A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken, under "The Public Works Act, 1882," and its amendments, for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road in Pelorus Road District, Provincial District of Marlborough:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section five of "The Naval and Military Settlers' and Volunteers' Land Act, 1888" (hereinafter termed "the said Act") it is enacted that, in case of the death of any person found entitled to a certificate of remission of money under the said Act, the Governor, by Order in Council, may direct such certificate to be issued to such person or persons as he shall think most equitably entitled thereto: And whereas the several persons mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto were respectively entitled to certificates of remission under the said Act, and it appears expedient to make provision for such cases:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and direct that the certificate of remission to which each deceased person mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto was entitled under the said Act shall be issued to the person or persons whose names are set opposite the name of each such deceased person respectively in the second column of the said Schedule.

*Regulations for Fishing for Trout, &c., Waitaki and Waimate Acclimatisation District.*

ONSLOW, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of May, 1889.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Waitaki and Waimate Acclimatisation District, which comprises the Counties of Waitaki and Waimate, and the Boroughs of Hampden, Oamaru, and Waimate, and the waters thereof; and also the waters of the sea inside a line commencing from a point in the southern boundary-line of the County of Waitaki extended a quarter of a mile to the eastward from low-water mark ordinary spring tides; thence following the coast-line northerly at the same distance from low-water mark ordinary spring tides until it meets with the line of the northern boundary of the County of Waimate extended a quarter of a mile to the eastward beyond low-water mark ordinary spring tides: and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

REGULATIONS.

- LICENSES to fish for trout, perch, and tench in all the waters of the Waitaki and Waimate Acclimatisation District shall be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the United Council of the Counties of Waitaki and Waimate Acclimatisation Society (hereinafter termed "the said Acclimatisation Society"), at Oamaru, and for every such license a fee of one pound will be charged: Provided, however, that licenses may be issued to youths under fifteen years of age on payment of a fee of ten shillings: Provided also that it shall not be obligatory upon the said Acclimatisation Society to issue a license:
- Every such license shall entitle the person named

therein to fish in any of the said waters from the first day of October in the year in which the license is issued to the Saturday after Easter Day in the year following, inclusive; but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish with one rod and line only, and with the following baits, namely: natural and artificial fly, natural and artificial minnow, silveries, bullies (*Eleotris gobioides*), grasshoppers, beetles, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, grubs, and worms.

4. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort (except a rod and line, and landing-net or gaff for fish taken with rod and line) whatever, for the purpose of fishing for, catching, killing, or taking trout, perch, or tench.

5. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other un-sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of catching, killing, or taking trout; nor shall any of the baits above mentioned be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

6. No person shall fish without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the said Acclimatisation Society, or other person producing a license from such society, produce and show to such ranger, constable, member, or person his license, or the contents of his creel or bag, and the baits used by him for catching, killing, or taking trout, perch, or tench, as the case may be.

7. Every trout not exceeding eight inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall be immediately returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

8. No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill, or attempt to fish for, take, catch, or kill, in any manner whatsoever, or have in his possession, any trout, perch, or tench, except under the authority of and during the currency of a license hereunder.

9. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the district to which these regulations relate, any of the salmonidæ or trout, or take, fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ or trout in order to make sale of the same, without permission in writing under the hand of the Secretary of the said Acclimatisation Society.

10. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall be immediately returned to the water from whence they were taken.

11. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ, trout, or tench between the period from the Saturday after Easter Day and the thirtieth day of September in each year, which period is hereby appointed a close season for any such fish.

12. No person shall take, catch, or kill any perch under eight inches in length, nor shall perch be taken, caught, or killed at all, or had in possession of any person, between the thirty-first day of August and the thirty-first day of December in any year.

13. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, in any of the waters hereinbefore mentioned, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, dynamite, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

14. No person shall net for salmon, salmonidæ, or trout in any of the lakes, rivers, streams, or creeks in the Waitaki and Waimate Acclimatisation District, or in the sea in the vicinity of any river, stream, or creek which is within the said district, except for scientific or piscicultural purposes, and then only by direction or permission of the Secretary to the said Acclimatisation Society.

15. No person shall use any net for the purpose of taking fish in the Waitaki River or its tributaries, or within a radius of one mile from the middle of such river, at the place where it flows into the sea at low-water ordinary spring-tides: Provided that this regulation shall not prohibit the use of a landing-net by a person duly licensed to take trout, perch, or tench with rod and line.

16. Any person netting for indigenous fish in any bay or harbour, or near the mouth of any river, stream, or creek, which is within the said acclimatisation district, shall immediately return into the water alive any salmon, salmonidæ, or trout which may be caught in their nets. This regulation shall not authorise the use of any net where prohibited by the foregoing regulation number fifteen.

17. No person shall use stake-nets in or near the mouth of any lake, river, stream, or creek in the said acclimatisation district.

18. Any person committing a breach of either or any of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one pound and not exceeding fifty pounds.

WHEREAS by the two hundred and twenty-seventh section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby temporarily reserve from sale the land in the Land Districts of Auckland, Canterbury, and Southland, described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purposes in the said Schedule specified.

#### Altering Times of Meeting of the Land Board of the Land District of Southland.

WHEREAS by the first subsection of section forty-three of "The Land Act, 1885," it is provided that the Land Boards of the respective Land Districts shall sit at the land office in the principal town of the Land District, at certain times to be determined by the Board and approved of by the Governor, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*:

And whereas by a warrant under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was appointed that the Land Board of Southland should sit on the first Friday in every month, at eleven o'clock a.m.:

And whereas the Land Board of Southland did, on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, pass a resolution recommending that the time of sitting should be altered, and it is expedient to give effect to the said recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby fix and determine that the ordinary meetings of the Land Board of the Land District of Southland shall be held on the first Wednesday in each month, at eleven o'clock a.m., commencing on Wednesday, the fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, at eleven o'clock a.m., instead of on the first Friday in every month, at eleven o'clock a.m., as heretofore appointed.

#### Election of Native Assessor for Inland Patea Native Licensing District.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by "The Licensing Act, 1881," and "The Licensing Act Amendment Act, 1882," His Excellency the Governor doth hereby make the following regulations for the election of a Native Assessor for the Native Licensing District of Inland Patea:—

1. The nomination of candidates shall take place at Hiraka te Rango's house, Moawhango, on Saturday, the twenty-fifth day of May instant, at the hour of noon.
2. If a poll be demanded by a candidate or by any elector, the same shall be taken, and the election held, at the house aforesaid, on Saturday, the first day of June next.
3. The regulations for the annual elections of Native Assessors for the Native licensing districts in the colony, dated the 17th January, 1883, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 5, of the 18th January, 1883, shall apply to the present election of an Assessor for the Native Licensing District of Inland Patea, except where they are repugnant to the regulations now made.

#### Returning Officer appointed for Inland Patea Native Licensing District.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 420, against 469 in March, a decrease of 49. The deaths in April were 173, a decrease of 59 on the number in March. Of the total deaths, males contributed 93; females, 80. Seventy-eight of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 45.74 per cent. of the whole number; 56 of these were under 1 year of age.

† The information necessary for calculating the population has not yet been obtained from the Town Clerk.

It must be understood that the numbers of the population above given refer only to those within the several borough boundaries. To estimate the relative importance of the principal boroughs as centres of population it is necessary in each case to take into consideration the number of the population in the adjacent boroughs, some of which are included in the above table, and other districts which are practically suburbs of the central borough. This can only be done with any degree of accuracy for census years.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs :—

The births in April were 215, against 249 in March, a decrease of 34.

The deaths amounted to 95, against 147 in March.

There were 3 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards : 1 female of 73 died at Auckland ; 1 male of 73, and 1 female of 71, at Christchurch.

*Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.*—There was a decrease in the number of the deaths from these diseases, from 56 in March to 20 in April. This decrease was in accordance with the results experienced in former years, and a continued decrease may still be expected for the winter months. There were only 2 deaths from miasmatic diseases in the month, both from diphtheria, in Wellington. Typhoid fever did not cause any death ; and the deaths from diarrhoeal diseases were only 16, against 42 in March.

*Constitutional Diseases.*—These diseases were also less fatal in April : the deaths therefrom numbered 12, against 20 in March. Phthisis caused 4 deaths in April, being 6 fewer than in March.

*Local Diseases.*—The mortality from these diseases was greater in April, the number of deaths having been 41 in March, and 47 in April. Diseases of the nervous system caused a larger number of deaths, 10 as against 8 ; diseases of the circulatory system only caused 4 deaths, against 10 in the previous month. The deaths from diseases of the respiratory system doubled in number, from 5 in March to 10 in April ; but diseases of the digestive organs, which caused 17 deaths in March, caused 12 deaths in April.

*Violent Deaths.*—Of the 5 deaths in this class, two were of persons found drowned in the Wellington Harbour, and one was that of an elderly man, at Dunedin, who poisoned himself by taking chlorodyne.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
