Wanganui Harbour Board Endowment Lands set apart on Deferred Payments.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Wanganui Harbour Endowment and Borrowing Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Land Board may from time to time deal with and dispose of the lands described in the First Schedule to that Act in like manner as other waste lands of the Crown within the district may be sold, dealt with, or disposed of:

And whereas by the one hundred and fourth section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Wellington did, on the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Tuesday, the eighteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application, at the Harbour Board Office, Wanganui, and at the Land Office, Wellington, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in the office of the Commissioner of Crown Land, Wellington.

Bringing Sections 107 to 114 of "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," into force in Auckland District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to declare that, from a day to be in such Proclamation fixed, sections one hundred and five to one hundred and fifteen, both inclusive, having special reference to persons of the Native race, or such of those sections as shall be in such Proclamation specified, shall come into operation in such districts of the colony as shall be in such Proclamation specified; and until so proclaimed, and in places not included in any such district, such sections shall not be in force:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in me as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the first day of June proximo, sections one hundred and seven to one hundred and fourteen, both inclusive, having special reference to persons of the Native race, shall come into operation within the Auckland Resident Magistrate's District, as the same is now defined under the said Act.

Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the East Oxford, West Oxford, and Rangiora Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

OXFORD REGISTRATION DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-east by a right line from Ashley Head to Block Hill; thence towards the east generally by a right line to the source of the River Ashley, and by the right bank of that river to its intersection by a right line from Trig. Station 16, Mairaki Survey District, to the north-western corner of Section No. 9791, Mairaki Survey District aforesaid; thence by that line to Section No. 9791 aforesaid; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 13684, by that section and Sections Nos. 15467, 5896, 1025, 14620, 13974, a road-line, and Section No. 1154; thence by a right line to the northern corner of Section No. 20235,

by that section and a right line across the River Eyre to the north-western corner of Section No. 13682, by that section and Sections Nos. 13681, 15260, and a right line to the northern corner of Section No. 34754, by that section, across a road, and by Sections Nos. 30310, 33342, and 33451, and the north-western boundary-line of the last-mentioned section produced to the road which runs by Trig. Station 48, Mairaki Survey District aforesaid; thence by that road to said Trig. Station 48; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 32083, Oxford Survey District; thence by the road forming the south-eastern boundary of that section, and the north-western side of that road produced across the Waimakariri River to its right bank; towards the south-west and west by the right bank of that river to a point in line with the northern boundary-line of old Run 270, Class 3; thence towards the north by a right line to and by that boundary-line to the summit of the Puketiraki Range; and thence towards the north-west generally by that range to Ashley Head, the place of commencement.

RANGIORA REGISTRATION DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-east generally by a right line from Mount Grey to the westernmost corner of Section No. 9015, Block XV., Grey Survey District; thence by the road dividing Sections Nos. 9015 and 7944 and that road continued to the Rangiora and Litchfield Road; thence by that road to the road dividing Sections Nos. 3348 and 3577, by that road to the main trunk railway-line, and by the railway-line to the road north-east of Section No. 2137, and by said road forming the western boundary of Section No. 1976 to the River Ashley; thence by the left bank of that river to the North Road; towards the east by that road to Te Pouapatuki Road; thence generally towards the south by Te Pouapatuki Road to the Drain Reserve; thence by a right line to the most easterly corner of Section No. 94; thence by the southern boundary-lines of that section to a road south-west of that section, by said road, and by a road north and north-west of Section No. 135 to the Cam River, by the Cam River to Young's Road, by that road to Boy's direct Rangiora Road, by that road to a road north-west of Section No. 1121, by that road to the Ashley and Kaiapoi Road, by that road to the road east of Section No. 2460, by that road to the road north of Section No. 6610, by that road to a drain reserve, by that reserve to a road north of Section No. 6592, by that road to the Oxford and Kaiapoi Road, by that road to a road south-east of Sections Nos. 7117 and 2953, by that road to a road north of Section No. 3981, by that road to the Cust Road, by that road to the Oxford and Ohoka Road, and by the Oxford and Ohoka Road to a point on its northern side due north of Trig. Station C 30, Rolleston Survey District, on the right bank of the Waimakariri River; towards the west by a due-north line to the River Ashley; again towards the south and west generally by the right bank of that river to its source near Block Hill, and thence by a right line to Block Hill; thence generally towards the north by a right line to the source of the south branch of the Waipara River, and by that river to the western boundary of Section No. 29653, Waipara Survey District; thence again towards the north-east by a right line to and by the summit of the range east of Bird's-eye Creek, and by the summit of the range to Mount Grey.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the twentieth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration of Births

and Deaths Act, 1875," I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the East Oxford, West Oxford, and Rangiora Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Oxford and Rangiora Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

Fee for Registration of Dogs in Chatham Islands reduced.

WHEREAS it is expedient to reduce the fee to be paid for the registration of dogs in the Chatham Islands, under "The Dog Registration Act, 1880:"

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and the Acts amending the same, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that Californian quail may be taken or killed within the Lake District, consisting of the County of Lake, from the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, both inclusive (subject nevertheless to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned). And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of ten shillings each, and that licenses to sell such game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds each; and the Postmaster at Queenstown is hereby appointed to sign and issue the said licenses.

(L.S.) ONSLOW, Governor.

WHEREAS by section seven of "The Post Office Act, 1881," it is, among other things, provided that the Governor may from time to time make regulations to be applicable within the colony, and may make, or cause to be made, arrangements with the constituted authorities in England, or in any of Her Majesty's colonies or possessions, or in any foreign country, for the transmission, through the medium of the post, of any money to or from any place whatsoever, and for the delivery and payment of the same, and may establish rates of payment for such transmission, and may make such regulations as may be expedient or necessary for carrying such arrangements into effect:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby make the following regulations, that is to say,—

1. On and after the 24th day of June, 1889, any single money-order may be issued in New Zealand, for payment in the United States of America, of a sum not exceeding twenty pounds sterling; and any money-order issued in the United States of America, for payment in New Zealand, of a sum not exceeding twenty pounds ten shillings and eightpence sterling (one hundred dollars of the currency of the United States of America) may be paid in New Zealand.

2. The commission to be charged on every money-order issued in New Zealand for transmission to, and payment in, the United States of America shall be—

IN pursuance of the power vested in me by sections 24 and 25 of "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," I do hereby make the following additional regulations for the examination of Masters and Mates, the same being similar to additional regulations issued by the Board of Trade, and do hereby order that they shall come into force on the 1st day of October next.

1.
