Altering Boundaries of Resident Magistrate's District of Tauranga, and abolishing District of Taupo.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor Y it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts to be called Resident Magistrates' districts, and such districts from time to time to abolish, and the boundaries to define and alter, and in any such Proclamation to fix a time on and from which any such district shall be constituted or abolished, as the case may be a standard or the twenty.

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in him, did define the boundaries of the Resident Magistrates' Districts

define the boundaries of the Resident Magistrates' Districts of Tauranga and Taupo, as described in the said Proclamations respectively, to be Resident Magistrates' districts within the meaning and for the purpose of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said District of Taupo, and to alter the boundaries of the said District of Tauranga so defined as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in me as aforesaid. do hereby abolish the said District of Taupo, as aforesaid, do hereby abolish the said District of Taupo, as from the first day of December next, and do hereby alter the boundaries of the said District of Tauranga, and define them, as described in the Schedule hereto, as from the said first day of December next.

ALL that area in the Provincial Districts of Auckland, Wellington, and Taranaki bounded towards the north-east by the ocean, from Ngakuri-a-whare to Waitahanui; thence towards the east and again towards the north-east generally by the Resident Magistrate's District of Opotiki, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 78, 12th August, 1880; towards the south-east generally by the Resident Magistrate's District of Wairoa, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 78, 12th August, 1880, and the Resident Magistrate's District of Napier and Waipukurau, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 19, 14th February, 1884; towards the south-west generally by the Resident Magistrate's District of Wanganui, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 38, 11th June, 1885; towards the north-west generally by

the Resident Magistrate's District of Taranaki, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 103, 11th September, 1884; towards the north by the Resident Magistrate's District of Waikato, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 51, 18th September, 1888; and towards the west generally by the Resident Magistrate's District of Waikato aforesaid, and the Resident Magistrate's District of Hauraki, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 114, 1st November, 1883: including Mayor, Motiti, and other adjacent islands.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, made under the provisions of "The Electric Lines Act, 1884 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the second day of July then following, certain regulations were made prescribing the fees and charges to be taken and made in relation to the use of Government telephones established in this colony in connection with telephone exchanges: And whereas it is expedient to make further regulations in relation

this colony in connection with telephone exchanges: And whereas it is expedient to make further regulations in relation to the hiring and use of the said telephones:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Act, and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby order and declare that such regulations shall take effect on and after the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

## REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. AT any place where telephone exchanges have been established, Edison-Bell or any other approved telephones connected with the exchanges will be placed in offices or private residences within a reasonable distance of the central office, so that a subscriber can converse with other subscribers at their offices or residences.

2. Subscribers at each exchange will be furnished with a list of persons with whom they may communicate by telephone, and, as new subscribers are connected with the system from time to time, notification of the fact will be given by the department.

3. The Electric Telegraph Commissioner or Superinten-3. The Electric Telegraph Commissioner or Superintendent of Electric Lines may exclude from the telephone exchange any subscriber who allows the telephone instruments in his custody or control to be damaged or destroyed, or put to any improper use, and may remove or cause to be removed any instruments allotted to the use of such subscriber; who shall have no claim for damages or otherwise in consequence of the removal or exclusion of the instru-

scriber; who shall have no claim for damages or otherwise in consequence of the removal or exclusion of the instruments under such circumstances.

4. All charges payable in respect of the hire of any telephone instruments shall be paid quarterly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, April, July, or October following the date when the connection with the telephone exchange is completed.

5. If such payment be not made within one week after demand, the connection with the exchange may, at the dis-cretion of the said Superintendent, be discontinued without

prejudice to any proceedings for the recovery of any moneys then due or otherwise.

6. Every person desiring to hire any telephone instruments or set of telephones connected with a telephone exchange shall make application to the Superintendent of Electric Lines, in the Form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto; and shall, when requested so to do by the said Superintendent, execute and deliver to him a bond in the Form No. 2 of the said Schedule.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this third day of November, 1888.

Present: HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Native Lands Frauds Prevention Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, with the approval of a Judge of the Supreme Court, make, and from time to time alter, revoke, or amend, such rules of practice and procedure for regulating proceedings under the said Act as to him shall seem fit; and such rules, when published in the New Zealand Gazette, shall have the force of law:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor in Council, by order of the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in exercise of the power and authority aforesaid, made certain rules for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas, it being expedient that such rules should be revoked, and amended rules made in their stead, the rules in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to and approved of by his Honour Christopher William Richmond, a Judge of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, as required by the said

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby, with such approval as aforesaid, make the following rules of practice and procedure for the purpose of regulating proceedings under the said Act and under the Act amending the same:—

1. The rules made by the Order in Council of the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, are hereby revoked, and the Schedule to the said rules is hereby also revoked.

rules is hereby also revoked.

2. An application for the certificate of a Commissioner shall be in the Form (A) or (B) in the Schedule hereto, and shall be signed by or on behalf of the person requiring such

certificate

3. A Commissioner shall not be required to hold an inquiry onless payment of his reasonable expenses in attending at the place to be appointed for the inquiry, together with the reasonable expenses of any public officer whose attendance thereat he shall deem necessary, be first secured to his satis-

4. A Commissioner shall appoint a time and place for the 4. A Commissioner shall appoint a time and place for the commencement of each inquiry, and shall cause notice thereof to be given in such manner and to such persons as he may deem fit, either by way of personal service, advertisement in the Gazette or Kahiti, or otherwise howsoever; and he may from time to time adjourn any inquiry, and continue the same either at the place at which it was commenced, or at any other place to be by him appointed.

5. A summons to a witness may be in the Form (C), or to the like effect

the like effect.

6. If a Commissioner decide to grant a certificate, he shall not sign the same until the expiration of seven days after such decision.

7. A person aggrieved by the decision of a Commissioner to grant or to refuse a certificate may, within seven days after such decision, deliver in writing to such Commissioner a notice of his intention to appeal, stating the grounds of

dissatisfaction with such decision. If such notice be so delivered, the Commissioner shall not indorse or sign a cer-tificate in pursuance of such decision pending the appeal. 8. Where the decision of a Commissioner is impugned in

point of law only, the appeal shall be in the form of a case approved of by the Commissioner.

9. A draft case shall be presented to the Commissioner by

9. A draft case shall be presented to the Commissioner by the appellant for approval within fourteen days after the giving of the decision appealed against. Parties interested shall be entitled to be heard as to the terms of the case; but it shall be finally settled by the Commissioner according to his own judgment. The Commissioner shall, as soon as conveniently may be, transmit the case as settled to the Registrar at the nearest office of the Court in the judicial district within which the lands affected are situate.

10. If the facts be disputed, the Commissioner shall report the evidence taken by him, and the appeal shall be by way of rehearing upon such report, with discretionary power in the Court to receive further evidence either by oral examination in Court, by affidavit, or by deposition taken before an Examiner or Commissioner appointed for the purpose.

11. It shall not be lawful for the appellant on the hearing of any appeal, whether on a case stated or by way of rehearing,

to set up or argue any ground of appeal which shall not have been stated in the notice of appeal, saving always to the Court the right to take notice of objections arising on the facts in evidence.

12. Appeals shall be set down for hearing at the first prac-

ticable sitting in Banco.

13. The Court may remit a case for amendment.

14. The Registrar shall forthwith certify the decision or direction of the Court to the Commissioner, who shall act

thereupon as may be necessary to give effect thereto.

15. Upon any appeal the Court may make such order as to costs, and the party or parties by whom the same shall be paid, as to it may seem fit: Provided that no Commissioner whose decision may have been appealed from shall be liable

to any costs in respect of such appeal.

16. Costs allowed upon appeal may be fixed by the Court, and if not so fixed shall be taxed by the Registrar of the

Court as in actions.

Court as in actions.

17. All orders of the Court may be enforced in like manner as orders of the Court in its ordinary jurisdiction, and all proceedings in the Court not hereby expressly provided for shall be governed, as nearly as may be, by the ordinary rules and practice of the Court.

18. If a Commissioner shall, pending an appeal against his decision, cease to hold office, his duties and position in relation to the case may be assumed by any other Commissioner appointed for the purpose by the Governor.

19. In these rules "Court" means the Supreme Court of New Zealand, and "Judge" and "Registrar" mean respectively a Judge and Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the Court.
