A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-fifth section of "The Mining Act, 1886," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown lands situate within a goldfield to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases, or for alienation by occupation licenses on deferred payments, under any law for the time being in force in the land district in which such mining district is situate:

And whereas the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto were, by the several Proclamations enumerated in the First Schedule hereto, set apart for agricultural leases:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to revoke the said Proclamations in so far as they relate to the lands mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the twenty-fourth section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Land District of Auckland, and known as the Mount Maunganui Recreation-ground, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1881;" and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Act.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to

The CORPORATION of the BOROUGH of TAURANGA, which shall be known as the Mount Maunganui Domain Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Monday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at the Corporation Office, Tauranga, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the twentieth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or

by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the third Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may, at any monthly or special meeting, appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Close Season for Rock-oysters made.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this third day of April, 1889.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, which said regulations shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, certain regulations were made, in exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, among other things, prescribing a close season for rock-oysters:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke such close season for rock-oysters in respect of the places hereinafter set forth, and to prescribe a new close season in respect of such places:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations:—

1. The close season for rock-oysters prescribed by Order in Council dated the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, is hereby revoked in respect of the places in which this regulation has force and effect, and the close season for rock-oysters in such places shall be from the date hereof until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine; and this regulation shall have force and effect in respect of the County of Coromandel and the foreshore adjacent thereto, and also in respect of the foreshore of the coast in Hauraki Gulf and Frith of Thames, within a line drawn from Point Rodney to the mouth of the Waikawhau River, situated on the west coast of the Coromandel Peninsula, and which river forms one of the boundaries of the County of Coromandel; and also in respect of the foreshore of all islands in that portion of the Hauraki Gulf and the Frith of Thames lying to the southward and westward of a line drawn from Point Rodney to Cape Colville; and also in respect of the foreshores of the coast and all islands adjacent thereto between Ngatoka Rarangi Point on the north and Bream Head on the south.

2. Any person committing a breach of the above regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one pound and not exceeding fifty pounds.

3. Every penalty imposed by these regulations shall be recovered in a summary manner before any two or more Justices of the Peace.

Amended Regulation under "The Mining Act, 1886," with respect to Occupation Licenses, Small Areas, Hauraki Mining District.

WHEREAS by section sixty of "The Mining Act, 1886" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time prescribe regulations for the issue of licenses for the occupation, for agricultural, horticultural, or dairy purposes, of any reserve set apart for mining purposes: And whereas certain regulations were issued under the hand of His Excellency the Governor on the twelfth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, with respect to the issue of such licenses as aforesaid, and it is expedient to amend such regulations in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in that behalf conferred by the said Act, do hereby amend the Regulation number seventy-six, subsection (L), of the regulations so issued as aforesaid, in so far as regards the amount of rent to be paid within the Hauraki Mining District, North Island; and doth hereby prescribe and direct that in lieu of an acreage rental, as provided in the said recited regulation, there shall be payable in respect of every occupation license issued in the Hauraki Mining District under the said regulation a rental calculated on the capital value of the land to be occupied, as determined by the Land Board of the district, but such rental shall in no case be less than threepence an acre.
