Vesting Control of the Taungatara Traffic-bridge in the Hawera County Council.

(L.S.) ONSLOW, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Public Works Acts Amendment Act, 1887" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, upon the terms and conditions in the said section mentioned, by Proclamation publicly notified, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively, shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such Proclamation, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the control and management of the bridge described in the Schedule hereto should be vested in the manner hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the said Act, and of every other power and authority in any-wise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and known as the Taungatara Traffic-bridge, shall, from and after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Hawera County Council; and I do hereby fix and determine that the Hawera County Council shall itself provide out of its own funds one-half of the cost of managing and maintaining the said bridge; and that the Taranaki County Council shall, on demand in writing from the Hawera County Council, from time to time pay to the said Council one-half of the actual cost of managing and maintaining the said bridge.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of July, 1891.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twentieth section of "The Westland and Nelson Coal Fields Administration Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time reserve such portions of the lands described in the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Schedules to the said Act which, in his opinion, are required for the purposes in the said section mentioned:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto form part of the lands described in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such lands are subject to be dealt with under the provisions of section twenty of the said Act, and in the opinion of the Governor it is expedient to reserve the same for the purposes therein and hereinafter set forth:

WHEREAS it appears to the Governor that burials in the cemeteries and burial-grounds in the Borough of the City of Wellington, respectively described in the Schedule hereto, should be wholly discontinued: And whereas a sufficient cemetery situate in the District of Karori, and which is not within the limits of any borough or town district, has been provided by the Council of the Borough of the City of Wellington, and has been by it prepared for the interment of the dead as required by "The Cemeteries Act, 1882:"

And it is hereby declared that the vesting orders hereby made are so made under and subject to the provisions of the seventy-ninth section of the said Act, and also subject to all other provisions of the said Act respecting cemeteries or burial-grounds closed under its provisions.
