HEREAS by section twenty of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1887," it is enacted, inter alia, that the Council of any county may, by special order, declare that all or any part of any district road shall, from and after a date to be fixed therein, be under the exclusive control of such local authority within the county as shall be mentioned in such special order, and may, by the same special order, direct that the cost of constructing and maintaining any such road or part of a road shall be borne either by the local authority to which the exclusive control thereof is given, or that a proportion of such cost to be fixed in and by the local authority to which the exclusive control thereof is given, or that a proportion of such cost, to be fixed in and by such special order, shall be borne by any other local authority or local authorities; and that, wherever the operation of "The Counties Act, 1876," or of any Act repealing or amending the same, is suspended, the Governor shall have and may exercise all the functions vested in a County Council under this section: cil under this section :

And whereas the road described in the Schedule hereto is a district road, and is situated in the County of Eden, in which county the operation of "The Counties Act, 1886" (an Act repealing "The Counties Act, 1876"), is suspended; and it is desirable that the said road should be placed under the exclusive control of the Panmure Township Road Board:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby order and declare that the road described in the Schedule hereto shall, from and after the thirty-first day of July next ensuing, be under the exclusive control of the Panmure Township Road Board; and I do hereby further direct that the cost of constructing and maintaining such road shall be borne by the said Panmure Township Road Board.

THE following despatch, received from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

Sir,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of an order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 6th instant, for giving

effect to the treaty between Her Majesty and the President of the United States of Mexico for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, signed at Mexico, on the 7th September, 1886, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Mexico, on the 22nd January, 1889.

The treaty will come into operation on the 19th instant, in conformity with Article XVIII.

Present:

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY, LORD PRESIDENT, DUKE OF RUTLAND, EARL OF LIMERICK, AND VISCOUNT LEWISHAM.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent order, limit the operation of the order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there, and no longer:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provision of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer.

And whereas a treaty was concluded on the seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, between Her Majesty and the President of the United States of Mexico, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Excellency the President of the United States of Mexico, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within the two countries and their jurisdictions, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes or offences hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up, have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a treaty, that is to say,—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland: Sir Spenser St. John, Knight Commander of St. Michael and St. George, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of Her Britannic Majesty in Mexico;

And His Excellency the President of the United States of Mexico: Señor Licenciado Don Emilio Velasco, ex-Minister

Plenipotentiary of Mexico in France, &c.;
Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The high contracting parties engage to deliver up to each other, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II., committed in the territory of the one party, shall be found within the territory of the other party.

ARTICLE II.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences :-

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.

2. Manslaughter.

3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to produce the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.

5. Ca rnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge, of a girl under sixteen years of age, if the evidence produced justifies committal for those crimes according to the laws of both the contracting parties.

6. Indecent assault.

7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, child-stealing. 8. Abduction.

9. Bigamy.
10. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily

11. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
12. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
13. Perjury or subornation of perjury.

15. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.

16. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, made criminal by any law for the time being in force.

17. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

18. (a.) Counterfeiting or obtained.

18. (a.) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.

(b.) Forgery, or counterfeiting or altering, or uttering what is forged, counterfeited, or altered.

(c.) Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine, adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of coin of the realm.

19. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
20. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person travelling or being upon a railway.
21. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

22. Crimes committed at sea:-

(a.) Piracy by the law of nations.(b.) Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.

(c.) Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons, on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.
(d.) Assault on board a ship on the high seas with intent to destroy life, or to do grievous bodily harm.
23 Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a

23. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

The extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both contracting parties.

Extradition may also be granted, at the discretion of the State applied to, in respect of any other crime for which, according to the laws of both the contracting parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE III.

Either Government may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Mexico, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of Mexico or in the United Kingdom respectively for the crime for which his extradition is demanded. demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or on the part of the Government of Mexico, should be under examination for any other crime in the territory of Mexico or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extra-dition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime, or on account of any other

matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or has had an oppor-tunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered. This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the high contracting parties respec-

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in contumaciam is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE X.

ARTICLE X.

A fugitive criminal may be apprehended, under a warrant issued by any Police Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two contracting parties in which the Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction: Provided, however, that in the United Kingdom the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a Police Magistrate in London. In the Republic of Mexico the Government will decide on the extradition by administrative procedure, until a judicial procedure be established by law, when the accused will be delivered as soon as possible to the Judge designated by law. The criminal shall, in accordance with this article, be discharged, as well in Mexico as in the United Kingdom, if within the term of thirty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the diplomatic agent of his country in accordance with the stipulations of this treaty.

The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

Article XI.

ARTICLE XI.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to; and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

ARTICLE XII.

ARTICLE XII.

In the examinations which they will have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to for said extradition shall admit as valid evidence the depositions or statements of witnesses taken in the other State, under oath or under solemn affirmation to tell the truth, according as its legislation may provide, or the copies of these depositions or statements, and likewise the warrants issued and sentences pronounced in the State which demands the extradition, the certificates of the fact of the condemnation, or the judicial documents which prove it, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified, under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of, or a judicial document stating the fact of, a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.

4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed

with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of the other State; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by law in the State where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the two high contracting parties, in pursuance of the present treaty, should be also claimed by one or several other powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery of such articles, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XVI.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

ARTICLE XVII.

ARTICLE XVII.

The stipulations of the present treaty shall be applicable to the colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such colony or possession by the Chief Consular Officer of the Republic of Mexico in such colony or possession.

Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender, or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of Mexican criminals who may take refuge within such colonies and foreign pos-

foreign possessions for the surrender of Mexican criminals who may take refuge within such colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding articles of the present treaty.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The present treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the high contracting parties. It may be terminated by either of the high contracting parties by a notice not exceeding one year, and not less than six months.

The treaty, after receiving the approval of the Congress of Mexico, shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Mexico as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in two originals, at the City of Mexico, the seventh day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 396, against 456 in May, a decrease of 60. The deaths in June were 144, a decrease of 8 on the number in May. Of the total deaths, males contributed 74; females, 70. Thirty-three of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 22.92 per cent. of the whole number; 24 of these were under 1 year of age.

[†] It must be understood that the numbers of the population has not yet been obtained from the Town Clerk.

† It must be understood that the numbers of the population above given refer only to those within the several borough boundaries. To estimate the relative importance of the principal boroughs as centres of population it is necessary in each case to take into consideration the number of the population in the adjacent boroughs, some of which are included in the above table, and other districts which are practically suburbs of the central borough. This can only be done with any degree of accuracy for census years.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—
The births in June were 196, against 254 in May, a decrease of 58.
The deaths amounted to 86, against 78 in May.
There were 24 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 2 males of 81 and 75, and 4 females of 85, 79, 71, and 69, died at Auckland; 6 males of 78, 77, 75, 73, 68, and 67, and 6 females of 94, 85, 81, 76, 69, and 66, at Wellington; 2 males of 80 and 70 at Christchurch; and 2 males of 79 and 66, and 2 females of 78 and 67, at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The number of deaths in this class was only 7 in June; although not the lowest number on record, it presents a great contrast to the mortality from these diseases in the summer months, when on one occasion there were as many as 76 deaths in this class in the month. The number is 11 less than that in May. Of these 7 deaths, 3 occurred from typhoid fever, viz., 2 at Auckland, and 1 at Christchurch, and 2 were deaths of children in Auckland from diarrhee. Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality in this class of diseases was somewhat less in June than in May, the number of deaths having been 17 and 19 respectively. Cancer caused the comparatively large number of 8 deaths—an increase of 2 on the number in the previous month; but the deaths from phthisis fell in number from 8 to 5.

Local Diseases.—There was an increase in the number of deaths from these diseases from 34 in May to 40 in June, while there was a diminished mortality from diseases of the nervous system; diseases of the circulatory system (heart disease, &c.) caused 12 deaths, against 6 in the previous month; and the deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs increased in number from 8 to 10. There was also an increase in the mortality from diseases of the urinary system.

Violent Deaths.—There were 4 deaths thus classified, of which 1 was suicidal.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health. connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
