WHEREAS by section four of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1887" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively, shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the control and management of the bridge described in the Schedule hereto should be vested in the manner hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and known as Davey's Road Bridge, shall, from and after the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Maungaatua Road Board; and I do hereby fix and determine that the Maungaatua Road Board shall itself provide out of its own funds one-half of the actual cost of managing and maintaining the said bridge; and that the Woodville Road Board shall, on demand in writing from the said Maungaatua Road Board, pay to the said Board from time to time one-half of the actual cost of managing and maintaining the said bridge. the said bridge.


