A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1887" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively, shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the control and management of the bridge described in the Schedule hereto should be vested in the manner hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and known as the Arnold Bridge, shall, from and after the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Grey County Council; and I do hereby fix and determine that the Grey County Council shall itself provide out of its own funds eleven-twentieths of the cost of managing and maintaining the said bridge; and that the Borough Council of Brunner shall, on demand in writing from the said Grey County Council, pay to the said Council from time to time nine-twentieths of the cost of managing and maintaining the said bridge.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," section twenty-seven, it is enacted that, if not less than one-fourth of the burgesses of a borough petition the Governor praying him to divide such borough into wards, the Governor may, by Proclamation, divide such borough into not more than six wards, and shall in such Proclamation assign such names and boundaries to each ward as he thinks fit: And whereas not less than one-fourth of the burgesses of the Borough of Masterton have petitioned me to divide such borough into wards:

## WEST WARD.

off the north-east point of Penrhyn Island, in about lat. 9° 3' S. and long. 157° 50' W., and that it extends about five miles off that point right in the track of vessels coming from California or British Columbia. For the first two miles from the point the sea breaks heavily over the reef; then there is a channel about one and a half miles wide, in which no bottom was found at 25 fathoms, and outside the channel there is a rocky patch of about two or three cables in extent, on which the sea breaks heavily in patches.

NOTE.—Deaths, occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough in which the hospital is situated are allotted to the borough where the diseases were contracted, and not to that in which the deaths actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 365, against 353 in February, an increase of 12. The deaths in March were 148, a decrease of 49 on the number in February. Of the total deaths, males contributed 83; females, 65. Sixty-four of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 43.24 per cent. of the whole number; 55 of these were under 1 year of age.

\* It must be understood that the numbers of the population above given refer only to those within the several borough boundaries. To estimate the relative importance of the principal boroughs as centres of population it is necessary in each case to take into consideration the number of the population in the adjacent boroughs, some of which are included in the above table, and other districts which are practically suburbs of the central borough. This can only be done with any degree of accuracy for census years.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—

The births in March were 195, against 196 in February, a decrease of 1.

The deaths amounted to 82, against 119 in February.

There were 9 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 1 male of 76, and 3 females of 83, 77, and 73, died at Auckland; 1 male of 71, and 1 female of 65, at Wellington; 1 male of 74 at Christchurch; and 2 males of 87 and 79 at Dunedin.



*Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.*—The deaths in this class fell from 40 in February to 17 in March. The decrease was caused by a lower mortality from diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 11 deaths in March and 26 in February; also deaths from typhoid fever, which amounted to 5 in March, against 8 in February. The decrease was mostly at Auckland, where deaths from diarrhoeal diseases numbered 4 in March and 17 in February. At Wellington the numbers were 3 and 6 for those months respectively.

*Constitutional Diseases.*—These deaths were 15 in March and 14 in February. By cancer there were 6 deaths in the later and 8 in the earlier month. The deaths from phthisis were 4 in each month.

*Local Diseases.*—In this class the mortality amounted to 38 deaths in March. The deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs—bronchitis, pneumonia, pleurisy, and asthma—were only 6 in number.

*Violent Deaths.*—Of these deaths, 2 were accidental (from falls) and 1 suicidal (from poisoning by heads of matches).

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Bank of New Zealand intends to present a petition to the General Assembly of New Zealand, at its next session, praying for leave to introduce a Bill to be intituled "An Act to further amend 'The New Zealand Bank Act, 1861.'" The objects of the said Bill are—

(a.) To confirm and validate certain resolutions passed at the half-yearly general meeting of the proprietors of the said bank held in London on the 28th day of August, 1890, and confirmed at a special general meeting of the said proprietors also held in London on the 18th day of September, 1890.

(b.) To declare that payments to reinstate shares, as mentioned in the second of the said resolutions, should not increase a shareholder's original liability.

(c.) To declare that the deed of settlement of the said bank, amended and altered by certain resolutions passed and confirmed at meetings of the said proprietors held respectively in London on the 14th day of January, 1891, and the 4th day of February, 1891, shall be taken to have been duly amended and altered, and shall, as from the said 4th day of February, 1891 (the date when the amendments and alterations in the said deed were confirmed), be taken to be in the form intended to be set forth in a Schedule to the proposed Bill; and the laws, regulations, and provisions therein contained shall be the laws, regulations, and provisions for the time being of the said bank.
