

WHEREAS it is provided by section three hundred and six of "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time revoke, alter, or add to any order previously made under the said Act: And whereas an Order in Council was made on the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, under the said Act, fixing and prescribing rules for defining the boats, rafts, or other appliances for saving life with which ships are to be provided, and ordering that such rules shall come into force on and after the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety; and whereas it is expedient that such rules should not come into force until the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety:

force until the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order that the said rules shall come into force on the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, instead of on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, as pro-vided in the said Order in Council of the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine. At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of July, 1890.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS application has been made to the Governor in Council by Hone Mahia, Mere Kaimanu, Hori

Ngakapa Whanaunga, Tukukino, Joseph Kenedy (half-caste), Harata Taiporutu, Harata Noki, Wiremu Taiporutu, comprising a majority in number of the Native owners of the land described in the second column of the Schedule hereto, praying that the restrictions on the alienation of such land contained in the Crown grant bearing date such land contained in the Grown grant bearing date the twelfth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, described in the first column of the said Schedule, may be removed: And whereas inquiry has been duly made by the Native Land Court, and the said Court has reported that the provisions of the law in that behalf have been complication:

expedient have been complication: expedient to grant such application: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by "The Native Land Act, 1888," and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and deelors that all of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that all restrictions imposed by the said Crown grant on the aliena-tion of the said lands are, for the purposes only of convey-ance to Her Majesty the Queen, hereby removed.



The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 406, against 388 in May, an increase of 18. The deaths in June were 184, a decrease of 20 on the number in May. Of the total deaths, males contributed 93; females, 91. Forty of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 21.74 per cent. of the whole number; 30 of these were under 1 year of age.

\* It must be understood that the numbers of the population above given refer only to those within the several borough boundaries. To estimate the relative importance of the principal boroughs as centres of population it is necessary in each case to take into consideration the number of the population in the adjacent boroughs, some of which are included in the above table, and other districts which are practically suburbs of the central borough. This can only be done with any degree of accuracy for census years. The populations of the four principal boroughs and their suburbs in 1886 were as follows:--

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs :--The births in June were 238, against 211 in May, an increase of 27. The deaths amounted to 112, against 123 in May. There were 16 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards : 4 males of 84, 75, and 67 (2), and 4 females of 75, 71 (2), and 70, died at Auckland; 2 males of 75 and 69, and 2 females of 80 and 77, at Wellington; 1 male of 82 at Christchurch; and 3 males of 80, 69, and 68 at Dunedin. *Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.*—There was an increase in the number of deaths in this class from 17 in May to 20 in June. Scarlet fever and scarlatina caused 3 deaths in June, of which 2 occurred in Wellington, but not any in May. Typhoid fever was more fatal, having caused 11 deaths, against 7 in the previous month. Of those in June, 4 occurred in Wellington, 5 in Dunedin, and 2 in Auckland. Influenza and catarth caused each 1 death in Auckland; but diphtheria, which was fatal in 2 cases in May. dip to cause any death in June. There were only 2 deaths from diarthered diphtheria, which was fatal in 2 cases in May, did not cause any death in June. There were only 2 deaths from diarrhœal diseases in June, against 5 in May. Dietetic Diseases.—Three deaths occurred resulting from alcoholic intemperance; 1 was of a man only 31 years of

age.

Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality from these diseases was somewhat less in June (25 deaths) than in May (28 deaths). Cancer caused 8 deaths in the last month, against 7 in May. The deaths from phthisis were the same in number (14) in each month.

Local Diseases .--These diseases caused 53 deaths in June, a decrease of 8 on the number in May. Diseases of the *Local Distasts.*—Intest discusses claused 55 deaths in June, a decrease of 8 on the number in hay. Discusses of the nervous system caused 7 deaths, against 13 in the previous month. There was a slight increase, from 12 to 13, in the number of deaths from discases of the circulatory system; and a slight decrease, from 19 to 18, in the number from dis-eases of the respiratory system. Of these last, the deaths from bronchitis were less numerous in June by 2, and those from pneumonia were more numerous by 2. Violent Deaths.—There were only 2 deaths thus classified; 1 was that of a female, found drowned in Wellington

Harbour.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
