Regulation under "The Civil Service Reform Act, 1886."

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

Y virtue of the power and authority vested in him by in the Civil Service Reform Act, 1886," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following regulation respecting the Senior Civil Service Examination required by the said Act, and doth order that the same shall be deemed to form part of the regulations made under the said Act. form part of the regulations made under the said Act by Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven:—

REGULATION.

A candidate whose work at any Senior Civil Service Examination is good on the whole, but in one or two subjects is below the required standard, may be registered as having achieved partial success at the examination; and, on giving the requisite notice, may at the next examination sit, without payment of fee, to be examined in such one or two subjects; and such candidate, if successful in such subject or subjects, shall be deemed to have passed the examination. examination.

Regulations for Trout- and Perch-fishing, Ashburton County.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. N pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," and "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Ashbutton County, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and in the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette, supersede all regulations at variance therewith tions at variance therewith.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout and perch in all the waters in the County of Ashburton, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatisation Society, at Ashburton, and for every such license the followings scale of fees will be charged: For adults, twenty shillings; for youths under sixteen years of age, ten shillings, for the season: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the said Secretary to issue a license.

2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish for trout in any of the said waters from the sixteenth day of September in any one year to the fifteenth day of April in the year following, inclusive, and for perch from the fifteenth day of December in any one year to the thirtieth day of June in the year following, inclusive; but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent. LICENSES to fish for trout and perch in all the waters in

of any person without his consent.

3. Licenses to fish for trout and perch in any of the waters of the County of Ashburton for a period not exceeding one month from the date of issue may, however, be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatisation Society to persons visiting the county, and for such license a fee of five shillings will be charged.

4. No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill, or have in his possession, or attempt to fish for, take, catch or kill, in any manner whatever, any of the salmonidæ, or trout, or perch, except during the above-mentioned periods.

5. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fell with one red and line and and a right the following

to fish with one rod and line only, and with the following baits, namely: Natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, silveries, bullies (*Eleotris gobioides*), grashoppers,

spiders, caterpillars, creepers, and worms.

6. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort or kind whatever, for the purpose of fishing for, taking, catching, or killing, trout or perch, except a rod and line, and a landing-net or gaff for fish taken with rod and line.

7. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout or perch; nor shall any of the baits above mentioned be used with any medicated or chemical

preparation whatever.

8. No person shall fish without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, or member of the acclimatisation society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing trout or perch.

Every trout under ten inches in length, and every perch under six inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

into the water from which the same is taken.

10. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any of the said waters, any sawdust or saw-mill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

11. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken. to the water from whence it was taken.

12. No person shall buy, sell, or expose, or offer for sale, within the district to which these regulations relate, any of the salmonidæ, trout, or perch, or take, fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ, trout, or perch in order to make sale of the same, for a period of one year from the fitteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eightynine.

13. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonide, trout, or perch during the period appointed for a close season for any of such fish.

14. The Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatisation Society may indorse any license to fish issued by any other acclimatisation society, and upon such indorsement being made the person in whose favour it was issued shall be entitled to fish for trout and perch in any of the waters within the County of Ashburton without payment by such person of any further fee; but subject in all other respect to the regulations with regard to the fishing for trout and perch in force within the said county. in force within the said county.

15. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than twenty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty of "The Counties Act, 1886" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that all the powers of a County Council relating to the alteration of the boundaries of any road or town districts the alteration of the boundaries of any road or town districts within a county, or of amalgamating such districts, or of merging any of them into the county, and all other powers in relation to such districts exercisable by the Council by special order or on petition, may be exercised by the Governor in Council in respect of any of the counties in which the said Act is suspended: And whereas the said Act is suspended in the County of Peninsula: And whereas in pursuance of "The Road Boards Act, 1882," a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, signed by two-thirds of the ratepayers in the Peninsula Road District, in the said County of Peninsula, praying him to constitute a new road district: new road district:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that such portion of the said Peninsula Road District, in the County of Peninsula, as is comprised within the boundaries described in the First Schedule hereto shall constitute a new road district, to be called the Tomahawk Road District; and that the number of the members of the Road of the said road the number of the members of the Board of the said road district shall be six.

And His Excellency doth further hereby declare that, from and after the date hereof, the boundaries of the aforesaid Peninsula Road District shall be as the same are described in the Second Schedule hereto.

And His Excellency, in pursuance of the powers and authority aforesaid, doth hereby appoint William Denton to be Clerk to the Board of the Tomahawk Road District so constituted as aforesaid, to hold office until a Chairman or Clerk is appointed by the said Board: and doth also appoint Clerk is appointed by the said Board; and doth also appoint the said William Denton to be the Returning Officer to hold the first election of six members of the said Board; and Saturday, the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be the day, and the Tomahawk Schoolhouse to be the place, for such first election. And His Excellency doth further appoint Monday, the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, at eight o'clock in the evening, to be the time, and the said schoolhouse to be the place, for the first meeting of the Board of the said road district.

In exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Counand with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the pieces or parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Te Aroha Public Domain Board, namely. namely,

The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Friday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at Te Aroha, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Friday, the fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any



The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 443, against 432 in July, an increase of 11. The deaths in August were 166, an increase of 10 on the number in July. Of the total deaths, males contributed 96; females. 70. Forty-four of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 26.51 per cent. of the whole number; 30 of these were under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—The births in August were 224, against 217 in July, an increase of 7. The deaths amounted to 77, against 90 in July.

The deaths amounted to 77, against 90 in July.

There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 4 males of 77, 76, 70, and 67, and 2 females of 90 and 85, died at Auckland; a male of 74 and a female of 72 at Wellington; a male of 76 and a female of 79 at Christchurch; and a female of 65 at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths in this class increased in number from 6 in July to 9 in August, the difference being chiefly caused by an increase in the number of deaths from typhoid fever in Wellington, from 1 in July to 3 in August. There were not any deaths from this disease in either of the other three boroughs. Three deaths occurred in each month from diphtheria. In July all 3 occurred in Wellington; in August there was 1 in Wellington, 1 in Christchurch, and 1 in Dunedin. church, and 1 in Dunedin.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases caused 12 deaths in August, against 13 in July. There were 5 deaths from

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases caused 12 deaths in August, against 13 in July. There were 5 deaths from cancer in July, but not any in August. The deaths, however, from phthisis increased in number from 3 in July to 8 in the past month; of which 4 occurred in Dunedin, and 2 in Auckland.

Local Diseases.—There was a decrease in the number of deaths in this class, from 52 in July to 42 in August. Diseases of the nervous system caused a much greater mortality, the deaths having increased in number from 7 to 13; but diseases of the circulatory system, heart disease, &c., only caused 3 deaths in August, against 10 in July. There was also a considerable decrease in the mortality from diseases of the digestive system, from 9 deaths in July to 4 in August.

Violent Deaths.—There were 4 deaths in this class. The deaths of 2 persons were attributed to accident, one of whom was injured by a railway-truck; 2 persons committed suicide.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health. with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
