HOKITIKA DISTRICT.

All that area in the County of Westland bounded towards the north-east generally by Chesterfield Road, from the sea-beach to its junction with Greenstone Road; thence by the beach to its junction with Greenstone Road; thence by the latter road to its junction with the Loop-line Road; thence by the last-mentioned road to the Christchurch Road; thence by the said Christchurch Road to Waimea or Blake Creek; thence by the left bank of that creek to its confluence with the Teremakau River; thence by the said Teremakau River to its source; thence by a right line to the saddle between the said Teremakau River and the Hurunui Physics. saddle between the said Teremakau River and the Hurunui River; thence towards the south-east by the summit of the Southern Alps to a point due south of the source of a tributary of the Hokitika River (the Pass River); thence towards the west by a right line to the source of the said Pass River; thence by that river to its confluence with the Hokitika River; thence by the said Hokitika River to a point four miles south-west of the confluence of the Kokatahi River with the said Hokitika River; thence by a right line touching the south-westernmost extremity of Mahinapua Lake to the sea; thence towards the north-west by the sea to a point in line with the southern side of the said Chesterfield Road; and thence again towards the north-east Chesterfield Road; and thence again towards the north-east by a right line to the southern side of the said Chesterfield

REGULATIONS.

A BUREAU station means any ordinary telegraph station connected by telephone with an exchange, and includes any station so connected.

nected by telephone with an exchange, and includes any station so connected.

The following are the charges to be paid by the public for the use of Government telephones wherever established in the colony at a bureau station: Where the line used is not more than six miles long, a uniform charge of 6d. for the use of the same for any period not exceeding three minutes, and a further charge of 6d. for every additional three minutes or portion of three minutes. Where the line used is over six miles long, the charges are 1s. for the use of the same for any time not exceeding three minutes, and a further charge of 1s. for every additional three minutes or portion of three minutes. Messages telephoned by subscribers through an exchange to a bureau station or from a bureau station to a subscriber by a subscriber will be charged half the above rates, except when the bureau station is an office open for the transmission of telegrams by means of telephone or Morse telegraph instruments, and is outside the limits of a town or city.

When a message to the effect that any person is required at the telephone is delivered by the department from a bureau station, 3d. will be charged for delivery within the ordinary circuits of delivery. These charges must be paid by the sender.

Despatch.—Extradition Treaty with United States.

Wellington, 24th June, 1890.

THE following despatch, received from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

(Circular.) Downing Street, 22nd April, 1890. My LORD,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 21st of March, 1890, giving effect to the convention between Her Majesty and the United States of America with respect to the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, signed at Washington on the 12th of July, 1889, the ratifications of which were exchanged at London on the 11th of March, 1890.

It will be observed that the Convention came into operation on the 4th instant, in conformity with Article IX.

[Extract from the London Gazette of Tuesday, 25th March, 1890.] At the Court at Windsor, the twenty-first day of March, 1890.

Present:

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY, LORD PRESIDENT, DUKE OF RUTLAND, LORD CHAMBER-LAIN, EARL OF COVENTRY, SIR WILLIAM FIELD.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, it was, amongst other things, enacted, that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent order, limit the operation of the order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions. Her Majesty's dominions specified in the order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there, and no longer:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extra-dition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provision of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force, and no longer:

1886 should continue in force, and no longer:

And whereas a convention was concluded on the twelfth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, between Her Majesty and the United States of America, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which convention is in the terms following:

Whereas by Article X. of the treaty concluded between Her Britannic Majesty and the United States of America on the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, provision is made for the extradition of persons charged with certain crimes:

And whereas it is now desired by the high contracting parties that the provisions of the said article should embrace certain crimes not therein specified, and should extend to fugitives convicted of the crimes specified in the said article and in this convention:

and in this convention:

The said high contracting parties have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a convention for this purpose, that is to say,-

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland: Sir Julian Pauncefote, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, and Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of Her Britannic Majesty to the United

And the President of the United States of America: James G. Blaine, Secretary of State of the United States; Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The provisions of the said Article X. are hereby made applicable to the following additional crimes:—

applicable to the following additional crimes:—

1. Manslaughter when voluntary.
2. Counterfeiting or altering money; uttering or bringing into circulation counterfeit or altered money.
3. Embezzlement; larceny; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been embezzled, stolen, or fraudulently obtained.
4. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director or member or officer of any company, made criminal by the laws of both countries.
5. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
6. Rape; abduction; child-stealing; kidnapping.
7. Burglary; housebreaking or shopbreaking.
8. Piracy by the law of nations.
9. Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas, against the authority of the

on board a ship on the high seas, against the authority of the master; wrongfully sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or

attempting to do so; assaults on board a ship on the high seas, with intent to do grievous bodily harm.

10. Crimes and offences against the laws of both countries for the suppression of slavery and slave-trading.

Extradition is also to take place for participation in any of the crimes mentioned in this convention or in the aforesaid Article X., provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both countries.

ARTICLE II.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded be one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

No person surrendered by either of the high contracting parties to the other shall be triable, or tried, or be punished for any political crime or offence, or for any act connected therewith, committed previously to his extradition.

If any question shall arise as to whether a case comes within the provisions of this article, the decision of the authorities of the Government in whose jurisdiction the fugitive shall be at the time shall be final.

ARTICLE III.

No person surrendered by or to either of the high contracting parties shall be triable or be tried for any crime or offence committed prior to his extradition, other than the offence for which he was surrendered, until he shall have had an opportunity of returning to the country from which he was surrendered.

ARTICLE IV

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, whether being the proceeds of the crime or offence charged, or being material as evidence in making proof of the crime or offence, shall, so far as practicable, and if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place. Nevertheless, the rights of third parties with regard to the articles aforesaid shall be duly respected.

ARTICLE V.

If the individual claimed by one of the two high contracting parties, in pursuance of the present convention, should also be claimed by one or several other Powers on account of crimes or offences committed within their respective jurisdictions, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is first received.

The provisions of this article, and also of Articles II. to IV. inclusive, of the present convention shall apply to surrender for offences specified in the aforesaid Article X., as well as to surrender for offences specified in this convention.

ARTICLE VI.

The extradition of fugitives under the provisions of this convention and of the said Article X. shall be carried out in Her Majesty's dominions and in the United States, respectively, in conformity with the laws regulating extradition for the time being in force in the surrendering State.

ARTICLE VII.

The provisions of the said Article X. and of this convention shall apply to persons convicted of the crimes therein respec tively named and specified, whose sentence therefor shall not have been executed.

In case of a fugitive criminal alleged to have been convicted of the crime for which his surrender is asked, a copy of the record of the conviction, and of the sentence of the Court before which such conviction took place, duly authenticated, shall be produced, together with the evidence proving that the prisoner is the person to whom such sentence refers.

ARTICLE VIII.

The present convention shall not apply to any of the crimes herein specified, which shall have been committed, or to any conviction which shall have been pronounced, prior to the date at which the convention shall come into force.

ARTICLE IX.

This convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications

shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

It shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the high contracting parties, and shall continue in force until one or the other of the high contracting parties shall signify

its wish to terminate it, and no longer.
