*Altering Rules and Regulations for the New Zealand Volunteer Force.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Defence Act, 1886," power is given to the Governor from time to time to make, alter, and revoke regulations respecting the enrolment, discipline, training, exercise, accoutrements, clothing, equipment, conveyance, pay, rations, and lodging of the forces, or any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, issued under the provisions of the said Act, certain regulations were made for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient now to revoke certain of the said regulations:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, doth by this present Proclamation revoke rules numbered two hundred and seven, two hundred and eight, two hundred and thirty-four, two hundred and thirty-four A, two hundred and thirty-five, two hundred and thirty-six, two hundred and thirty-seven, and two hundred and thirty-eight of the aforesaid regulations, and doth hereby declare that the rules specified in the Schedule hereinafter written shall come into force from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, in lieu of the rules so revoked as aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

207. THE amount granted by the Government for prizes will be distributed in such sums as shall be decided by the Defence Minister each year, according to the figure of merit obtained by corps in volley firing.

208. No corps shall be entitled to receive a prize unless at least two-thirds of the strength of the corps is present, exclusive of officers, and competes at the volley firing, on the day appointed by the Officer Commanding the District.

*Officers' Unattached List.*

234. There will be two unattached lists for officers of the Volunteer Force:—

- (1.) Active list;
- (2.) Honorary list.

234A. (1.) The active unattached list will be composed of officers who have been posted to this list up to the 31st December, 1889, and no further appointments will be made to it unless under such special circumstances as His Excellency the Governor may deem necessary to authorise.

Officers on this list will be termed District Staff Officers, be under the orders of the Officer Commanding the District, and will perform such staff duties as he may from time to time direct.

Should any officer decline or neglect to carry out any duties thus ordered, the Officer Commanding the District will immediately make a report on the case, when, if the circumstances are not considered satisfactory, His Excellency the Governor will be advised to revoke the commission held by such officer.

Officers on the list below the rank of field officer will be permitted to return to active duties with a corps, with the same rank and date of commission, which, however, will not carry with it seniority in the corps to which such officer has been elected or appointed.

235. Officers, of whatever rank, shall retire from active duty on attaining the age of sixty years, but, on special recommendation, may be permitted by His Excellency the Governor to remain on active employment for a further period not exceeding five years.

(2.) Honorary Unattached List.

236. Officers who hold the command of districts for not less than five years who, from age, ill-health, &c., are compelled to retire from active duty, will be eligible to be posted to this list, with a step of honorary rank.

237. Officers who have served fifteen years in the Volunteer Force, twelve of which must have been as a commissioned officer, will be eligible for appointment to this list, with the same rank held at date of application.

238. No officer on this list will take part in active duties or attend at any parade unless by the express direction of the Officer in Command of the District.

## A PROCLAMATION.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the two hundred and sixty-seventh section of "The Counties Act, 1886," and at the request of the Selwyn County Council, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare the lands described in the Schedule hereto to be water-races as defined by the two hundred and sixty-sixth section of the said Act, to be known by the name of the Waimakariri Water-races Extension; and, further, that the River Waimakariri, in the County of Selwyn, shall be a stream which may be taken for the purpose of supplying the said water-races.

## SCHEDULE.

## SUB-BRANCH NO. 1 OF BRANCH-RACE NO. 6.

ALL that area, 12½ links in width, situate in the Christchurch Survey District, County of Selwyn, commencing at a point on Branch-race No. 6, on Buchanan's Road, about 825 links distant in a westerly direction from the southern corner of Section No. 1136, and proceeding thence in a north-easterly direction intersecting said Section No. 1136 to a public road; thence along the north-western side of said public road for a distance of 560 links; thence across said public road to the western corner of Lot No. 6 of Section No. 209; thence along the eastern side of a road forming the western boundaries of Lots Nos. 6, 10, 11, and 12 of said section to the north-western corner of Lot No. 13; thence easterly along the northern boundary of said Lot No. 13 to and across the Racecourse Railway, Lot No. 36, and Racecourse Road to the western corner of Lot No. 63; thence in a south-easterly direction along the eastern side of said road to the south-western corner of Lot No. 57 of said Section No. 209.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1882" (hereinafter termed the said Act), it is provided that, if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under that Act, or any other Act or provincial ordinance, or otherwise however, for public works, is not required for public use, the Governor may, by an Order in Council, publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions in the said recited section set forth: And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto has been acquired for a public work within the meaning of the said Act, namely, for an approach to the Matakaitaki Bridge; and the Minister for Public Works has laid before the Governor a memorial accompanied by a map in terms of the said Act, praying the Governor, by an Order in Council, to cause the said land to be sold:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities aforesaid, do hereby order that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be valued and sold in the manner and subject to the conditions in the fourteenth section of the said Act provided.

## SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Nelson, being part of Section No. 61, Block I., Tutaki Survey District, containing by admeasurement 33 acres and 30 perches, more or less. Bounded towards the north-east by the left bank of the Matakaitaki River, by the Matakaitaki Bridge, and again by the said Matakaitaki River to the south side of the road intersecting the said Section No. 61; thence by a line bearing S. 6° 46' E. for a distance of 790 links; towards the south by a line due west for a distance of 1050 links; and towards the south-west by a line bearing N. 11° 19' west for a distance of 3926 links: and intersected by a road-line 1 chain wide; be all the aforesaid linkages more or less; as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.G. 11848, deposited in the General Survey Office, at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and thereon tinted light green, with dark-green border.

ALL that area in the Land District of Auckland, being a road, 100 links wide, the northern side of which commences at the south-eastern corner of Section No. 1, Block X., Coromandel Survey District (Preece's land), and proceeds westerly along the southern boundary of the said section No. 1 to the Waiau River, near its mouth; as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.G. 12524, deposited in the General Survey Office, at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and thereon coloured red.

## SCHEDULE.

THAT portion of the road known as the Kaikoura-Clarence Road which lies within the boundaries of Kaikoura County, commencing at the Hapuka River, and proceeding in a north-easterly direction, intersecting Blocks V. and III., Mount Fyfe Survey District, Block XVI., Kaitarau Survey District, and Blocks XII., XIII., X., and XI. respectively, Bui-Bui Survey District, to the bridge over the Clarence River: as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.G. 11372, deposited in the General Survey Office, at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and thereon marked in red.

*Prescribing Dues and Rates for J. Webster's Wharf, Opononi, Hokianga.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this ninth day of January, 1890.

THE HONOURABLE E. MITCHELSON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS John Webster, of Opononi, was, by Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and issued under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883," licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, as shown on plan marked M.D. 1491, for the purpose of constructing a wharf at Opononi, Hokianga Harbour: And whereas the said wharf has been constructed, and it is expedient to prescribe dues and rates to be charged for the use thereof and otherwise as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority granted to him by "The Harbours Act, 1878," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby prescribe that, from and after the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, the dues and rates set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf.

SCHEDULE.

1. The dues and rates hereby prescribed shall apply to the wharf so constructed by John Webster as aforesaid.

2. Every person who shall use the wharf for landing goods, or whose goods are stored in any shed on the wharf, shall pay wharf-dues in respect of the landing, storage, receiving and delivering such goods, as follows, that is to say,—

(a.) For all goods (except such as are hereinafter provided for) landed, stored, received, or delivered, at weight or measurement, according to shipping usage.

*Redefining Boundaries of Awatere and Wairau Road Districts, County of Marlborough.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this ninth day of January, 1890.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE E. MITCHELSON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Road Boards Act, 1882" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that all road districts and highway districts existing under the provisions of the Acts and Ordinances thereby repealed should, notwithstanding any defect in their constitution, be deemed to be road districts as therein mentioned; and by the said Act it is also provided that the Colonial Secretary should, as soon as conveniently might be after the coming into operation of the said Act, by notices in the *Gazette*, define the boundaries of all road districts in existence on the coming into operation of the said Act, and of the subdivisions thereof, as they existed on the date of such notice:

And whereas under the authority lastly hereinbefore recited, and after the coming into operation of the said Act, the Colonial Secretary did, by notice published in the *Gazette* of the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight

hundred and eighty-three, define the boundaries of the Awatere Road District and the Wairau Road District in the Marlborough County, and also the subdivisions of the said several road districts:

And whereas a portion of the Taylor Pass Road, which then was included in the boundaries of the Awatere Road District, was by error included in the boundaries of the Wairau Road District, so defined and published as aforesaid:

And whereas by the said Act it is also provided that in any case in which no sufficient provision is made by the said Act, or where anything is irregularly done in matter of form, the Governor may, by Order in Council, gazetted and publicly notified from time to time, make provision for any such case so irregularly done in matter of form, so that the true intent and purpose of the said Act may have effect:

And whereas it hath been made to appear that the said portion of the Taylor Pass Road, which is particularly described in the First Schedule hereto, ought of right to have been included in the boundaries of the Awatere Road District, so defined as aforesaid, and not in those of the Wairau Road District, as hereinbefore mentioned, and that the same was included in the notice published in the *Gazette* as aforesaid by error, which ought to be rectified, and also that the several matters hereinafter provided for, and for which no sufficient provision is made by the said Act, should be provided for as and in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, to the end that the true intent and purpose thereof may have effect, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that the said notice so published in the *Gazette* of the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, shall be and the same is hereby amended by including within the boundaries of the Awatere Road District, as defined as aforesaid, the portion of Taylor Pass Road particularly described in the First Schedule hereto; and in further pursuance and exercise of the power and authority aforesaid, and by and with the advice and consent aforesaid, doth also order and declare that the boundaries of the said Wairau and Awatere Road Districts, and of the several subdivisions thereof, shall be and be deemed to have been those respectively set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto, and as if the same had been so described in the said *Gazette* of the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the County of Marlborough situated in the Taylor Pass Survey District, being the road known as the Taylor Pass Road, which commences at the northern boundary of Section No. 48, Block III., and proceeds in southerly and easterly directions to the Taylor River, at the base of the hill called the Maori.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

AWATERE ROAD DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Marlborough bounded towards the north-east by the ocean, from Cape Campbell to the mouth of the Awatere River; thence towards the north and north-west by the Awatere River aforesaid to a point in line with the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 30, Clifford Bay Survey District; thence again towards the north-east by a right line across the Awatere River aforesaid to and thence by Section No. 30 aforesaid; thence again towards the north-west by a road fronting Section No. 31, aforesaid survey district; thence again towards the north-east generally by a road, and Sections Nos. 29, 28, and 4 of Block I., 6 of Block II., 15 of Block II., and 14 of Block II., Clifford Bay Survey District aforesaid; thence again towards the north-west by Section No. 14 of Block II. aforesaid and Section No. 27 to the Maxwell Pass Stream; thence again towards the north-east and east generally by that stream to the watershed; thence to and by a tributary of the Taylor River to the Taylor River, at the base of the hill called the Maori; thence by the said Taylor River and by the eastern side of the Taylor Pass Road to its junction with the road between Sections Nos. 28 and 48, Taylor Pass Survey District; thence towards the north by that road; thence towards the west and south-west by the western side of the Taylor Pass Road to the confluence of the Taylor Pass Creek with the Taylor River aforesaid, and by that river to a place near to the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 44 of Block I., Taylor Pass Survey District; thence by a line to the saddle, and by the summit of the dividing range between the Wairau and Awatere Valleys to Barefell Pass; thence by the Guide River and the Acheron River to the confluence of the latter with the Clarence River; thence towards the south-east by the boundary-line between the Provincial Districts of Marlborough and Nelson to the Clarence River aforesaid; thence again towards the south-east and towards

the south-west by that river to the ocean; and thence again towards the south-east by the ocean to Cape Campbell aforesaid, the place of commencement.

#### FLAXBOURNE SUBDIVISION.

Bounded towards the west, south-west, and south-east by the Clarence River, from its mouth to its confluence with the Elliott River; thence towards the west and north-west by the Elliott River aforesaid and the summit of the eastern watershed of the Awatere Valley to Blue Mountain; thence by the south-western boundary-line of Richmond Brook Run, as leased by the Crown, to the south-western corner of Section No. 74, Richmond Brook Run, Blue Mountain Survey District; thence down a tributary and up another tributary of the Medway River to the saddle between Monument Hill and Mount Peggie; thence by the Flaxbourne River and a tributary of that river to the saddle at the head of Upton Brook; thence by the summit of the dividing range to the Blind River, and by that river to the ocean; and thence towards the north-east and south-east by the ocean to the mouth of the Clarence River, the place of commencement.

#### LOWER AWATERE SUBDIVISION.

Bounded towards the south-east by the Flaxbourne Subdivision, hereinbefore described, from the source of the Hodder River to the mouth of the Blind River; thence towards the east by the ocean to the mouth of the Awatere River; thence towards the north-east and north-west generally by the Omaka and the Wairau Road Districts respectively to the head of Penk River; and thence towards the south-west generally by that river, the Awatere River, and the Hodder River to its source, the place of commencement.

#### UPPER AWATERE SUBDIVISION.

Bounded towards the south by the boundary-line between the Provincial Districts of Marlborough and Nelson; thence towards the south-east by the Clarence River to the Elliott River; thence again towards the south-east and towards the north-east by the Flaxbourne and the Lower Awatere Subdivisions respectively, hereinbefore described; and thence towards the north and north-west by the Wairau Road District, hereinafter described, to Barefell Pass; thence by the Guide River to its confluence with the Acheron River, and by the Acheron River aforesaid to the place of commencement.

#### WAIRAU ROAD DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial District of Marlborough bounded towards the north and east by the Onamalutu Creek, from the Wairau River to the south-west corner of Section No. 106, Onamalutu Survey District; thence towards the north-east by Section No. 106 aforesaid and Section No. 107, aforesaid survey district; thence by a right line to the nearest point on the summit of the watershed between the Onamalutu and the Kaituna Valleys; thence by that watershed to the summit of the dividing range of the Pelorus and Wairau Valleys; thence again towards the north by that summit to the boundary-line between the Provincial Districts of Marlborough and Nelson; thence towards the north-west and south-west by that boundary-line to Barefell Pass; thence towards the south-east, north-east, and east respectively by the Awatere Road District, hereinbefore described, the Omaka Road District, and the Borough of Blenheim to the north-eastern corner of Section No. part 2 of 8, Cloudy Bay Survey District; thence again towards the north by Sections Nos. 7, 9, 11, 13, 15, 17, and 19, aforesaid survey district, and the southern boundary-line of the last-mentioned section produced to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 89, Cloudy Bay Survey District aforesaid; thence again towards the east by the eastern boundary-line of Section No. 89 aforesaid to the north-eastern corner of that section; thence again towards the north by the northern boundary-line of said Section No. 89, by that boundary-line produced across the Omaka River, and by the northern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 91 and 131, Cloudy Bay Survey District aforesaid, to a point in line with the eastern boundary-line of Section No. 157, Onamalutu Survey District; thence again towards the east by that boundary-line and its production to the north-east corner of Section No. 35, Block I., Onamalutu Survey District aforesaid; thence again towards the north-east by a right line to the mouth of the Onamalutu Creek, the place of commencement.

#### WAIRAU VALLEY SUBDIVISION.

Bounded towards the south-west, north-west, north, and north-east by the south-western, north-western, northern, and north-eastern boundary-lines of the Wairau Road District, hereinbefore described, from Barefell Pass to the confluence of the Onamalutu Creek with the Wairau River; thence by the north-eastern boundary-line of the Wairau Road District aforesaid to the south bank of the said Wairau River; thence towards the south and south-east by the south bank of that river to the confluence of the Waihopai and the Wairau Rivers; thence by the said Waihopai River

to its source; thence again towards the north and towards the east by the summit of the dividing range between the Waihopai and Acheron Valleys; and thence towards the south-east by the Awatere Road District, hereinbefore described, to Barefell Pass, the place of commencement.

#### WAIHOPAI SUBDIVISION.

Bounded towards the north-west and north by the Wairau River, from its confluence with the Waihopai River to the north-eastern boundary-line of the Wairau Road District, hereinbefore described; thence towards the east and again towards the north by the eastern and northern boundary-lines of the Wairau Road District aforesaid to the Fairhall River; thence towards the south-east generally by that river to its source; thence by a leading spur to the dividing range between the Wairau and the Awatere Valleys; thence by the Awatere Road District, hereinbefore described; thence towards the south-west by the Wairau Valley Subdivision, hereinbefore described, to the source of the Waihopai River; and thence towards the north-west by the said Waihopai River to the Wairau River, the place of commencement.

#### FAIRHALL SUBDIVISION.

Bounded towards the north, east, and north-east by the northern, eastern, and north-eastern boundary-lines of the Wairau Road District, hereinbefore described, from the Fairhall River to the confluence of a branch of the Taylor River with the Taylor River, at the base of the hill called the Maori; thence towards the south-east and south by the Awatere Road District, hereinbefore described; thence towards the north-west by the Waihopai Subdivision, hereinbefore described, to the source of the Fairhall River aforesaid; and thence by that river to the northern boundary-line of the Wairau Road District aforesaid, the place of commencement.

"THE NATIVE LANDS FRAUDS PREVENTION ACT 1881 AMENDMENT ACT, 1888."—PROHIBITED DEALINGS WITH NATIVE LANDS.

5. It shall not be lawful for any person to negotiate, either on his own behalf or as agent or trustee for any other person, for the purchase, conveyance, transfer, lease, exchange, or occupation of any Native land, or of any land, or any estate, right, title, or interest therein, or for any agency or authority to deal therewith or in relation thereto, unless such land is now owned under Crown grant, memorial of ownership, or certificate of title issued under either a Native Land Court Act or a Land Transfer Act to not more than twenty Natives, or unless such land shall hereafter become and shall have been so owned for forty days.

6. Forthwith upon any land hereafter becoming owned by not more than twenty Natives as aforesaid, it shall be a duty

of the Chief Judge to notify the same in the *Gazette*, and also the name and description of the land, and the time when the said forty days will expire.

7. Any person who, on his own behalf or as agent or trustee for any other person, shall take or accept any conveyance, lease, transfer, gift, or other assurance from any Native, whether to himself solely or to himself and others, of any Native land or of any land not heretofore owned as aforesaid, or which, becoming hereafter so owned, shall not have been owned for forty days as aforesaid, or who shall be a party to any negotiation, agreement, contract, or promise for the making to him, or to him and others, or to any other person, of any such conveyance, lease, transfer, gift, or other assurance, or for the accepting or giving of any such agency or authority, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five hundred pounds, to be recovered in a summary way.

Every such conveyance, lease, transfer, gift, and other assurance, agreement, contract, promise, agency, and authority shall, except as hereinafter provided, be illegal and void:

Provided that no person shall be convicted of any offence aforesaid except on the information or complaint of some person duly authorised in that behalf by the Governor, either generally or in respect of some particular case.

**“THE NATIVE LANDS FRAUDS PREVENTION ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1889.”**

3. The words “to not more than twenty Natives” in section five of “The Native Lands Frauds Prevention Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1888” (hereinafter called the said Act”), shall not apply to land owned by Natives under Crown grant, memorial of ownership, or certificate of title under either a Native Land Court or a Land Transfer Act issued before the passing of the said Act, or in respect to which an order had been made by the Native Land Court for the issue of a Crown grant, certificate of title, or memorial of ownership, or an order under “The Native Land Court Act, 1886,” declaring the owners or person entitled on investigation of title or partition, before passing of the said Act:

(1.) If such land does not exceed five thousand acres in area; or

(2.) If a contract in writing for the alienation of such land of any area, or any part thereof, had been made and not completed before the passing of the said Act.

And the said section shall be read and construed in respect of such lands as though the said words “to not more than twenty Natives” had been omitted therefrom: Provided that nothing in the said fifth section shall be deemed to prevent a lease of land so owned or the subject of such order as aforesaid not exceeding ten thousand acres.
