HEREAS by section four of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1887" (hereinafter termed "the said Act") it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively, shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that helalf in such Proclamation: in that behalf in such Proclamation:

And whereas the control and management of the bridge described in the First Schedule hereto (and hereafter referred to as "the said bridge") was vested in the Waitemata County Council by a warrant of the Honourable the Minister for Public Works, dated the twelfth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the cost of managing and maintaining the said bridge was apportioned

Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the company within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the company shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such remains to be made. or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law or regulation relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that

are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above highwater mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that
