HEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-seventh sec-tion of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be

disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:
And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony
of New Zealand has, by Proclamations issued under the provisions of section one hundred and sixty-six of the said Act and the fourteenth section of "The Land Acts Amendment Act, 1888," set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto as village settlements:

hereto as village settlements:
And whereas by Orders in Council issued on the twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty; the fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; the nineteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three; the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five; the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five; the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six: day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six; and the twenty-second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the terms and conditions of sale of the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto were fixed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to revoke the said Orders in Council, and to issue new terms and conditions in lieu thereof:

2. The lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto shall be open as small-farm allotments for sale or selection, either for cash, or on deferred payments, or on perpetual lease.

3. The purchaser for cash of any of the lands enumerated

3. The purchaser for cash of any of the lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto must deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district one-fifth of the purchase-Land Revenue for the land district one-fith of the purchasemoney at the time of application, and shall pay the whole
remainder of the purchase-money within thirty days of the
granting of his application; and if not paid within thirty
days his deposit shall be forfeited, and the lands shall be
again open for sale or occupation forthwith; and upon full
payment of the purchase-money he will be entitled to a

8. If there should be more than one application for any allotment in the First Schedule the right to occupy the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

9. Each applicant for a section for cash will be required to make a statutory declaration that he is applying for the land solely for his own use and benefit, and not for the use and benefit of any other person or persons whomsoever.

10. Each applicant for a deferred-payment section will be required to make the declaration prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district one-tenth of the price of the allotment (such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee for the six months due on the next first day of January or July following the date of the license, as the case may be); and, upon fulfilment of the terms and conditions prescribed by the said Act relating to land on deferred payments, will be entitled to the Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way.

11. Each applicant for any of the allotments on perpetual leasing will be required to make the declaration prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto, and to deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district a sum equal to one half-year's rent of the allotment included in the application, and such payment shall be in discharge of the half-year's rent due on the first day of January or July which shall first ensue after the commencement of the term, together with the sum of thirty shillings for the lease and registration thereof.

The shoal is composed of sand, and is steep-to. The depth over it at low-water springs is three fathoms, with from nine to eleven fathoms close-to.

Caution .- Causes of Wreck at the Port Phillip Heads.

A careful inquiry into the casualties which have occurred at the entrance of Port Phillip has shown that in nearly every case they have taken place in consequence of the vessels either attempting to enter the Heads at night without a pilot or against a strong ebb stream, which, it must be remembered, runs partly athwart the entrance with great force, frequently at the rate of seven knots, causing a high, confused, tumbling sea, which, in southerly or westerly gales, often breaks from point to point. The mariner must not suppose that because he has a fine fair wind outside the Heads he can always force his vessel against the ebb. To Heads he can always force his vessel against the ebb. To this error is attributable the loss of several vessels. The wind, although fresh outside, frequently falls light just as the vessel gets into the tide-ripple between the Heads, when she becomes unmanageable; and even with a strong breeze vessels often shear athwart the tide, which hereabouts forms a series of strong irregular eddies.

3. The charge for maintenance and treatment is 21s. a week.

4. The Board or Trustees, in making such recommendation, shall guarantee the cost of such patient, shall send him or her at their own charge to Rotorua, be responsible for his or her return-passage, and provide a sufficient supply of clothing. They shall also furnish a report on the case by a duly-qualified medical practitioner, in order that it may be seen whether the case is one that is likely to profit by treatment at the Sanatorium at the Sanatorium.

5. When all the beds are not occupied by patients admitted under Regulation 2, the Resident Medical Officer may, at his discretion, admit persons, being bona fide hospital cases, and who have undertaken to pay 30s. a week for maintenance and treatment.

6. When all the beds are not occupied by patients admitted under Regulations 2 and 5, persons may be admitted on the following conditions

on the following conditions:—

(1.) That the Resident Medical Officer has certified that each such person is likely to be benefited by treatment at the Sanatorium.

(2.) That the expenses to and from Rotorua are provided by each such person, together with a sufficient supply of clothing.

(3.) That not more than four such persons shall be resident at the Sanatorium at any one time.

7. The stay of each patient is limited to three months, but the Resident Medical Officer can, at his discretion, extend the period to six months. the period to six months.
