Creating New Districts under "The Native Committees Act, 1883."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Proclamation issued under "The Native Committees Act, 1883" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), bearing date the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-fourth day of January in the same year, certain districts therein described were declared to be Native districts under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation so far as regards the Hawke's Bay District therein mentioned and described, and to create two new districts as hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby revoke the said in part recited Proclamation of the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, so far as such Proclamation affects to constitute Hawke's Bay District as therein described a district for the purposes of the said Act, and do hereby proclaim and declare that the several districts or areas described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby proclaimed to be Native districts for the purposes of the said Act.

And in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority I do hereby appoint the Resident Magistrate

And in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority I do hereby appoint the Resident Magistrate whose name and office are set forth respectively opposite the description of each district in the Schedule hereto (and who has jurisdiction therein respectively) to be the Returning Officer or person to take steps for the election of a Native Committee in such district in the manner prescribed by and
