Lands withdrawn from State Forests.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto are State forests and forest reserves respectively, under the control of the Commissioner of State Forests appointed under "The New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and the said lands are now no longer required for State-forest purposes: And whereas plans showing the extent and position of the said lands, and a statement of the reasons why they are no longer required for State-forest purposes, have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for a period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either of such Houses objecting to the issue of this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred by "The New Zealand State Forests Act Amendment Act, 1888," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby revoke the several Proclamations and instruments specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*; and doth hereby proclaim and declare that from and after such date the several parcels of land described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this ninth day of September, 1890.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS on or about the sixth day of June last an inquiry was held, under and in accordance with "The Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," before George Augustus Preece, Esquire, into the validity of the election of certain persons as a Licensing Committee, claiming to have been elected under the provisions of "The Licensing Act, 1881," for the Licensing District of Pahiatua Town: And whereas such inquiry was so held before the said George Augustus Preece, Esquire, as Resident Magistrate of the Court nearest to the place at which such election took place, and thereupon, *inter alia*, the said election was declared to be void: And whereas according to law it was the duty of the officer required in that behalf to give certain notice to the Returning Officer, and for such Returning Officer thereupon to proceed to hold a fresh election in lieu of that so declared void as aforesaid: And whereas the necessary acts and proceedings to hold a fresh election have been done and taken, and another Licensing Committee for the said District of Pahiatua Town was duly elected: And whereas the annual meeting of the said Committee has been unavoidably held at a later date than during the first ten days in the month of June, as required by the said Act, namely, on the twenty-first day of July last, and it is expedient that the holding of such meeting should be validated:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the two hundred and twenty-seventh section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby (to the end that the intent and purpose of the said Act may have effect) validate the holding of the meeting of the said Licensing Committee for the said district on the said twenty-first day of July last, and doth hereby declare that no proceedings at the said meeting, and no license granted or renewed thereat, shall be held to be void or informal by reason only of the delay in holding the said meeting as aforesaid.

Regulations for Trout-fishing, Taranaki County.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this ninth day of September, 1890.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," and "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the

County of Taranaki, and in the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout in all the waters within the County of Taranaki will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Taranaki Acclimatisation Society, and for every such license a fee of ten shillings will be charged: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the society to issue a license.

2. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in any of the said waters from the fifteenth day of September in any one year to the fifteenth day of April in the following year inclusive, between the hours of four a.m. and ten p.m. only; but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill, or have in his possession, or attempt to fish for, take, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, any of the salmonidæ or trout, except during the above-mentioned period.

4. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish with one rod and line only, and with the following baits: Natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, silveries, bullies, grasshoppers, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, and worms.

5. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance of any sort or kind whatever, for the purpose of fishing for, taking, catching, or killing trout, except a rod and line, and a landing net or gaff for fish taken with rod and line.

6. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other un-sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any of the baits above mentioned be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

7. No person shall fish without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the said society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing trout.

8. Every trout not exceeding eight inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

9. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, in any of the said waters, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

10. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

11. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the county to which these regulations relate, any of the salmonidæ or trout, or take, fish for, catch, or kill any of the salmonidæ or trout in order to make sale of the same, without permission in writing under the hand of the Secretary of the said society.

12. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the sixteenth day of April and the fourteenth day of September inclusive in each year, which period is appointed a close season for all such fish.

13. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

14. These regulations shall come into force as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Licensing M. M. Webster and J. Marshall to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore at Seaford, Golden Bay.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this ninth day of September, 1890.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that, in any case where there is no Harbour Board, or no Harbour Board empowered to grant any such license as in the said Act mentioned, the Governor in Council may in his discretion grant and issue a license

for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and all the provisions of the said Act in respect of such licenses shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply accordingly: And whereas there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Malcolm Muir Webster, Storekeeper, of Nelson, and John Marshall, Mine Manager, of Nelson (hereinafter called the "licensees"), have applied to the Governor for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore at Seaford, in the Pakawau District, Golden Bay, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," the licensees have deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington, marked M.D. 1371 and 1372, showing the manner in which it is proposed to construct such wharf, the place where it is intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore or land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it appears expedient that a license under the said Act should be granted and issued to the licensees for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy such part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto as may be necessary for the erection of the wharf at the site shown on plan marked M.D. 1371, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a wharf in accordance with plan marked M.D. 1372, so deposited as aforesaid, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of such wharf, at the site shown on the plan marked M.D. 1371, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

2. This Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege granted thereunder shall lapse and have no effect if the wharf is not completed to the satisfaction of the Minister within two years from the date of this Order in Council.

3. All Her Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the wharf and foreshore, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

4. The Governor in Council may from time to time fix such payments as he shall deem reasonable to be paid to the licensees by any private persons for the use of such wharf, and all lines of railway, cranes, or other appliances that may be on such wharf or foreshore.

5. The Governor, his staff and servants, and all officers in the Government service or employ, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at their own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees or either of them a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the licensees within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law or regulation relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees or either of them.

12. In the case of such resumption the licensees shall be entitled to compensation, to be ascertained by a Compensation Court in the like manner as is done in the case of lands taken for public purposes. The basis of the compensation shall be the then actual value of the materials on the wharf fixed in position; but no compensation shall be paid for any goodwill or other interest in the wharf, or the privilege of erecting the same. Possession of the wharf shall be given to the Minister at the expiration of the three months' notice before mentioned, although the amount of the compensation may not then have been paid. All compensation shall be payable out of moneys to be appropriated by Parliament, and until such appropriation the licensees shall have no claim in respect of the same or its non-payment under these conditions.

13. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause through any default or neglect on their part.

14. In case the licensees shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf;

(3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensees or either of them, or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that the license, rights, and privileges hereby granted to the licensees have been revoked and determined.

15. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

Regulations for Trout and Perch-fishing, Wellington Acclimatisation District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this tenth day of September, 1890.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Wellington Acclimatisation District, and the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations at variance therewith.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout and perch in all waters within that district or part of the North Island which lies to the southward of the following boundary-line—commencing from the mouth of the Manawatu River and following the course of that river to the Manawatu Gorge; thence in a direct line from such gorge to the mouth of the Waimata River, on the East Coast—may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Wellington Acclimatisation Society (hereinafter termed "the said society"), or any one authorised by the said Secretary in that behalf.

2. For every license to fish for trout and perch issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Wellington Acclimatisation Society or his deputy a fee of twenty shillings will be charged. Licenses may also be issued to boys of the age of sixteen years or under, or to ladies, at a reduced fee of five shillings for every license so issued: Provided it shall not be obligatory on the said Secretary or his deputy to issue a license.

3. The Secretary of the said society may issue day licenses to *bond fide* travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid, on their introduction to him by any two members of the said society, and on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each day's fishing: Provided that this payment may be remitted if the applicant be a member of or hold a valid license from any other society in New Zealand which grants the like privilege.

4. Any holder of a license may fish with one rod and line for trout and perch, and may use a landing-net or gaff to secure any trout or perch caught with such rod and line, in the above-named waters, from the fifteenth day of September in any one year to the fifteenth day of April in the year following, both inclusive.

5. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that with natural or artificial fly, insect, or fish only.

6. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the sixteenth day of April and the fourteenth day of September, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the said society for purposes of acclimatisation.

7. No person shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river or stream, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any sawdust or sawmill refuse, or anything of any kind or description whatever poisonous, deleterious, or noxious to fish.

8. No person shall take, fish for, catch or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned to the water from whence it was taken.

9. No person shall fish for trout or perch without a license, and every person fishing shall, on demand of any ranger, constable, member of the said society, or person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, member, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout or perch.

10. Every trout not exceeding nine inches in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

11. No person shall take, catch, or kill any perch under six inches in length, nor shall perch be taken, caught, or killed at all, or had in possession of any person, between the sixteenth day of April and the fourteenth day of September in any year.

12. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout or perch; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

13. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream.

14. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of one-quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low-water.

15. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any salmon, trout, or perch, or any part thereof.

16. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

17. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

Notification that Her Majesty has relinquished Negotiations for the Acquisition of certain Native Lands.

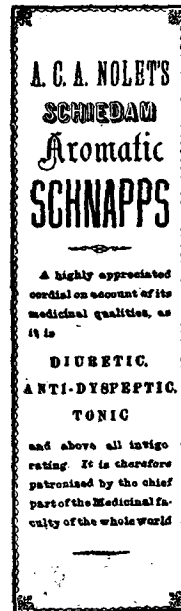

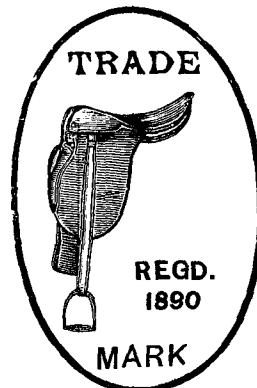
