS by "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that, where the foreshore has been legally vested in any Harbour Board or other local governing body, any such Board or local governing body may from time to time, subject to the provisions of the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," license and permit any part of the foreshore to be used or occupied, inter alia, for the erection and use of any landing-place or wharf upon the terms and conditions in the said Act mentioned: And whereas by the said Act it is also provided that every licensee shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have power to make and construct any necessary reclamation for the purpose of erecting on the foreshore comprised in his license, or upon any land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore which shall be specified in such license, any building, below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore which shall be specified in such license, any building, structure, erection, or other works to enable him to obtain the full benefit of such license: And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted that, in any case where there is no Harbour Board, or no Harbour Board empowered to grant any such license as aforesaid, the Governor in Council may in his discretion grant and issue a license for all or any of the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, and all the provisions of the said Act in respect of such licenses shall, mutatis mutandis, apply accordingly: And whereas there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned the Town of Raglan Road Board and the Whaingaroa Road Board (hereinafter called "the said Boards") have applied to the Governor for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore in Raglan Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf; and, in

accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," have deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1431 and 1449), showing the manner in which it is proposed to construct such wharf, the place in the said harbour where it is intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore or land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have prior to the making of this Order in Council been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the said Boards under the said Act, for the nurpose aforesaid on the terms and conditions hereinafter purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter

purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions herematter expressed:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby license and permit the said Boards to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the said Boards upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

tions, that is to say,—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of such wharf, which are shown on the plan

marked M.D. 1449.

2. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the wharf, and full liberty of ingress and egress

3. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

4. The said Boards shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit thereon, and maintain at their own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

of by the Minister.

5. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the said Boards, or either of them, a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring them, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such

convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the said Boards to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the said Boards and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

that purpose.

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the said Boards shall not, nor shall either of them, assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

obtained.

9. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the said Boards six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the said Boards.

10. The said Boards shall be liable for any injury which the erection or maintenance of said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain.

11. In case the said Boards shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein.

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
 (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf; then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the

Boards or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the said Boards, and to all persons concerned or interested of the fact of such revocation.

12. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.—FOR THE IN-FORMATION OF CANDIDATES.

1. APPOINTMENTS to naval cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the under-mentioned exceptions:—

Four cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

of State for the Colonies.

Service cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from—(a) sons of officers of the army, navy, or marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury; (b) sons of officers of the navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the active list not lower than that of commander. Not more than two such latter service cadets will be nominated annually.

Applications for service cadetships should be addressed Applications for service cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the army; to the Secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the navy or marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer in the Indian army.

Colonial and service cadets will be entered on passing the test examination as specified in paragraphs 9 and 10, and will in all other respects be subject to these regulations.

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address, Candress, Candress).

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address, Cannon Row, Westminster), who will deal with all questions connected with such examination, and will announce the results. A fee of 10s, will be required from each candidate.

2. Except in special circumstances, not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.

3. The nomination of candidates for naval cadetships will be made by the First Lord, by individual members of the Board, and by the Secretaries to the Board of Admiralty.

A flag officer or a commodore first class appointed to the chief command of a station, or to a separate command, and a captain, on first appointment as such to the command of a ship, will be allowed to nominate one candidate, provided the privilege is exercised within six months of appointment. No captain will be entitled to nominate more than one candidate during the time he holds the rank of captain, but a flag officer or a commodore first class may claim the privi-

lege each time he is appointed to a command as above.

In the event of a candidate's nomination being cancelled before he has commenced the examination, the officer who

before he has commenced the examination, the officer who nominated him will be allowed to select another candidate for the same or following examination.

4. The nominations will be made half-yearly, as soon as convenient after the report of the last examination has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The examinations will be held in London and at Portsmouth, and will commence on the second Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and 15th January following respectively. January following respectively.

6. No candidate will be eligible for the June examinations whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz., not less than thirteen nor more than fourteen and a half years of age; nor for the November examinations whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.

7. Every candidate must be in good health and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and tutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. (d.) Cadets reported to the Admiralty for unsatisfactory conduct will be "warned," and should they be again reported they will be discharged. Any cadet, however, who is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term will be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the "Britannia."

(e.) Any cadet who shall at any time appear to their Lordships to be unfit for the naval service, for any reason whatever, will be removed from the "Britannia." and it must be understood that this rule will apply to those who are considered unfit from from insufficient physical development or weakness of constitution, although no actual organic disease may have been developed.

17. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the "Britannia." is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to sign a declaration, on the admission of the cadet to the "Britannia," to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the navy.

18. Cadets will, on passing out of the "Britannia," rank according to the amount of sea-time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea-time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the "Britannia."

19. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.

20. No pay will be allowed by Government to cadets in the "Britannia." The pocket-money allowed to cadets will be charged to the parents.

21. As only cadets who are able to swim are permitted to use the boats belonging to H.M.S. "Britannia," the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty desire to impress upon parents and guardians the importance of cadets being taught to swim before they join the training-ship, so as to enable them to obtain the full benefits of use of the boats.
