WHEREAS it is enacted by section fifteen of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1887," that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation publicly gazetted, declare, on behalf of Her Majesty, that any fences constructed, or intended to be constructed, by or on behalf of Her Majesty, for separating land taken for the use of any railway in such Proclamation mentioned from the adjoining lands not taken, shall, to such extent as is mentioned in such Proclamation, be thereafter maintained, or erected and maintained, as the case may require, at the cost of Her Majesty during such time as the railway may continue to be used by or on behalf of the Government of

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of March, 1889.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Public Trust Office Act, 1872," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, place in the Public Trust Office any property held in trust for the benefit of private persons or communities by the Crown, and from and after the date of any such Order in Council the property to which it relates shall become vested in the Public Trustee, subject to the trusts attaching thereto and to the provisions of the said Act for the custody, disposal, or management thereof: And whereas by "The Auckland and Onehunga Native Hostelries Act, 1867,"

All that allotment of land being number eleven of section twenty of the Village of Onehunga, situate in the Parish of Waitemata, in the County of Eden, containing by admeasurement two acres and nine perches, more or less, and bounded on the north by a road, four hundred and fifty links; on the east by part of the same section, five hundred and eighty-eight links; on the south by a line, two hundred and thirty-four links; and on the west by a line, six hundred and eighty links:

IN pursuance of the provisions of "The Government Native Land Purchases Act, 1877," it is hereby notified that negotiations on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen for the purchase or acquisition of the block of Native land in the North Island which is more particularly described and mentioned in the Schedule hereto have been entered into.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 366, against 458 in January, a decrease of 92. The deaths in February were 174, an increase of 34 on the number in January. Of the total deaths, males contributed 97; females, 77. Ninety-one of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 52.30 per cent. of the whole number; 77 of these were under 1 year of age.

† The information necessary for calculating the population cannot be obtained from the Town Clerk until April.

‡ It must be understood that the numbers of the population above given refer only to those within the several borough boundaries. To estimate the relative importance of the principal boroughs as centres of population it is necessary in each case to take into consideration the number of the population in the adjacent boroughs, some of which are included in the above table, and other districts which are practically suburbs of the central borough. This can only be done with any degree of accuracy for census years.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—

The births in February were 204, against 246 in January, a decrease of 42.

The deaths amounted to 105, against 85 in January.

There were 15 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 2 males of 75 and 69, and 2 females of 79 and 72, died at Auckland; 4 males of 81, 70, 69, and 65, and 1 female of 73, at Wellington; 2 males of 83 and 66, and 1 female of 67, at Christchurch; and 2 males of 73 (both), and 1 female of 76, at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The number of deaths from these diseases increased from 11 in January to 38 in February. This was owing to a much greater mortality from diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 7 deaths in January and 36 in February. Of these 36 deaths, 31 were of infants under 1 year of age, and 4 of children between 1 and 2 years. The number of diarrhoeal deaths in February was exactly one-half of the number in the four boroughs during the whole of 1888,

and it was considerably greater than the number of deaths from the same causes in any month since March, 1887, when the number was 56. As this mortality is generally greatest in the month of March in each year, an increase on the number in February may reasonably be expected during the current month.

Constitutional Diseases.—There were 18 deaths from these diseases in February, against 15 in January. The deaths from phthisis decreased in number from 12 to 6, but those from cancer increased in number from 2 to 8, of which 3 occurred in Wellington and 5 in Dunedin.

Local Diseases.—The mortality from these diseases was considerably less in February than in the previous month, the deaths having been 32 in February and 46 in January. There was a marked decrease in the mortality from diseases of the nervous system, notably from inflammatory diseases of the brain, apoplexy, and infantile convulsions. Heart disease and diseases of the respiratory organs were also productive of fewer deaths. Diseases of the digestive organs were, however, somewhat more fatal; the deaths were chiefly of young children.

Violent Deaths.—Only 2 deaths were recorded in this class, 1 of a boy in Dunedin from sunstroke, and 1 of a man from an overdose of chlorodyne.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
