Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

(L.S.) ONSLOW, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Invercargill, Wyndham, Winton, Gore, and Matura Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into five marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

INVERCARGILL DISTRICT.

All that area in the County of Southland bounded towards the north by the Oreti, Winton, and Forest Hill Hundreds respectively to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 14, Block VIII., New River Hundred; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 239 of the said Forest Hill Hundred; thence by a road at the northern boundary of that section, and by Sections Nos. 299, 298, 296, and 163 to the Makarewa River; thence towards the south-east by that river to the confluence of the said river and the Lindhurst Stream; thence towards the north-east generally by the said Lindhurst Stream and Lindhurst Hundred to Matura Hundred; thence towards the south and east by the said Matura Hundred and the Oteramika Stream to the Matura River; thence by that river to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of Section No. 44, Block IX., Oteramika Hundred; thence towards the south by a right line to the south-eastern corner of that section; thence towards the south-west generally by the southern boundary-line of Section No. 44 aforesaid, and the south-western boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 25, 24, 23, 22, 21, 20, and 19 of the said Block IX., and by the north-western boundary-line of the last-mentioned section to a point in line with the northern boundary-line of Block V., Oteramika Hundred; thence towards the south by a right line to and thence by the said Block V. to Campbelltown Hundred; thence again towards the east by Oteramika Hundred aforesaid to a point due east of the south-east branch of the Mokomoko Inlet; thence again towards the south by a line due west to the said Mokomoko Inlet; thence towards the south-west generally by that inlet, the New River Harbour, and the sea to the mouth of the Waimatuku Stream aforesaid; and towards the west by the said Waimatuku Stream.

WYNDHAM DISTRICT.

All that area in the County of Southland bounded towards the north generally by the Lindhurst Hundred, the Otu Creek, the Matura River, and the Mimiha River respectively to the source of the north branch of the latter river; thence towards the north-east by the summit of the range over Centre Hill and the Cairn to Run No. 162; thence towards the east generally by the said Run No. 162 to the summit of Forest Range; thence towards the south by the

summit of the said Forest Range to the Wyndham Survey District; thence by the Mokoreta and Toctoes Survey Districts respectively to the Matura River; and thence towards the west generally by that river, the right bank of the Oteramika Stream, and the Lothian Hundred.

WINTON DISTRICT.

All that area in the Counties of Southland and Wallace bounded towards the north by a line running due east from the Aparima River to the south-western corner of Section No. 196, Taringatura Survey District; thence by that section and Sections Nos. 195, 121, 214, 213, and 113 to the Oreti River; thence towards the north-west by the right bank of that river to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of the Village of East Dipton; thence towards the north-east generally by a right-line to the south-western corner of the said village; thence by the Village of East Dipton aforesaid to the road at the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 576, Hokonui Survey District; thence by that road and the continuation thereof through the said Section No. 576, and past Sections Nos. 575 and 572 to the easternmost corner of Section No. 577; thence by Run No. 146 and Section No. 354 to the south-eastern corner of that section; thence towards the south-east generally by Run No. 119A, Section No. 442, and Run No. 119B to Lora Stream; thence by that stream to Forest Hill Hundred; thence again towards the north by Hokonui Survey District; towards the east by Waimumu Hundred; again towards the south-east by a line bearing S. 45° W. to a point in Section No. 221, Forest Hill Hundred, bearing N. 48° 58' 36" E., and distant 26509.6 links from the north-western corner of Section No. 190 of the said Forest Hill Hundred; thence again towards the east by a line due south for a distance of 200 chains; thence towards the south by a line due west to the right bank of the Makarewa River; thence again towards the south-east generally by the said Makarewa River to Section No. 82, Forest Hill Hundred; thence again towards the south by that section and Sections Nos. 230, 262, and 239 of the said Forest Hill Hundred, and a right line from the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 14, Block VIII., New River Hundred; thence by that hundred to the Waimatuku Stream; thence towards the south-west by that stream to its source; thence by Sections Nos. 12 and 11, Block XVI., Jacob's River Hundred, and the Township of Hodgkinson to the Aparima River; and thence again towards the north-west and towards the west by the said Aparima River to a point due west of the south-western corner of Section No. 196, Taringatura Survey District aforesaid.

GORE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Counties of Southland and Clutha bounded towards the north-west generally by Cowan's Creek, Waimea Stream, and Longridge Stream respectively, Sections Nos. 512 and 42, Hokonui Survey District, by the road forming the north-western boundary of Section No. 625, and the continuation of that road to the northernmost corner of Section No. 198 of the said survey district; thence by the road

forming the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section and its continuation to the easternmost corner of Section No. 148; thence by a right line to the westernmost corner of Section No. 202; thence by Sections Nos. 639, 150, 541, 567, 40, and 511, and the southern boundary-line of the last-mentioned section produced to the Mataura River; thence towards the north-east by that river to a point due west of the Pyramid; thence towards the north by a right line to the south-western corner of Wendon Survey District; thence by that survey district and Greenvale Survey District; towards the east by Glenkenich Survey District to the south-western corner of Section No. 27, Block V., of the said Glenkenich Survey District; thence again towards the north-east generally by the said Section No. 27 and the road fronting Sections Nos. 14, 13, 11, 10, and 9 of the said Block V., and Sections Nos. 17, 18, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 37, and 41, Block IX., of the said Glenkenich Survey District to the easternmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence towards the south and again towards the east by Waipahi Survey District to the Southern Trunk Railway-line; thence again towards the north-east by the said railway-line to the Waipahi River; thence again towards the east by that river to Block XI. of the said Waipahi Survey District; thence again towards the south by the said Block XI. and Blocks IX., XII., and XIII. respectively of Waikaka Survey District to the Mataura River; thence towards the south-east by the left bank of the Mataura River to a point bearing N. 45° W. to the confluence of the Charlton Stream and the said Mataura River; thence towards the south-west generally by a right line to the said confluence; thence by the Waimumu Hundred; thence again towards the south by the said Waimumu Hundred and Forest Hill Hundred to Lora Stream; and thence again towards the north-west generally by the said Lora Stream, Run No. 148A, and Section No. 354, Hokonui Survey District, to Cowan's Creek.

MATAURA DISTRICT.

MY LORD,—With reference to Sir M. Hicks Beach's circular despatch of the 6th December, 1878, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of an Order in Council of the 28th ultimo, carrying into effect a declaration of the 19th February last, amending the Extradition Treaty of 1878 between Her Majesty the Queen and the King of Spain.

The declaration came into operation on the 10th instant, in conformity with Article III.

At the Court at Windsor, the twenty-eighth day of May, 1889.

Present:

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY,
LORD PRESIDENT, EARL OF COVENTRY, LORD ASHBOURNE.

WHEREAS by the Extraditions Acts, 1870 and 1873, it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent order, limit the operation of the order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions,

and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas a treaty was concluded on the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, between Her Majesty and the King of Spain for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the twenty-seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, it was directed that the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should apply in the case of Spain:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provisions of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force, and no longer:

And whereas a declaration was concluded on the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, between the Government of Her Majesty and the Government of His Majesty the King of Spain, for amending paragraph 5, Article II., and paragraph 5, Article VI., of the above-mentioned treaty of the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, which declaration is in the terms following:—

The Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Spain, being desirous to provide for the more effectual repression of crimes and offences in their respective territories, have authorised in due form the undersigned to agree as follows:—

ARTICLE I.

The English and Spanish texts of paragraph 5, Article II., of the Extradition Treaty of the 4th June, 1878, are cancelled, and the following text is substituted therefor:—

Unlawful carnal knowledge or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge of a girl under sixteen years of age, Indecent assault.

ARTICLE II.

The Spanish text of paragraph 5, Article VI., of the aforesaid treaty is amended by the substitution of the words "no menor" for the words "que no podrá exceder," so that the Spanish text shall run, "A la terminacion de un plazo no menor de quince dias desde que se ordenó la prision y sujecion á juicio del preso," &c.

ARTICLE III.

The present declaration shall come into force ten days after its publication, in the manner prescribed by law in the respective countries.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done at Madrid, in duplicate, the nineteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered, that the operation of the said Acts shall be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so far as relates to the Kingdom of Spain and to the said treaty and declaration, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force, and no longer.
