Proclaiming the Taking and Laying-off of Roads over Lands in the Hawke's Bay Land District.

(L.S.) ONSLOW, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and in exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the roads described in the Schedule hereto have been duly taken and laid off through the lands specified, under warrants of the dates given, in the said Schedule.

ALL that parcel of land in the Land District of Hawke's Bay, containing by admeasurement 14 acres and 37 perches, more or less, situated in the Mangaporo Survey District, being a road, 100 links wide, the northern side of which commences at survey-peg No. 63, on the north-western boundary-line of Rotokautuku No. 2 Block; and proceeds in a south-easterly direction, traversing the said block, for a distance of 14255 links, more or less, to survey-peg No. 57, on the south-eastern boundary-line of the said Rotokautuku No. 2 Block: as the same is more particularly delineated on Map No. 242b, deposited in the Survey Office, Gisborne.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the two hundred and sixty-seventh section of "The Counties Act, 1886," and at the request of the Ashburton County Council, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare the lands described in the Schedule hereto to be water-races, as defined by the two hundred and sixty-sixth section of the said Act, to be known by the name of the Orari-Waihi Water-races; and, further, that the River Orari, in the County of Geraldine, shall be the stream which may be taken for supplying the said water-races.

SCHEDULE.

ORARI-WAIHI WATER-RACES.

RACE No. 1.

ALL that area, 12½ links in width, situate in the Orari Survey District, County of Geraldine, commencing at or near the westernmost corner of Rural Section 22006, and proceeding in a south-easterly direction, intersecting the said Section 22006, to the road forming the south-east boundary of the said Section 22006; thence across that road, and intersecting Rural Section 23521 and the Crown land lying between that section and the Orari River, to the Orari River.

RACE No. 2.

RACE No. 3.

TRINITY HARBOUR.—DIRECTIONS FOR NEW CUTTING. NOTICE is hereby given that the New Cutting into Trinity Harbour is now open for navigation. It is 200ft. wide, and is marked by six piles carrying square black beacons driven 50ft. from the edge on the eastern side of the cutting; the shoalest water in the cutting being 13ft. at low-water ordinary spring-tides. After passing through the cutting the water gradually deepens from 3 to 5 fathoms, the depth at the anchorage off the wharves.

Directions.

By Day: After passing the Fairway Buoy steer about S.S.W., keeping two white triangular beacons, which are erected on the masts on which the leading-lights are exhibited, in line, which will carry in mid-cutting until within a ship's length of the outer leading-light mast; then steer mid-stream until abreast the wharves, when a vessel may anchor in mid-channel in 4 to 5 fathoms of water.

By Night: Two white leading-lights and one red light are exhibited, which enable vessels to enter the port, and reach the wharves by night. The back light is at an elevation of 96ft., and the front light of 37ft., above high water, and are at a distance apart of 5,000ft. The red light, which is at the wharves, is distant half a mile above the outer white light. When making for the Fairway Buoy the two leading-lights will be seen, which, when brought in line, will bear about S.S.W., and will lead in mid-cutting. Steer with the lights in line to within one to two ships' lengths of the outer light, when haul more to the eastward, keeping the red light, which is placed on the outer end of Burns, Philp, and Company's wharf, on the starboard hand. When abreast of the red light a vessel may anchor in from 4 to 5 fathoms.

The old channel is still marked by seven black beacons on the port hand, and seven red beacons on the starboard hand.

A tide-gauge, showing the depth of water in the cutting, is placed on the outer pile marking the eastern side of the cutting.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 396, against 417 in August, a decrease of 21. The deaths in September were 197, an increase of 23 on the number in August. Of the total deaths, males contributed 102; females, 95. Forty-eight of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 24.37 per cent. of the whole number; 34 of these were under 1 year of age.

* It must be understood that the numbers of the population above given refer only to those within the several borough boundaries. To estimate the relative importance of the principal boroughs as centres of population it is necessary in each case to take into consideration the number of the population in the adjacent boroughs, some of which are included in the above table, and other districts which are practically suburbs of the central borough. This can only be done with any degree of accuracy for census years.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs :—

The births in September were 217, as against 228 in August, a decrease of 11.

The deaths amounted to 98, against 92 in August.

There were 20 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 4 males of 101, 89, 73, and 69 died at Auckland; 5 males of 80, 70, 69 (2), and 66, and 4 females of 82, 77, 72, and 65, at Wellington; 2 males of 68 and 65, and 1 female of 81, at Christchurch; and 4 females of 87, 83, 72, and 70 at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality from these diseases in September was again light for the group of four boroughs as a whole; but, of the 9 deaths, 6 occurred in Wellington, of which 2 were from scarlatina, 2 from typhoid fever, and 1 from diphtheria. No deaths from either of these causes occurred in the other boroughs.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases caused 24 deaths in September, an increase of 3 on the number in August. The number of deaths from phthisis was the same (10) in each month, but cancer caused the comparatively large number of 10 deaths in September, against 4 in August.

Local Diseases.—There was an increase in the number of deaths from these diseases, from 44 in August, to 50 in September. Diseases of the nervous system caused 4 more deaths than in the previous month; but there were only 6 deaths in September from diseases of the circulatory system, against 12 in August. Three more deaths occurred in September from diseases of the respiratory system; and there were 5 deaths from diseases of the reproductive system, including 2 deaths in childbirth in September, but not one in August.

Violent Deaths.—There were 3 violent deaths, of which 1 was by drowning, and 1 (suicidal) from poison.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition, and climatic influence of the season on health.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships is open to all Maoris that have regularly and continuously attended a Native school during the previous year, and are under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination; the other two scholarships are open to all Maoris that are under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination, and that have attended a Native village school regularly and continuously during the previous twelve months. These scholarships are offered for competition among Maori boys, on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Native Schools Code, 1886, and in the supplementary regulations that have been sent out to all teachers. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 15th and 16th December, 1890. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October next.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secretary for Education.
