ONSLOW, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886." I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district the boundaries whereof are described in the First Schedule. hereto is hereby incorporated into the Borough of the City of Christelurch, and constituted a separate ward of the Stid borough, by the name of the Richmond Ward; and I do further proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Richmond Ward of the said borough shall be those described in the said First Schedule hands in the said First Schedule hereto, and the boundaries of the said borough shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. 
