A PROCLAMATION.

COLONY OF NEW ZEALAND,
TO WIT.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Prisons Act, 1882," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a prison; and from and after the gazetting of any such Proclamation, or from any time later specified in the Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed a prison:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the buildings at Milford Sound, in the Provincial District of Otago, and all enclosures used or occupied therewith, shall, from and after the publication of this Proclamation in the *Gazette*, be a prison within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Prisons Act, 1882."

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, hereby revoke so much of the said recited Proclamation as relates to the representation of the County of Stratford, and do hereby proclaim and declare that the number of members to be elected for each of the ridings of the said county shall be as follows: For the North Riding, two members; for the East Riding, two members; for the South Riding, two members; for the West Riding, two members; and for the Central Riding, one member.

Licensing Districts defined.

(L.S.) ONSLOW, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, alter and redefine the boundaries of the Licensing Districts of Avon, Lincoln, and Little River, which shall, from and after the first day of January next, be those described in the First Schedule hereto; and do hereby proclaim and define the part of the colony mentioned and described in the Second Schedule hereto to be, from and after the said first day of January, an ordinary licensing district for the purposes of the said Act.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fifth day of November, 1890.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS application has been made to the Governor in Council by Karo Hotene, successor to Katene Hotene, the Native owner of the lands described in the second column of the Schedule hereto, praying that the restrictions on the alienation of such lands contained in the Crown grant, bearing date the second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, described in the first column of the said Schedule, may be removed: And whereas inquiry has been duly made by the Native Land Court, and the said Court has reported that the provisions of the law in that behalf have been complied with: And whereas it appears expedient to grant such application:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by "The Native Land Act, 1888," and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that all restrictions imposed by the said Crown grant on the alienation of the said lands are hereby removed.

Audit of School Committees' Accounts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this second day of December, 1890.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Education Act, 1877," the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, doth hereby cancel and repeal sections three, four, and five of the regulations, under the heading "Audit of accounts," made by Order in Council dated the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto. And it is hereby declared that this Order in Council, and the regulations hereby made, shall come into force on the fourth day of December instant.

SCHEDULE.

3. The Board of each Education District shall, in the month of March in every year, appoint an Auditor or Auditors to audit the accounts of the School Committees within the district, and shall in the same month notify to each School Committee the name of the Auditor who is appointed to audit the accounts of such Committee for the year in which such appointment is made.

4. Every School Committee shall, not later than the fifth day of April in every year, make up the accounts of the school district for the year or period ending the thirty-first day of March previous, and shall immediately thereafter submit the same to an Auditor appointed by the Board of the Education District within which the school or schools under the jurisdiction of the Committee are situated.

5. The Auditor appointed to audit the accounts of any School Committee shall have access to all the books and accounts of the Committee and of its officers, and shall examine the general statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Committee, and compare the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto, and shall either certify under his hand that he has found the same to be correct, duly vouched, and in accordance with law, or specially report to the Education Board of the district in what respect he finds it otherwise.

In the District High School at Hokitika the fees for higher education within the meaning of section 56 of "The Education Act, 1877," shall be £8 per annum, payable quarterly.

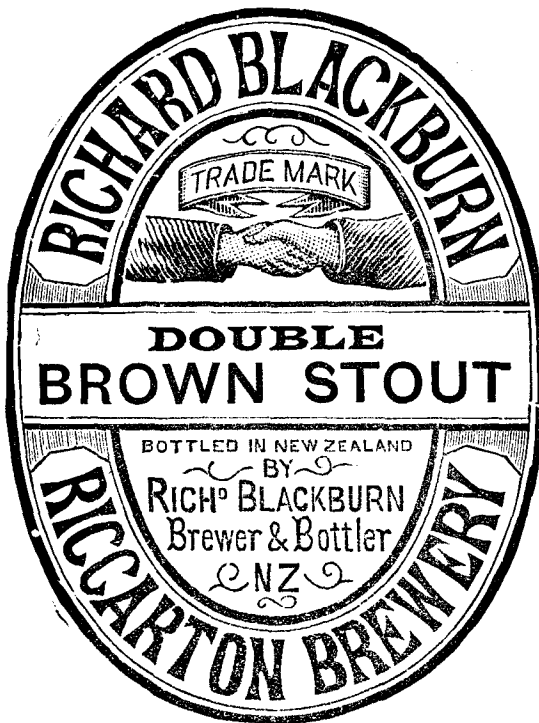

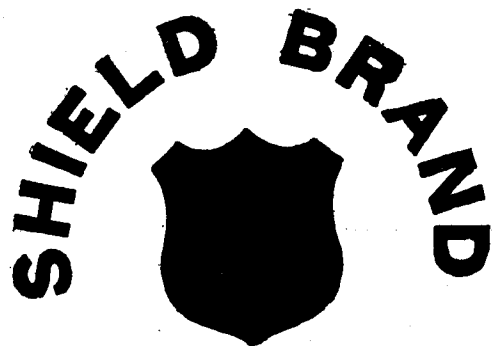
