"The Railways Construction and Land Act, 1890."—Authorising the taking of Additional Land for the Wellington and Manawatu Railway.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this tenth day of December, 1890.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the second section of "The Railways Construction and Land Act, 1890," it is enacted that, when a company formed under the provisions of "The Railways Construction and Land Act, 1881" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), has already constructed, or shall hereafter construct, or be engaged in constructing, a railway under contract made and entered into pursuant to the said Act, and it is proved to the satisfaction of the Governor that it is necessary or desirable, for the use, convenience, or enjoyment of such railway, to take any land, in addition to land previously taken for the purposes of such railway, the Governor may, by Order in Council, authorise the company to take any such land in the like manner as is provided by the said Act for taking land: And whereas the Wellington and Manawatu Railway Company (Limited) is a company formed under the provisions of the said Act, and has constructed a railway under contract entered into pursuant thereto: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Governor that it is desirable, for the use, convenience, and enjoyment of the said railway, to take the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto, in addition to the land previously taken for the purposes of such railway:

Now, therefore, His Excellency, the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority conferred by "The Railways Construction and Land Act, 1890," and the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorise the Wellington and Manawatu Railway Company (Limited) to take the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of the said railway, in the like manner as is provided by "The Railways Construction and Land Act, 1881," for taking land.

Terms and Conditions of the Sale or Selection of a Village Settlement in Hawke's Bay.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixteenth day of December, 1890.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-seventh section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation issued under the provisions of section one hundred and sixty-six of the said Act and the fourteenth section of "The Land Acts Amendment Act, 1888," set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, by this present order, fix the following as the terms and conditions upon which the village settlement enumerated in the First and Second Schedules hereto shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The day upon which the lands shall be open for sale or selection shall be Wednesday, the twenty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

2. The lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto shall be open as village allotments, and the lands mentioned in the Second Schedule shall be open as small-farm allotments, for sale or selection either for cash, or on deferred payments, or on perpetual lease.

3. The purchaser for cash of any of the lands enumerated in the First or Second Schedules hereto must deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district one-fifth of the purchase-money at the time of application, and shall pay the whole remainder of the purchase-money within thirty days of the granting of his application; and if not paid within thirty days his deposit shall be forfeited, and the lands shall be again open for sale or occupation forthwith; and upon full payment of the purchase-money he will be entitled to a Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way.

4. If any of the lands enumerated in the First or Second Schedules hereto are selected upon deferred payments, the selector shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1885."

5. If any of the lands enumerated in the First or Second Schedules hereto are selected under the perpetual-leasing system, the selector shall be subject to the provisions of Part IV. of "The Land Act, 1885."

6. No person shall be allowed to apply for or select more than one allotment.

7. The prices stated in the First and Second Schedules hereto shall be the prices at which the lands shall be open

for sale for cash, or selection on deferred payments, or on perpetual lease.

8. If there shall be more than one application on the same day for any village allotment in the First Schedule the right to occupy the same shall be determined by auction amongst the applicants only; and if there should be more than one application for any small-farm allotment in the Second Schedule the right to occupy the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

9. Each applicant for a deferred-payment section will be required to make the declaration prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto, and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district one-tenth of the price of the allotment (such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee for the six months due on the next first day of January or July following the date of the license, as the case may be); and, upon fulfilment of the terms and conditions prescribed by the said Act relating to land on deferred payments, will be entitled to the Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way.

10. Each applicant for any of the allotments on perpetual leasing will be required to make the declaration prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and to deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district a sum equal to one half-year's rent of the allotment included in the application, and such payment shall be in discharge of the half-year's rent due on the first day of January or July which shall first ensue after the commencement of the term, together with the sum of thirty shillings for the lease and registration thereof.

11. Each applicant for a section for cash will be required to make a statutory declaration that he is applying for the land solely for his own use and benefit, and not for the use and benefit of any other person or persons whomsoever.

HEATHCOTE ROAD BOARD.—A By-law to prevent Nuisances, Obstructions, and Damage in Public or Private Roads or Streets and in Public Thoroughfares or Places in the Heathcote Road District.

WHEREAS under section 126 of "The Road Boards Act, 1882," Road Boards are empowered to make by-laws for the good government of road districts: Notice is hereby given that the following by-law will come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1891:—

Interpretation.

Words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number, and words importing the plural number shall include the singular number, and the word person shall include both males and females.

Definition of barbed wire.

For the purpose of this by-law barbed wire shall be taken to include wire manufactured of any material and of any size or shape, and after any design, having attached thereto

spikes, barbs, or needles, or having sharp-edged or sharp-pointed material attached thereto.

Barbed wire in fences prohibited.

1. No owner, tenant, or occupier of, or other person having an interest in, land immediately adjacent to a public or private road or street, or public thoroughfare, or public place in the said road district shall erect, cause to be erected, or allow to stand, and notwithstanding the same may have been erected prior to the coming into force of this by-law, a barbed-wire fence, or a fence in which barbed wire is used to serve as a dividing-fence between such his land and any such public or private road or street, or public thoroughfare, or public place.

Penalty for breach of by-laws.

2. Every person guilty of any breach of, or any offence under this by-law, shall be liable for such offence to any penalty not exceeding £5 as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit; and, in every case where such offence shall be a continuing one, to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be continued.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 422, against 474 in October, a decrease of 52. The deaths in November were 140, a decrease of 24 on the number in October. Of the total deaths, males contributed 67; females, 73. Thirty-seven of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 26.43 per cent. of the whole number; 32 of these were under 1 year of age.

* It must be understood that the numbers of the population above given refer only to those within the several borough boundaries. To estimate the relative importance of the principal boroughs as centres of population it is necessary in each case to take into consideration the number of the population in the adjacent boroughs, some of which are included in the above table, and other districts which are practically suburbs of the central borough. This can only be done with any degree of accuracy for census years.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—

The births in November were 221, against 257 in October, a decrease of 36.

The deaths amounted to 76, against 97 in October.

There were 8 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 3 females of 77, 73, and 70 died at Auckland; a female of 78 at Christchurch; 3 males of 86 (2) and 65, and a female of 81, at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—1 death was registered in November as having occurred from disease in this class. Only once before—in September, 1889—has there been such a record, but the death in that month was from enteric fever, a miasmatic disease, while not one death occurred from any miasmatic disease in November. In this respect the record is unparalleled, the one death last month having been from syphilis.

Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality from these diseases was somewhat less in November than in October—21 deaths, against 24. The deaths from cancer were only 4 in November, against 10 in the previous month. Those from phthisis were the same—10—in each month. Three deaths were attributed to gout in November.

Local Diseases.—These diseases caused 40 deaths in November, against 50 in October. Of these, nervous diseases contributed only 7 deaths in the last, against 14 in the month preceding. There was in November a slight increase in the number of deaths from diseases of the circulatory system—from 6 to 9. Diseases of the respiratory system were equally fatal in each month, with 14 deaths; but there was a decrease in the number of deaths from diseases of the digestive system from 9 to 5.

Violent Deaths.—Four deaths were so recorded, of which one was suicidal, by the use of poison.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal

specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
