Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the seventeenth section of "The Land Act, 1885," and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby declare that the land enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby reserved for the purpose stated opposite to the description of such land in the second column hereto, for the benefit of the Town of Featherston, as constituted under the provisions of "The Town Districts Act, 1881," on the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

Regulations under "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885," for the Election of Members of Boards by Contributory Local Authorities.

ONSLOW, Governor.

WHEREAS by section six of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act 1885 Amendment Act, 1886," it is provided that the Governor, by Order in Council, shall, before the month of November 1885.

WHEREAS by section six of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act 1885 Amendment Act, 1886," it is provided that the Governor, by Order in Council, shall, before the month of November next ensuing, and at the same period in every third year thereafter, apportion the representation of the various contributory local authorities in any district on the Board of such district, in the manner therein set forth:

And whereas it is necessary that regulations shall be made for the elections of members of the Boards of such districts by such contributory local authorities as are grouped together in terms of the above-mentioned section:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in him by section ninety-nine of "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885," doth hereby make and prescribe the regulations hereinafter set forth for the conduct of the said recited elections, and the proceedings incidental thereto, namely:—

1. The local authorities named in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall have respectively the number of votes set opposite them in the second column of said Schedule, and their representative or representatives shall meet at the time and place set opposite the names of such local authorities in the third and fourth columns of the said Schedule respectively

set opposite them in the second column of said Schedule, and their representative or representatives shall meet at the time and place set opposite the names of such local authorities in the third and fourth columns of the said Schedule respectively to elect such member or members as have been apportioned to such local authorities by Order in Council of the twenty-fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

2. The Presiding Officer to conduct the election in each case shall be the person named in the fifth column of the said Schedule, opposite the name of each local authority. Any local authority may, if it think fit, send only one representative to such election, and such representative shall then be entitled to exercise the full number of votes which such local authority is given by regulation one aforesaid.

3. Any local authority may appoint, by writing under the hand of the Chairman or Mayor, as the case may be, any person or persons residing at or near the place of meeting as aforesaid, to be its representative or representatives at such meeting, and such representative or representatives shall be entitled to exercise the full number of votes which such local authority is given by regulation one.

4. In case any contributory local authority shall not send a representative to such election, the representative or representatives of the local authority or authorities present at the meeting called for such election shall elect the member or members which such local authorities together are entitled to have, and that either at the meeting then held or at a subsequent meeting to be specially convened for the purpose by the Presiding Officer of such first-mentioned meeting.

5. The Presiding Officer at every meeting of local authorities as aforesaid shall make a return in writing to the Secretary of the Board to which any member has been elected, setting forth the names of the person or persons elected to serve as members of such Board. The Secretary shall thereupon notify the Inspector of

ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title and construction.

1. This Act may be cited as "The Passengers Acts Amendment Act, 1889," and shall be construed together with "The Passengers Act, 1855," and "The Passengers Act Amendment Act, 1863."

Submarine Electric Cable: For the preservation of the submarine electric cable laid between Swan Island and Observatory Point, Point Nepean, vessels shall not be anchored within four cables on either side of an imaginary line crossing Port Phillip Bay from Swan Beacon to Pope's Eye Fort, and thence to Observatory Point.

INNER ROUTE TO TORRES STRAIT.

THE following information has been supplied by Lieutenant G. C. Frederick, R.N., commanding H.M. surveying ship "Dart":—

"Dart":—
Oswald Recf, near Cape Melville, is 4 cables in length north and south and 3 cables wide, with a general depth of from 2 to 5 fathoms. It has, however, several coral heads with not more than 9ft., and one near its western edge on which there is only 4ft. at low-water springs, and which lies in the following position: Lightship, S. 20° W.; Sandy Islet, Pipon Islands, S. 64° 30′ E.; left extreme, N. 87° E.

Taiwan Shoal has not more than 17ft. of water over it at low-water springs, and lies midway between e and g Reefs, with the beacon on e Reef bearing S. 34° W., and the beacon on d Reef bearing S. 56° E.

Night Island.—The reef off the N.W. end of this island, of which a notice was issued from this office in December, 1887,

Night Island.—The reef off the N.W. end of this island, of which a notice was issued from this office in December, 1887, has been found, on examination, to consist of a small detached reef, its outer or north-western edge lying N.W. ½ W. 3 cables from the northernmost mangroves of Night Island.

The main reef extends 2 cables northward of the island, but all dangers may be cleared and a good berth be picked up off the Sandy Beach by keeping No. IX. Island its own breadth open to the westward of Night Island.

Shoal and Rock near No. X., Claremont Island.—A bank with 2½ fathoms on its western edge lies 8 cables E. by N. from this island, and extends thence for more than a mile, with patches carrying 4 and 5 fathoms.

At 1.9 miles E.N.E. from the island is a coral rock with only 5ft. of water over it at low-water springs.

Rocky Patch off Cape Direction .- On the edge of the shoal Rocky Patch off Cape Direction.—On the edge of the shoal water to the north-eastward of the cape, and at a distance from it of 1.6 miles, is a sandy patch with only I fathom at low-water, with deep water close to, outside. It lies in the following direction: Beacon on y Reef, N. 60° E.; highest tree on No. X. Island, S. 36° E.

Reef S.E. of Young Islet.—Careful search was made for the coral patch awash at low-water shown on the Admiralty chart as lying about one mile S.E. of Young Islet, but no indication of sheal-water could be found.

m Reef, Cape Grenville.—A close examination of the northwest and western edges of m Reef failed to discover the outlying patches shown upon the Admiralty chart.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 478, against 426 in September, an increase of 52. The deaths in October were 176, an increase of 20 on the number in September. Of the total deaths, males contributed 97; females, 79. Fifty-seven of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 32.39 per cent. of the whole number; 45 of these were under 1 year of age.

[†] It must be understood that the numbers of the population above given refer only to those within the several borough boundaries. To estimate the relative importance of the principal boroughs as centres of population it is necessary in each case to take into consideration the number of the population in the adjacent boroughs, some of which are included in the above table, and other districts which are practically suburbs of the central borough. The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—
The births in October were 264, against 212 in September, an increase of 52.
The deaths amounted to 96, against 88 in September.
There were 16 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 4 males of 80, 73, 72, and 67, and 2 females of 86 and 66, died at Auckland; 3 males of 80, 68, and 66 at Wellington; 2 males of 80 and 73, and a female of 80, at Christchurch; 2 males of 67 and 65, and 2 females of 96 and 67, at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—There were 6 deaths in this class in October, against 1 in September: 2 of these deaths were of children from diphtheria in Wellington.

Constitutional Diseases.—There was a decrease in the mortality from these diseases from 26 in September to 21 in October. Cancer caused 5 deaths, against 4 in the previous month; but the deaths from phthisis fell in number from 16 in September to 11 in October. The deaths from phthisis were more numerous in each of these months than in the corresponding months in 1888.

Local Diseases.—There was a decrease of 5 in the number of deaths from these causes in October on that in September—from 52 to 47. Diseases of the nervous system caused 9 deaths, against 12 in September; but diseases of the circulatory system (heart disease, &c.) were slightly more fatal, having caused 12 deaths, against 11 in September. There was a great decrease in the mortality from diseases of the respiratory system, namely, from 19 to 10 deaths; on the other hand, diseases of the digestive system caused 10 deaths in October, against 1 in September.

Violent Deaths.—There were 2 deaths in this class, of which one was of a child wilfully drowned in a bath; the other was of solid will not over by a cart

was of a child run over by a cart.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with scantery condition and climatic influence of the season on health. with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
