*Chatham Islands excluded from Operation of Dog Registration Act.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Dog Registration Act, 1880," it is among other things enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation exclude any portion of the colony from the operation of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that the portion of the colony hereinafter mentioned should be excluded from the operation of the said Act:

Now therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Dog Registration Act, 1880," do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the colony known as the Chatham Islands, including all the islands forming the group usually so named, shall be and the same is hereby excluded from the operation of the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I do hereby declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of May next.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and fifty-fourth section of "The Mining Act, 1886" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor in Council

may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the Gazette, proclaim and declare that any watercourse shall be a watercourse into which tailings, mining débris, and waste water of any kind used in, upon, or discharged from any claim or licensed holding shall be suffered to flow or be discharged:

And whereas not less than ninety days' notice has been published, in the manner provided by the said section, that application has been made to the Governor to proclaim the watercourse hereinafter mentioned and its tributaries to be watercourses for the purposes of the said section mentioned:

And whereas no objection to the issue of this Proclamation has been transmitted to the Governor, and His Excellency has decided to exercise the powers conferred upon him by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby proclaim and declare that the Marewhenua River and its tributaries, in the Provincial District of Otago, shall be watercourses into which tailings, mining débris, and waste water of every kind used in, upon, or discharged from any claim or licensed holding adjacent to such watercourse shall be suffered to flow or be discharged; and, with the like advice and consent, His Excellency doth hereby prescribe that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

*Declaring the Pukearuhe and Mokau Road, in Clifton County, to be a County Road.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this eleventh day of February, 1891.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order that the road in the Clifton County known as the Pukearuhe to Mokau Road, described in the Schedule below, shall, on and after the date above mentioned, become a county road.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the County of Clifton, in the Provincial District of Taranaki, being the road known as Pukearuhe-Mokau Road; commencing at the south-western boundary of Pukearuhe Township, and proceeding in a north-easterly direction to the Mokau River; including the ferry across the Mokau River: as the said road is delineated on the plan marked S.G. 10738, deposited in the General Survey Office, at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and thereon marked in red.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS application has been made to the Governor in Council by Rawinia te Munu (and as Trustee for Te Mutu), the Native owner of the land described in the second column of the Schedule hereto, praying that the restrictions on the alienation of such land contained in the Land Transfer certificate, bearing date the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, described in the first column of the said Schedule, may be removed: And whereas inquiry has been duly made by the Native Land Court in respect of the subject-matter of the said application, and the said Court has reported thereon to His Excellency the Governor: And whereas it appears expedient to grant such application:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by "The Native Land Act, 1888," and acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that all restrictions imposed by the said Land Transfer certificate on the alienation of the said lands are hereby removed.

*Prescribing a Close Season for Fish in the Teremakau River and Wylde's Creek.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of February, 1891.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations (which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein) for prescribing, among other things, a close season for fish:

And whereas it is expedient to make the regulations hereinafter set forth with respect to fish inhabiting or found in the waters of the Teremakau River and Wylde's Creek, in the Counties of Grey and Westland:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Right Honourable William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and with the like advice and consent doth order that such regulations shall take effect on and after the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, and shall have force and effect in the Teremakau River and Wylde's Creek and the immediate tributaries thereof only.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

1. THE part of the month of March from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette* until the end of the said month, and the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November, and December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, are hereby prescribed a close season for fish.

2. Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £50.

3. Every penalty imposed by these regulations may be recovered in a summary manner before any two or more Justices of the Peace.

*Amended Regulations for the Formation of Farm Homestead Associations.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of February, 1891.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-third section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for fixing the terms and conditions upon

which the lands in any special settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the regulations which were made by Order in Council issued on the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and to make new regulations for the formation of farm homestead special-settlement associations:—

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby revoke the Order in Council of the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and do hereby fix the following terms and conditions as those upon which farm homestead special-settlement association blocks shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. Any association of persons of not less than twenty-five, who may be desirous of settling on Crown lands adjacent to each other may arrange with the Government for a block of land on the following general conditions:—

2. In the construction of these regulations, unless the context shall otherwise require, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—

“Association” shall mean the Farm Homestead Association:

“Land” shall mean any block of land set apart for a special settlement to be dealt with under these regulations:

“Settler” shall mean any member of the association or other person, not being a married woman, leasing land under these regulations:

“Receiver of Land Revenue” shall mean Receiver of Land Revenue at \_\_\_\_\_, or other officer for the time being acting as such:

“Minister” shall mean the Minister of Lands for the time being, or any member of the Executive acting for him:

“Commissioner” means the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the land district:

“Secretary” shall mean the secretary of the association for the time being, and shall include any person acting in that capacity, and if there shall be no secretary, then the chairman of the association:

“Substantial improvements of a permanent character” shall mean and include reclamation from swamps, clearing of bush or scrub, cultivation, planting with trees or live hedges, the laying-out and cultivating of gardens, fencing, draining, making road, sinking wells or water-tanks, constructing water-races, in any way improving the character or fertility of the soil, or the erection of any building:

“Cultivation” shall mean—

(1.) Fencing the land with timber or other durable materials, not being a brush fence; or

(2.) Breaking up and laying down the same in English or other cultivated grass; or

(3.) Breaking up and planting or sowing root or other crops therein; and, in case of bush-lands, the felling and clearing of timber and sowing of grass:

“Lease” shall mean a lease with perpetual right of renewal in terms of Part IV. of “The Land Act, 1885,” but with no right to the settler to acquire the freehold of the land, as provided by section 150 of the said Act.

3. Any block of land to be selected under these regulations shall contain not less than 5,000 acres nor more than 11,000 acres, inclusive of roads, townships, and all other reserves; and it will be surveyed into areas not exceeding 320 acres or thereabouts: Provided that the number of persons located in each block shall not be less than one person for every 200 acres of its total area.

4. All surveys shall be conducted by the Survey Department.

The cost of survey and roading, not exceeding 2s. 6d. per acre, shall be paid for by the secretary in, say, four instalments, three months to elapse between each payment. The first payment shall be made when the association has agreed to take a special block.

5. Such portions of the land as may be required for any of the purposes enumerated in section 227, Part IX., of “The Land Act, 1885,” or as a site for a township, as shall be approved by the Minister, shall not be open for allotment under these regulations.

6. The allotments of sections to members of the association shall be made at such time and in such manner as the association may, with the consent of the Commissioner, determine.

7. The land shall be disposed of at such rental as may be arranged between the Minister and the association, being 5 per cent. on a capital value of not less than £1 an acre.

(a.) It shall not be necessary, however, for any settler to pay any rent for the first two years from the date of allotment of his section. After the expiration of the said period of two years the rent shall be at the rate of 5 per cent. on the capital value of the land, as fixed by Regulation No. 7, payable half-yearly, on the 1st day of June and July in each year. The unpaid two years' rent may be added to the capital value of the land, and thereafter the rent shall be payable on such increased capital value; or the settler may pay off the arrears of rent at any time.

8. One-third of the rents paid from time to time shall, for the first fifteen years, be paid to the local body of the district, or the association, for the expenditure on roads in or leading to the block.

9. All the moneys required to be paid for the land under these terms and conditions shall be paid to the Receiver of Land Revenue, and receipts given by him shall be sufficient discharges for the payment of the moneys therein respectively acknowledged to have been received.

10. Each settler must within six months from the date of allotment of his section reside upon the land: Provided that in bush-land residence need not commence within two years from the date of allotment, so long as the improvements required under Regulation 14 are made within the two years.

11. The settlers shall be members of the association, and shall not be under seventeen years of age.

12. The secretary shall inform the Commissioner of the names of the settlers, and also furnish the Commissioner with minutes of proceedings of the association if so required.

13. A certificate signed by the secretary of the association shall be sufficient evidence that the person claiming to select land is a member thereof.

14. Each settler shall, within two years from the date of his selection, bring into cultivation not less than one-tenth of the land selected by him.

Each settler shall, within four years from the date of his selection, bring into cultivation not less than one-fifth of the land selected by him.

Each settler shall, within six years of the date of his selection, in addition to the cultivation of one-fifth of the land, have put substantial improvements of a permanent character on the land to the value of £1 for every acre of his holding.

15. In the event of the death of a settler, his interest in the allotment will revert to his legal representatives, who may dispose of it to a *bonâ fide* settler approved by the Commissioner; and the purchaser shall be deemed to stand in the position of the original settler.

16. Should any settler be compelled to leave the district, it shall be competent for the Commissioner to permit such settler to transfer his rights, title, and interest in the land selected to another *bonâ fide* settler, who shall be deemed to occupy the position of the original occupant: Provided always that no settler shall be allowed to hold more than 320 acres under these regulations.

17. No person who is a holder of land on deferred payments, or who has acquired any freehold under that system, or who is the holder of land on perpetual lease, and no person who is the owner of a pre-emptive right, or who is the owner in fee of any land in New Zealand, which together with the land included in his application or transfer under these regulations would exceed 320 acres, and no person who has made an arrangement or agreement to permit any one, save his son or daughter, to acquire by purchase or otherwise the allotment in respect of which his application is made, shall be entitled to become a settler under these regulations.

18. Any settler who shall fail to comply with these regulations in any respect shall, upon sufficient proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, forfeit his interest in the land selected, and the Commissioner shall cause such interest to be sold by public auction to a *bonâ fide* settler; and these conditions shall be sufficient authority for such forfeiture and reallocation. Any settler so purchasing shall be deemed to stand in the position of the original settler.

19. The association may make such rules and regulations from time to time as it may deem necessary, subject to the approval of the Commissioner.

20. In case any doubt shall arise as to the construction of these terms and conditions, with reference to the selection and occupation or clearing of any land, or otherwise arising thereunder, the same shall be settled by the Commissioner.

The following rules are suggested for the guidance of associations:—

1. The association is founded for the purpose of taking up \_\_\_\_\_ acres in \_\_\_\_\_ under the special-settlement regulations issued by the Government.

2. The name of the settlement shall be the \_\_\_\_\_ Special Settlement.

3. There shall be a committee of management elected by ballot annually by the association, consisting of a chairman, secretary, treasurer, and seven members, five to form a quorum, whose duties shall be to carry out the objects of the association.

4. The committee from time to time may levy contributions not exceeding 3d. per acre, to cover working-expenses.

5. Sections may be cut up in sizes varying from 50 to 320 acres in extent, according to the requirements of members: Provided that the average area held by each member does not exceed 200 acres.

6. The rent to be paid for each allotment shall be at the same rate as that paid by the association to the Government.

7. The sections shall be allotted by ballot, each settler to take the number on the plan corresponding to that drawn by him, from No. 1 to No. 100.

8. Up to the time of the allotment of sections no settler will be allowed to transfer his interest without the consent of the committee; and in no case will a transfer be allowed for a money consideration.

*Amended Conditions, Village Homesteads.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of February, 1891.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-third section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for fixing the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any special settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to revoke the Order in Council which was issued on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and to make other regulations for the disposal of land in village homesteads:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby revoke the Order in Council of the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and with the like advice and consent I do hereby fix the following terms and conditions as those upon which village homesteads shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:—

REGULATIONS.

1. THE land to be selected under these regulations shall be held on perpetual lease for the first term of thirty years, and for subsequent terms of twenty-one years, without any right of acquiring the freehold.

2. The rental shall be based on the capital value of the land, which shall in no case be less than £1 an acre.

3. No charge will be made for the lease, which shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto, beyond the sum of 10s. for registering the same in the Land Transfer Department.

4. No lease shall be issued until after the payment of the first half-year's rent. No transfer of the interest of a settler shall be allowed until the consent of the Commissioner of Crown Lands has been first obtained.

5. Renewals of leases shall be subject in all respects to the provisions of sections 151 to 155 of Part IV. of "The Land Act, 1885."

6. Married men will have preference as selectors under these regulations.

7. No allotment shall exceed in area 50 acres.

8. An advance of a sum not exceeding £10 will be made to assist a selector in the erection of a house on his selection.

(a.) The erection of a dwelling-house must be completed within six months of the date of selection, and each settler must reside on his section within that time. In bush-lands this may be deferred until one month after the first burn, but no longer.

(b.) In bush-lands each settler must begin bush-felling immediately; but in any case where this is not done the Steward should report the circumstance to the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the district.

(c.) Those settlers who may desire an advance of £10 under this clause will obtain payment from the Steward, on his certificate that a dwelling-house of at least that value has been erected on the land.

9. The annual rent shall be 5 per cent. on the capital value of the land, together with 5 per cent. on such sum as may be advanced in terms of clause 8, payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January or July next ensuing after the lapse of six months from the dates of the selection and advances respectively: Provided that it shall not be necessary for any settler to pay any rent for the first two years from the date on which the rent is due as aforesaid. The unpaid two years' rent shall be added to the capital value of the land, and thereafter the rent will be payable on such increased capital value, or the settler may pay off the arrears of rent at any time.

10. All applications for land under these regulations shall be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the district. Where more applications than one are made on the same day for the same land, the right to occupy the land applied for shall, subject to clause 6, be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

11. Each settler or transferee will be required to occupy his selection as his home, and to make substantial improvements as required by clauses 12 and 13.

12. Each settler shall within two years cultivate one acre, and within four years the half of the remainder, of his selection.

13. Substantial improvement shall mean—

(a.) Fencing the land with timber or other durable materials, not being a brush fence; or

(b.) Breaking up and laying down the same in English or other cultivated grass; or

(c.) Breaking up and planting or sowing root or other crops therein; and, in case of bush-lands, the felling and clearing of timber and sowing of grass.

14. Settlers shall not subdivide or sublet their holdings; but, with the consent of the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the district, they may transfer them, provided that all the conditions of these regulations have been fulfilled to date of application to transfer, and the two years' arrears of rent paid in full. No person who has an interest in any land of more than an acre in extent in the colony shall be eligible as a selector under these regulations.

15. No settler shall hold more than one allotment, which shall be held for his sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. No married woman shall be eligible as a selector, except as heir-at-law.

16. Any settler who shall fail to comply with these regulations in any respect shall, upon sufficient proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, forfeit his interest in the land selected.

17. In case any doubt shall arise as to the construction of these terms and conditions with reference to the selection and occupation or clearing of any land, or otherwise arising thereunder, the same shall be settled by the Commissioner.

To hold the said premises intended to be hereby demised unto the lessee for the term of thirty years, commencing as from the 30th day of June, 18\_\_\_\_, and renewable on the conditions prescribed by "The Land Act, 1885." 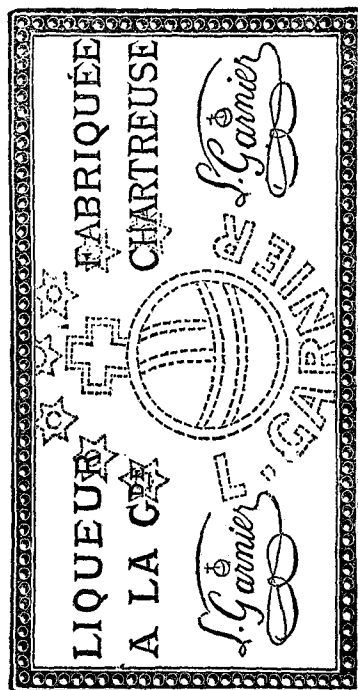

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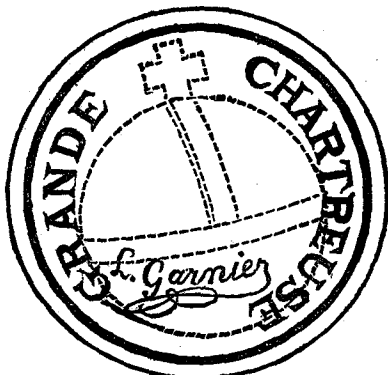

Notice as to Removal of Restrictions on the Alienation of Land by Natives.

Native Office, Wellington, 29th December, 1890.

CLAUSE 5 of "The Native Land Act, 1888," provides that existing restrictions on alienation may be removed or declared void by the Governor in Council, on the application of a majority in number of the Native owners.

Clause 17 of "The Native Land Court Acts Amendment Act, 1889," provides that where application is made to the Governor to remove or make void any restrictions on alienation under the provisions of section 5 of "The Native Land Act, 1888," or where the consent of the Governor to any alienation of the land comprised in any grant heretofore or hereafter to be issued is required by the terms of such grant, then, before such power is exercised or consent given, inquiry shall be made by the Court as therein mentioned.

It is hereby notified that any persons making application under the foregoing provisions must furnish the following information:—

1. The name (if any) of the land granted, and the numbers and dates of the grants or other instruments containing the restrictions sought to be removed, or sufficient other information to enable grants or instruments of title to be traced and identified.
2. Whether the applicant is an original grantee or a successor of an original grantee. If the latter, copy of the succession order must be forwarded with the application.
3. Where consent is required to any partial alienation of land, such as by lease or mortgage, an engrossment of the instrument of alienation to which the consent of the Governor is required must be forwarded in duplicate, and one copy will be retained for the purposes of record.

4. Each signature to an application must be attested by a Judge, Registrar, or Licensed Interpreter of the Native Land Court, a Justice of the Peace, a Solicitor of the Supreme Court, a Clerk of Resident Magistrate's Court, or a Post-master.

5. In cases where the application is written in English, but signed by a Native, in addition to the attestation of the signature, a certificate must be appended, signed by a Licensed Interpreter of the Native Land Court, certifying that the application was read over in Maori, and explained to the Native before signing, and that he appeared fully to understand the same.

6. Any person signing the name of another to any application without sufficient authority will render himself liable to such penalties as the law provides. In all cases where practicable the authority to sign as agent should accompany the application.
