Regulations under "The Post and Telegraph Classification and Regulation Act, 1890."

ON SLOW, Governor.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of January, 1891.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the fifth section of "The Post and Telegraph Classification and Regulation Act, 1890," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS ABOVE REFERRED TO.
Interpretation.

1. In these regulations, unless repugnant to the context,—

"Department" includes the Post Office Department as constituted under "The Post Office Act, 1881," and the Electric Telegraph Department as constituted under "The Electric Lines Act, 1884."

"Minister" means the member of the Executive Council for the time being holding the office of Postmaster-General under the provisions of "The Post Office Act, 1881," and includes the person holding the office of Electric Telegraph Commissioner under "The Electric Lines Act, 1884," if and so long as such office is held by a member of the Executive Council."

"Superintendent" means the Superintendent of Electric Lines, for the time being, appointed under "The Electric Lines Act, 1884."

"Secretary" means the Secretary for the time being of the Postal and Telegraph Department.

2. These regulations shall commence and take effect on the first day of March, 1891.

3. Every person who desires to enter the service of the department shall make application in his own handwriting, signed by him, and shall transmit therewith the certificates and information required by these regulations. He shall also indicate which branch of the department he desires to enter.

Forms of application may be obtained at any post office or telegraph office in the colony.

CLERICAL DIVISION.

Junior Examination.

4. No person shall be entitled to enter this division of the department unless he has passed an examination before the proper authority in the subjects prescribed for the time being for the Sixth Standard in a public school under the control of an Education Board constituted under "The Education Act, 1877."

5. The times and places at which examinations are held, in accordance with regulations for the time being in force under "The Education Act, 1877," at which candidates may pass the said Sixth Standard shall be the times and places prescribed for the examination of candidates for entry into the Clerical Division under these regulations; and the subjects of examination for such Sixth Standard as aforesaid shall be the subjects of examination for such candidates. Such examination shall be termed "the junior examination."

6. Every person entering the Clerical Division shall enter as a cadet, and shall be of the full age of sixteen years and not more than twenty years, shall be subject to the probation herein directed, and shall be conditionally appointed at the minimum salary allotted to cadets.

7. Every person making application for admission to the Clerical Division shall transmit the following evidence as to his fitness and capacity:—

- (1.) A duly-authenticated certificate or extract from some official registry or other authentic evidence as to his age;
- (2.) A certificate from some minister of religion, public school teacher, or Justice of the Peace as to the moral character of the applicant;
- (3.) A certificate from a medical practitioner setting forth

that the applicant is in good health and free from any bodily infirmity; and

- (4.) A certificate from the proper authority to the effect that such applicant has duly passed the junior examination hereinbefore mentioned.

8. The names of applicants shall be entered in a register kept by the Secretary at the General Post Office; and such names shall be kept on the register until appointments have been made, or until such persons have attained the age of twenty years, or had their names removed at their own request, as the case may be.

9. Appointments of cadets to the Clerical Division shall be made only from the persons whose names are so registered, and in the order of registration, taking the name first registered and following in regular sequence.

10. Every cadet receiving an appointment shall be conditionally appointed upon probation; and at the expiration of three months from the date of such appointment, if the Superintendent or Secretary shall certify as to his fitness and capacity, and recommend him in writing as a suitable person to become an officer of the department, the Governor may make such appointment absolute; and if the probationer shall not have complied with these regulations his appointment shall lapse.

11. The Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister, during the period of probation, may at any time dismiss any cadet from the department for any reason which may be deemed sufficient.

Senior Examination.

12. No person shall be eligible for promotion in the Clerical Division to any class higher than the fifth class unless he has passed a further examination, to be called "the senior examination," in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

13. The senior examination shall be the examination known as the "senior Civil Service examination" held under the provisions of "The Civil Service Reform Act, 1886," and the times and places fixed for such examination from time to time, and the subjects prescribed for the same, shall be respectively deemed to be prescribed for the senior examination required by these regulations.

14. An officer shall be deemed to have passed the senior examination if he—

- (1.) Has passed the examination for the time being prescribed for the matriculation of students in the New Zealand University;
- (2.) Has obtained a junior or senior scholarship in the said University;
- (3.) Has passed the matriculation examination or any other examination in any public university in the United Kingdom or any of the Australian Colonies, which is at least equal to that required to be passed on matriculation in the New Zealand University, and as may be determined by regulations;
- (4.) Has obtained a degree in any such university or in the New Zealand University.

15. A register of persons who have passed or are deemed to have passed such senior examination shall be kept by the Secretary, and their names shall be entered therein upon application by the persons who have so passed such examination, and every such application shall be accompanied by documentary proof thereof, and entry made in the order of application.

NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.

16. No person shall be eligible for appointment in the Non-clerical Division who is over thirty-five years of age, and until he has produced to the Superintendent or Secretary certificates of good health and good moral character, in the same manner and to the like effect as required from persons entering the Clerical Division, and also of having passed such examination as hereinafter mentioned, or is expressly exempt from such examination.

Applications for appointment in this division shall be made to the Superintendent or Secretary, and applicants shall produce the requisite evidence that they possess the qualifications necessary for the work of the office.

17. The subjects of examination for persons seeking appointment in the Non-clerical Division shall be,—

One-half the maximum number of marks will qualify for appointment.

18. Examinations shall be conducted by the District Inspectors and Sub-Inspectors of Telegraphs, the Inspector and Assistant Inspector of Post Offices, together with such other officers as may from time to time be appointed by the Minister; or the Minister may in any case appoint any of such officers to conduct all examinations or any such examination under this regulation. Twenty-one days' notice must be given to the Superintendent or Secretary by any applicant of his desire to be examined; and the Superintendent or Secretary, by letter addressed to the applicant, shall fix the date, time, and place where such examination shall be held.

19. Females will be admitted as cadettes, but they will be appointed only to such vacancies as are suitable to females. They will be required to produce the certificates prescribed for cadets in the Clerical Division. The age for admission for females is between sixteen and twenty-five years. Married women are not eligible for appointment, and females must resign when they marry.

20. Where any candidate for employment in this division has already passed an examination which, in the opinion of the Minister, is at least equal to that which he would be required to pass under these regulations, it shall not be necessary for him to pass any further examination.

21. Appointments in the Non-clerical Division shall be made in the following manner:—

- (1.) The person whose name stands first in order on the register of the class for which he is registered shall be offered the appointment, and so on in order according to the number of appointments required in such class, unless it shall appear to the Superintendent or Secretary that the person whose name stands first on the register is for any reason unfitted for the appointment, in which case he may recommend the person next in order that is so fitted.
- (2.) Appointments shall be made by the Governor on the recommendation of the Minister, except in the case of telegraph message-boys, distributors, and night-watchmen, which shall be made by the Secretary.
- (3.) If a person to whom an appointment is offered declines to accept the same it shall be offered to the person whose name stands next on the register of the class, and so on till the appointment is made.

22. Officers in the Non-clerical Division, telegraph message-boys, and distributors shall be eligible for employment, on promotion, in the Clerical Division; but in any such case the provisions applicable in respect of examinations in such division, or the equivalent thereof, shall extend and apply to such officers, message-boys, and distributors.

TELEGRAPH MESSAGE-BOYS.

23. Telegraph message-boys must be not less than twelve and not more than fifteen years of age. They must have passed the Fourth Standard of a school constituted under "The Education Act, 1877," in accordance with the regulations in that behalf for the time being in force thereunder, and produce certificates in writing of sound bodily health and good moral character. The boys will be eligible for promotion to any other branch of the Non-clerical Division for which they may be qualified.

Any telegraph message-boy who may have been in receipt of the maximum pay of his position for two years, and who cannot qualify for promotion to another class in the Non-clerical Division or for a cadetship, will be required to resign.

In the event of a greater number of such boys qualifying for promotion than the department can absorb at the time, they will be placed in a supernumerary class, and receive £5 increases yearly until the pay reaches £56, or until they can be promoted.

GENERAL.

24. A record of all officers in the department shall be kept by the Secretary, showing therein the divisions in which such officers are respectively included, in accordance with the terms of "The Post and Telegraph Classification and Regulation Act, 1890," with the particulars hereinafter required:—

- (1.) With regard to the First Division and the Non-clerical Division, shall state therein a general description of the several duties of the officers included in those divisions, their date of birth, length of service, salaries, and such other particulars as may be deemed necessary;
- (2.) With regard to the Clerical Division, shall state therein with respect to the officers therein included, in addition to the information as aforesaid, the nature of the work severally performed by such persons;
- (3.) From time to time shall cause entries to be made in such records of death, dismissals, resignations, promotions, and reductions;
- (4.) In the month of January in each and every year shall publish a list of officers then employed, and the particulars with regard to such persons recorded

as aforesaid, which said list shall be called "The Post and Telegraph Departmental List," and shall be *prima facie* evidence of the several particulars therein set forth.

- (5.) Every such list shall be laid before both Houses of the General Assembly within ten days after the commencement of the first session of such Assembly held next after the said month of January.

25. Where any officer whose name appears in any such list thinks that he has been placed in a class lower than that in which, from the nature of the services he performs, he ought to have been placed, he may within one month from the date of the commencement of these regulations appeal to the Minister, and, if such appeal appears to the Minister to be reasonable, he shall appoint three or more competent persons to report thereon, and the Minister may confirm, alter, or amend the said list, which, as confirmed, altered, or amended, shall be final.

Any officer who desires to appeal shall make application in writing addressed to the Minister, and stating therein in specific terms his reasons for such appeal, and every such application shall be transmitted to the Superintendent or Secretary.

26. No annual or other increment shall accrue to any salary until the officer in receipt of such salary has received the same for a full period of twelve calendar months, except in case of promotion, when the increment shall take effect from the day on which such promotion takes effect.

But the right to receive such increment in any year shall depend upon the good and diligent conduct of the officer to whose salary such increment is attached, and a certificate thereof to be given by the Superintendent or Secretary; and if, in the opinion of the Superintendent or Secretary, the officer is not entitled thereto, he may issue an order to deprive such officer of such increment, which shall in that case not be paid: Provided that an appeal from the decision of the Superintendent or Secretary shall lie to the Minister, and his determination thereon shall be final.

27. If, on the commencement of these regulations, any officer is in receipt of a greater salary than the maximum of the class assigned to his work, he shall be transferred as soon as may be convenient to some other branch of the department in which he can be employed upon duties equivalent to the amount of his salary; if the officer be found unfit for such transference, his salary shall be reduced to the maximum of the class to which his work has been assigned.

28. Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, any officer may be transferred from one branch of the department to the other, and required to perform any and every duty assigned to any officer in a class, or any grade in such class.

29. No person who has held office in the department or in any other branch of the Civil Service of the colony for a period of at least ten years before the passing of "The Post and Telegraph Classification and Regulation Act, 1890," and no officer employed in the department who has previously passed the senior Civil Service examination prescribed under "The Civil Service Act, 1866," or "The Civil Service Reform Act, 1886," shall be required to pass any further examination for promotion to the higher classes in any division.

VACANCIES.

30. When a vacancy occurs in the First Division which it is expedient to fill, the Minister shall present to the Governor a list comprising not less than three of the senior officers of the department; and the Governor, after due consideration of the seniority, merit, and suitability of such officers, and of the special qualifications and aptitude requisite for the discharge of the duties of the office to be filled, may appoint to the vacancy; and, in case the Minister shall think there is no officer suitable to fill the vacancy, he may report accordingly, and the Governor shall thereupon act as he shall think fit.

Any vacancy occasioned by the filling-up of the first vacancy shall be filled in like manner.

31. Vacancies in the several classes of the Clerical Division shall be filled in the following manner:—

- (1.) In the first class, the three senior officers of the second class shall be nominated by the Minister as being eligible to fill such vacancy, and the Superintendent or Secretary shall select from these the person he deems best qualified to fill such vacancy; and the Minister shall recommend the officer so selected for appointment accordingly.
- (2.) In any class other than the first class, the senior officers of the class next below that in which the vacancy occurs shall be eligible to fill such vacancy; and, if there are more than three of such officers, their number shall be reduced to three by lot, and from these three the Superintendent or Secretary shall select the officer whom he deems best qualified to fill the vacancy.

- (3.) If it shall be found that no officer in the class next below that in which the vacancy occurs is eligible for promotion to the vacancy by reason of merit and suitability, then such vacancy shall be filled up from any class in such division in which a person qualified by merit and suitability can be found.

(4.) In all cases provided for in this clause the Minister shall certify that the officer selected is entitled to the vacant office by seniority, merit, and suitability, or that the case is one within the last-preceding subsection; and, upon such certificate, the Governor may, subject to the provisions of these regulations, appoint the officer so certified to the vacant office.

- (5.) An officer so promoted shall receive the minimum salary of the class to which he is so promoted.

32. With the object of ascertaining the fitness of officers to fill vacancies in the Clerical Division below the first class, they may be examined in such technical and departmental subjects as are deemed by the Minister essential for the vacant positions, at such times and places and in such manner as may from time to time be determined by the Minister.

One month's notice of the intention to hold such examinations shall be given by notice published in the departmental Monthly Circular, and the names of officers who have passed the required standard of examination shall be entered by the Secretary in a book kept for that purpose, in the order of their merit; and in promoting any officers to vacancies, or from one class or grade to another, effect shall, as far as possible, be given to the results of such examinations. When the vacancy occurs in a branch in which knowledge of theory or practice in electric science, or relating to the Telegraph branch, is requisite, such examination shall be conducted by the District Inspectors and Sub-inspectors of Telegraphs, and such other officers as may from time to time be appointed by the Minister; and, where knowledge of or capacity in business relating to the Post Office branch is required, the examination shall be held by the Inspector of Post Offices, or the Assistant Inspector of Post Offices, and such other officer or officers as the Minister may from time to time appoint; or the Minister may appoint any of such officers to conduct all examinations or any such examination under this regulation.

33. When a vacancy occurs in a higher class in the Non-clerical Division,—

- (1.) The Minister shall select for appointment the three senior officers of the class next below that in which the vacancy has occurred as their names appear on the register of the class affected, and from such one of these as appears to be most suitable the Governor may appoint to the vacancy.
- (2.) If the vacancy occurs in the lowest class of the division, the appointment to the vacancy shall be made in the manner hereinbefore provided as to first appointments in the Non-clerical Division.
- (3.) If there are more vacancies than one to be filled, the like proceedings shall be had and taken as are hereinbefore provided.

34. Nothing in these regulations shall be deemed to give any officer a right or claim to promotion to any vacant office, and vacancies shall only be filled if the Governor thinks it expedient to fill the same, and without detriment to the efficiency of the department.

35. For the purpose of providing for the compensation to be paid to officers of the department appointed on or after the passing of "The Post and Telegraph Classification and Regulation Act, 1890," the following provisions shall have effect:—

- (1.) Out of the salary of every such officer there shall be deducted the sum of five pounds per centum per annum, which said sum, with all interest which may accrue thereon, shall be paid into a separate fund to the Public Trustee, to be invested at interest on such security as the Public Trust Office shall approve.
- (2.) The Public Trustee may invest the same along with other sums, but a separate account shall be kept for the amount paid to the credit of each such officer, and no sums to the credit of any officer shall be charged with or attached for debt under the process of any Court, or be deemed an asset in the event of his bankruptcy.
- (3.) On such officer ceasing to be in the department, from whatever cause, except the commission of a crime, the amount to his credit in the Public Trust Office shall be paid to him; or, in case of his or her death, the amount shall be paid in manner as may be directed by his or her will, and, in the absence of such will, then according to the law for the time being in force regulating the distribution of the estates of persons dying intestate.
- (4.) In case any such officer shall be dismissed from or cease to be in the department on account of the

commission of a crime, the amount to the credit of such officer may, after paying to the Public Account any defalcations he or she may have made, be paid to his or her legal representative, in such manner and at such time as the Minister may determine.

TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT.

36. The Secretary shall from time to time cause to be enrolled in a register the names of fit and proper persons desirous of employment in any temporary work in the department, and shall also record the kind of work either clerical or non-clerical desired by each of such persons.

37. Whenever, in the opinion of the Superintendent or Secretary, temporary assistance of any kind is required, he may nominate any person whose name stands recorded on such register to perform such temporary work if such person be available and willing to be nominated, the persons to be taken in the order in which they are recorded according to the class of work; such nomination to be subject to the approval of the Minister, who may at any time remove any such person.

38. No such person shall be nominated for a longer period than three months at any one time. But this provision shall not apply to persons who may have been temporarily employed prior to the 1st January, 1891.

OVERTIME.

39. The regulations affecting the payment of overtime shall be amended as follows:—

Officers of the Postal branch when required on duty between the hours of 10 p.m. and 5 a.m., and on Sundays and on statute holidays, for the purpose of sorting English or other heavy mails, and for Sunday attendance at the circulation branch of the General Post Office, Wellington, during the sittings of Parliament, shall be paid overtime at the rate of 6d. per hour for every £50 of salary or fractional part of £50, with a minimum of 1s. 6d., and a maximum of 8s. per hour.

40. No overtime allowance will be made to officers of either branch of the service unless the extra attendance exceeds twenty minutes. Attendance up to forty-five minutes to count as half an hour; over forty-five minutes, one hour. Claims for overtime at the rates already in force in respect of the Telegraph branch must be rendered at the end of each fortnightly period, and for the Postal branch immediately after the service has been performed.

41. No payment for overtime for services other than what is provided for by regulations shall be allowed, except in cases of extraordinary or exceptional attendance, and then only when specially approved by the Minister.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.—HOLIDAYS.

42. The Superintendent or Secretary may, at such times as may be convenient, grant to every officer in the Clerical Division leave of absence for recreation on the following scale:—

- (1.) Where an officer has served for fifteen years or upwards, not exceeding four weeks in each year;

- (2.) Where he has served less than fifteen years and more than ten years, not exceeding three weeks in each year;

- (3.) Where he has served less than ten years, then not exceeding two weeks in each year.

43. Officers in the Non-clerical Division may receive two weeks' leave in each year. Telegraph message-boys, distributors, and night-watchmen may be given a week's leave in each year after one year's complete service.

No officer shall be entitled to claim such leave as a right; and, if for any cause the Superintendent or Secretary thinks such leave ought not to be granted, he may refuse the same in any case.

In cases of illness or other pressing necessity the Minister may grant to any officer such extended leave, not exceeding twelve months, and on such terms as he thinks fit.

44. The Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, grant to any officer in the department of at least ten years' continuous service twelve months' leave of absence, and to any officer of lesser period of service any time not exceeding six months' leave of absence, on half salary.

During such period of absence no officer shall be entitled to receive any annual increment.

45. The following days in each year shall be observed as holidays:—

- (1.) New-year's Day, Christmas Day and the following day, Good Friday, and the birthdays of Her Majesty and of the Prince of Wales;
- (2.) Whenever any of such days falls upon a Sunday, the next following Monday shall be a holiday in lieu of such day.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Minister from requiring the services of any officers during any such holiday in case of emergency, but in that case such officers shall be entitled in lieu thereof to a holiday upon such other occasion as shall not interfere with public business, and in such case no overtime shall be payable.

46. Where it has been decided to dispense with the services of any officer, he shall not be entitled to any leave of absence, either at the time or in contemplation of his services being so dispensed with; nor shall any officer who retires from the Service upon a superannuation allowance be granted more than three months' leave of absence immediately prior to or in contemplation of such retirement, except in case of physical or mental infirmity, when the Governor may grant such further leave as the circumstances justify.

47. If any officer is allowed to use or occupy for the purpose of residence any house or building belonging to Her Majesty, he shall, unless the Minister otherwise directs, pay rent for the same, and the amount of such rent shall from time to time as it becomes due be deducted from the officer's salary as such salary becomes payable, or in such other manner as the Minister determines.
