A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marrige Act, 1880," I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Castlepoint and Masterton Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

### PAHIATUA DISTRICT.

All that area known as the County of Pahiatua, bounded towards the north-west by the summit of the Tararua Range, from Arawaru Mountain to the Manawatu River; thence towards the north-east generally by that river and the boundary-line between the Provincial Districts of Hawke's Bay and Wellington to the summit of the Puketoi Range; thence towards the south-east generally by the summit of that range to Puketoi Trigonometrical Station; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 61, Block VIII., Mangaone Survey District; thence by that section and Section No. 175 of the said block, and the northern boundary-line of the latter section produced to the Pa Valley Road; thence towards the south-west generally by that road and Section No. 12, Block IV., Mangaone Survey District aforesaid, to the Mangaone River; thence by that river to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary-line of Section No. 31A, Block IV. aforesaid; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of the said Section No. 31A; and thence by that section and Sections Nos. 31, 29, 9, 8, 7, and 6, Block III., Sections Nos. 25 and 20A, Block III., Mangaone Survey District, to the Makakahi River; and thence by a right line to Arawaru Mountain.
