A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the Auckland Sheep District, as at present constituted, should be altered and reconstituted, and that two new districts, to be called the Miranda Sheep District and the Waikawau Sheep District, should be constituted:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eighth section of "The Sheep Act, 1878," do hereby constitute anew the Auckland Sheep District, and the subdivisions thereof respectively, and hereby constitute two new districts to be called the Miranda Sheep District and the Waikawau Sheep District; and I do hereby declare that, for the purposes of the said Act, the said districts and the subdivisions of the Auckland Sheep District shall hereafter be as the same are described in the Schedule hereto, including in such districts or subdivisions all boroughs within the territorial area comprised within the external boundaries of any such district or subdivision as defined in the said Schedule, although such boroughs do not actually form part of any county therein mentioned; and that such districts and subdivisions shall be known by the names set over each such district and subdivision respectively in the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

MIRANDA SHEEP DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Auckland bounded towards the east by the Frith of Thames, from Haurahi Stream to Pukorokoro Creek; thence towards the south by the County of Waikato; towards the west by the Wharekawa Nos. 3 and 2 Blocks to the north-eastern corner of the latter block; thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of the Waikaka Block; thence by that block to the Otuna Stream; and thence towards the north by that stream and the Haurahi Stream aforesaid to the Frith of Thames.

WAIKAWAU SHEEP DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Auckland bounded towards the north by the Kirita Block, from the

Thames—Coromandel Road to the easternmost corner of that block; thence by a right line to the northernmost source of the Mahakirau River, in Block XIV., Coromandel Survey District; thence by that river and the Whangamaroro River to Whitianga Harbour; thence towards the east generally by the said Whitianga Harbour to Waiwawa River; thence towards the south-east by the said Waiwawa River to the Taitoko Stream; thence towards the south generally by a right line to the easternmost corner of Section No. 13, Block XV., Hastings Survey District; thence by the said Section No. 13 and Sections Nos. 14, 21, 22, and 23, and a right line from the northernmost corner of the last-mentioned section to the north-eastern corner of Otuturu No. 1 Block, and by that block to the Frith of Thames; and towards the south-west generally by the Frith of Thames.

AUCKLAND SHEEP DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial Districts of Auckland and Wellington bounded towards the north-east generally by the ocean, from North Cape to Cape Runaway; thence towards the south-east generally by the Counties of Cook and Wairoa to the main road from Taupo to Napier; thence towards the south-west generally by that road to the Waikato River; thence by the said Waikato River to Taupo Moana; thence by Taupo Moana and the Counties of East Taupo, Wanganui, and Clifton to the ocean; and towards the west, again towards the south-west, and towards the north by the ocean: together with all adjacent islands; excepting from the above-described area the Sheep Districts of Miranda and Waikawau, hereinbefore described.

Bay of Islands Subdivision.

Bounded towards the north-east by the ocean; towards the south-east by the Counties of Whangarei and Hobson; and towards the south-west and north by the ocean: together with the adjacent islands.

Marsden Subdivision.

Bounded towards the north-east by the ocean; towards the south by the County of Waitemata; towards the south-west by the ocean; and towards the north-west by the Bay of Islands Subdivision, hereinbefore described: together with the islands of Turanga (Hen and Chickens), Great Barrier, Little Barrier, Kawau, Moturake, and Motuhora, and islands adjacent thereto.

Auckland Subdivision.

Bounded towards the north-east and west by the Hauraki Gulf, from the southern boundary of the County of Rodney

Bounded towards the north-west, north-east, and north by the Auckland Subdivision, hereinbefore described; again towards the north-east by the County of Tauranga; towards the south-east by the County of Rotorua; towards the south-west generally by the Counties of West Taupo and Kawhia; and towards the west by the ocean.

Bay of Plenty Subdivision.

Bounded towards the north-east and north-west by the Bay of Plenty; towards the south-east by the Counties of Cook and Wairoa to the main road from Taupo to Napier; thence by that road to the Waikato River; thence by the said Waikato River to Taupo Moana; and thence by Taupo Moana to the County of West Taupo; towards the west by the said County of West Taupo, and the Waikato Subdivision, hereinbefore described; and towards the north-west by the Auckland Subdivision, hereinbefore described: together with the islands of Matakana and Motiti, and islands adjacent thereto.

Taupo Subdivision.

Bounded towards the north-east by the Waikato Subdivision, hereinbefore described; towards the south-east by the Bay of Plenty Subdivision, hereinbefore described, and the County of East Taupo; towards the south-west generally by the Counties of Wanganui and Clifton; and towards the west by the ocean.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," and "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the County of Taranaki, and in the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout in all the waters within the County of Taranaki will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Taranaki Acclimatisation Society (hereinafter called "the said society"), and for every such license a fee of ten shillings will be charged: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the said society to issue a license.
2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in any of the said waters from the first day of November in any one year to the eleventh day of April in the following year inclusive, between the hours of four a.m. and ten p.m. only; but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.
3. No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill, or have in his possession, or attempt to fish for, take, catch, or kill, in any matter whatever, any of the salmonidæ or trout, except during the above-mentioned period.
4. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish with one rod and line only, and with the following baits: natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, silveries, bullies, grasshoppers, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, and worms.
5. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort or kind whatever, for the purpose of fishing for, taking, catching, or killing trout, excepting a rod and line, and a landing net or gaff for fish taken with rod and line.
6. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any of the baits above mentioned be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.
7. No person shall fish without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the said society, or person producing a license, produce

and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing trout.

8. Every trout not exceeding eight inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

9. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, in any of the said waters, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

10. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

11. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the county to which these regulations relate, any of the salmonidæ or trout, or take, fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ or trout in order to make sale of the same, without permission in writing under the hand of the Secretary of the said society.

12. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the twelfth day of April and the first day of November in each year, which period is appointed a close season for all such fish.

13. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

14. These regulations shall come into force as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.
