Proclaiming the Taking and Laying-off of Roads over Land in the Wellington Land District.

(L.S.) ONSLOW, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and in exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the roads described in the Schedule hereto have been duly taken and laid off through the land specified, under warrants of the date given, in the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 3 acres 3 roods 33 perches, more or less, situate in the Mount Robinson Survey District, being a road, 100 links wide, the centre line of which commences at a point on the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 12 of the Manawatu-Kukutauaki No. 2E Block (marked A on the plan hereinafter referred to) distant 6866 links from the northernmost corner of that section; and proceeds thence in a south-westerly direction over Sections Nos. 12, 11, 10, and 9 of the aforesaid block to a point on the southern boundary of Section No. 9 (marked C on the plan hereinafter referred to) distant 6229 links from its westernmost corner: be the aforesaid linkages more or less.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of November, 1891.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section two hundred and fifteen of "The Harbours Act, 1878" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), that every Harbour Board shall, *inter alia*, have power, by by-laws, to fix scales of dues, tolls, and charges to be paid for the use of wharves within the limits of the harbour:

And whereas it is provided by the twelfth section of the said Act that in harbours where there is no Harbour Board the Governor in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by the said Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may exercise the same in accordance with the said Act:

And whereas there is no Harbour Board in the Harbour of Kaipara, and it is desirable that dues, tolls, and charges should be fixed for the use of the county wharves at Mount Wesley, Aratapu, Mititai, Whakahara, and Tikinui, in the said harbour:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby make the by-law set forth in the Schedule hereto, and do order that it shall apply to the county wharves at Mount Wesley, Aratapu, Mititai, Whakahara, and Tikinui, in the Harbour of Kaipara.

THE following dues, tolls, and charges shall be paid for the use of the county wharves at Mount Wesley, Aratapu, Mititai, Whakahara, and Tikinui, in the Harbour of Kaipara, viz.:—

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 19, of the nineteenth day of the same month, certain regulations were made under "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884," providing for netting trout in the lakes in the Mackenzie County: And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said Order in Council and the regulations made thereby:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of all the powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby revoke the said Order in Council of the sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and the regulations made thereby.

Defining Limits of the Harbour of Wanganui.

ONSLow, Governor.

IN pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the ninth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby define the limits of the Harbour of Wanganui, in the said colony, to be those set out and described in the Schedule hereto. All former warrants or instruments defining the limits of the said harbour or port are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area commencing at a point about 25 chains to the south of Cliff Trig. Station where the line of ordinary high-water mark is intersected by an arc of a circle having a radius of two nautical miles from Knowles's Block No. 4, near the pilot's flagstaff, and bounded towards the west and south by the said arc of a circle to where it strikes the main land at ordinary high water about 62 chains to the south of Landguard Trig. Station; thence towards the north-east by ordinary high-water mark along the shore of Cook Strait to the mouth of the Wanganui River; thence towards the south-east generally by ordinary high-water mark along the left bank of the said river to a point where a line bearing N. 46° W. will strike the southern corner of the Raorikia Native Reserve; thence towards the north-east by the said line to ordinary high-water mark on the right bank of the said river; and thence towards the north-west generally by ordinary high-water mark along the right bank of the said river to its mouth; and thence again towards the north-east by ordinary high-water mark along the shore of Cook Strait to the commencing-point: the hereinbefore mentioned line of high-water mark shall be deemed to cross the mouths of any tributaries of the said Wanganui River; as the same is delineated on the plan signed by the Governor, marked M.D. 1699, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington.

Additional By-law for New Zealand Railways.

THE New Zealand Railway Commissioners, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon them by or under "The Government Railways Act, 1887," do hereby make the following by-law, that is to say:—

BY-LAW.

No animal or animals shall trespass on a railway open for traffic, or on any part thereof; and, if any animal or animals is or are found so trespassing, the owner thereof shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law, and shall be liable for such breach to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Notwithstanding the liability of any person to a penalty under this by-law, any officers of the said Commissioners, or any police constable or any other person, may impound any animal or animals that may be found so trespassing as aforesaid, and liable by law to be impounded.

This by-law shall apply to all railways open for traffic and vested in the said Commissioners under "The Government Railways Act, 1887," or under any other Act; and the by-law made by the said Commissioners on the 28th day of November, 1890, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 4th day of December in the same year, is hereby revoked.

The results of the experiment show that the subject's performance is stable after approximately 40 trials. The percentage of correct responses fluctuates slightly around a mean of approximately 57%. This suggests that the subject has reached a level of automaticity in the task.
