A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and in exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the road described in the Schedule hereto has been duly taken and laid off through the land specified, under warrant of the date given, in the said Schedule.

ALL that parcel of land in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 16 acres 3 roods 24·6 perches, more or less, situated in the Patetere North and Tapapa Survey Districts, being a road, 100 links wide, traversing part of the north-eastern portion of the Whaiti-Kuranui No. 2c Block (No. 5156c), the northern side of which commences at a point on the western side of the Lichfield-Te Aroha Road distant 1548 links or thereabouts to the southward of the north-eastern boundary of the Whaiti-Kuranui No. 2c Block aforesaid, measured along the said road; and proceeds north-westerly generally for a distance of 16594 links or thereabouts to a point on the north-eastern boundary-line of the aforesaid block distant 15540 links or thereabouts from the commencing-point: as the same is delineated on Map No. 5196, deposited in the District Lands and Survey Office, Auckland.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken, under "The Public Works Act, 1882," and its amendments, for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road in Waitotara County:

Land declared open for Mining Purposes.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands described in the First Schedule hereto were, by deed bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, ceded by the Native owners thereof to Her Majesty the Queen for mining purposes for the term and subject to the conditions imposed by the said deed: And whereas it is expedient to declare the said lands as open for mining purposes in manner hereinafter specified:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the First Schedule hereto shall, as from the twenty-second day of February instant, be open for mining purposes as defined by "The Mining Act, 1891," subject to the conditions contained in the said recited deed of the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, as set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the provisions of the said Act and the regulations made thereunder, in so far as the same are not inconsistent with the terms of the said deed.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 951 acres, more or less, being Subdivisions 1c, 1d, and 2A of the Kuaotunu Block, Otama Survey District, County of Coromandel. Bounded on the north by the sea; thence on the east by the Waiharere Stream and by Crown land, 180, 440, 344, 331, 2970, 3715, and 110 links; thence on the south by the Kuaotunu No. 2B Block, 10348 links; thence again on the east by the aforesaid Kuaotunu No. 2B Block, 8685 links; thence on the south-west by the Waitaia Block, 310, 639, 221, and 185 links; thence on the west by Crown land, 8703 and 7830 links, to the starting-point.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

"THE said land," in this Schedule, means the land described in the First Schedule to the foregoing Proclamation.

1. Any person mining for gold or other metal or mineral, or otherwise occupying any parts of the said land, shall be the holder of a miner's right, for which the sum of £1 shall have been paid, issued under the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1886," or any Act for the regulation of mining for the time being in force within the colony.

2. Any person holding a miner's right shall be entitled to cut timber (other than kauri or reserved trees) on the said land, provided such timber is used for himself for mining and domestic purposes. Any person cutting timber for sale must be the holder of a timber license duly authorising him in that behalf, for which he shall pay a fee of £5 for any area prescribed on such timber license, and all persons employed by him shall each be the holder of a miner's right issued at £1.

3. Any holder of a miner's right may at any time purchase any kauri trees required for mining purposes for the sum or price of £1 5s. for each tree.

4. Mining and occupation licenses of land, and machine, business, and residence sites situated on the said land, shall be granted at such rents and on such terms and conditions as are prescribed by "The Mining Act, 1886," and its amendments, and the regulations made thereunder, or as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Mining Act then being in force in the mining district including the said land, or any regulation made thereunder.

5. Lands required for townships shall be reserved and proclaimed. Any person occupying any allotment in such township for business purposes shall pay a business license-fee of £5 annually. Any person occupying any allotment for residence shall pay a fee or rental of £1 annually.

6. Any person digging for kauri-gum within the said land, or doing any act of occupation not herein specified, shall be the holder of a miner's right for which a fee of £1 shall have been paid.

7. Reserves for Native occupation and residence shall be set aside and proclaimed, and such reserves shall not be subject to the provisions of the Mining Act or any Act amending or repealing the same.

8. All rents, royalties, revenues, moneys, and fees (other than registration-fees) payable to the Receiver of Gold Revenue for the Hauraki Mining District, whether the same shall arise or accrue under "The Mining Act, 1886," or

otherwise, shall be deemed to be the property of the Native owners of the said land, and all such money shall be paid to the Native owners of such blocks quarterly.

Land available for Selection by the Midland Railway Company set apart for Mining Purposes.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in the contract bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Her Majesty the Queen and the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited), it is, among other things, provided that, subject to the conditions therein contained, all lands within the limits of the authorised area defined in the said contract shall be available for selection by the company, with certain exceptions: And whereas among such exceptions are included all lands which from time to time, in the opinion of the Governor, are or may be required for *bona fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith or incidental or conducive thereto, and which lands shall from time to time be set apart and defined by Proclamation to be issued in that behalf; but no more than ten thousand acres shall be so set apart or proclaimed in one block at any one time, and the lands so set apart and proclaimed from time to time shall not, in the aggregate, exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand acres: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required for *bona fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith, and the said lands are comprised in one block, containing ten thousand acres: And whereas it is expedient the said land should be set apart and defined by this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf under the hereinbefore-mentioned contract or otherwise, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land defined and described in the Schedule hereto is set apart under the provisions of the said contract for *bona fide* mining purposes and the several purposes connected therewith.

Harbour Regulations.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this first day of February, 1892.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the two hundred and twelfth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, for the purposes specified in the said section, from time to time make regulations to be called "General Harbour Regulations," and which shall be in force in all the ports of the colony:

And whereas General Harbour Regulations were made by Order in Council dated the fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 49, of the seventh day of the same month:

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the said regulations shall, on and after the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, be in force in all ports or harbours in the colony, those numbered thirty and thirty-four to be in place of regulations numbered thirty and thirty-four of the said General Harbour Regulations, and such regulations, together with the regulation numbered twenty-five (A) in the Schedule hereto, shall be deemed to form a part of the said General Harbour Regulations.

SCHEDULE.

25A. No ship or boat shall convey gunpowder or other explosive substance or compound to or from any ship in a harbour unless such ship or boat has been specially approved for that purpose by the Harbourmaster, which approval may at any time be altered, modified, or revoked.

30. When steamships having ships in tow are steering opposite courses in a confined channel in a harbour, both ships shall, before meeting, slacken speed when practicable until they have passed each other.

34. Steamships about to pass any dredging-machine at work in any harbour, or any licensed ferry, or public work in progress, must slow their engines at such a distance before approaching any such dredge, ferry, or work as to insure their passing it at a speed not greater than dead-slow.

Revoking Order in Council prohibiting Export of Oysters.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this first day of February, 1892.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS an Order in Council prohibiting the export from the colony of all oysters known as *Ostrea purpuræa*, *Ostrea glomerata*, *Ostrea mordax*, or the rock, shore, drift, or mangrove oysters, or by whatever name they may be locally known, taken or produced in the waters of the colony, was made under the powers conferred by "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," on the sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 77, of the fifteenth day of the same month: And whereas it is desirable to revoke so much of the said Order in Council as prohibits the exportation of shore oysters or mangrove oysters:

Now, therefore, I, William Hillier, Earl of Onslow, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," and of all other authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby revoke so much of the said Order in Council of the sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, as prohibits the exportation from the colony of shore oysters or mangrove oysters.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE ENTRY IN THE ROYAL NAVY OF MEN AND BOYS OF AUSTRALIAN AND NEW ZEALAND BIRTH, Application being made beforehand to the Commander-in-Chief, H.M.S. "Orlando," for each Entry.

Able and ordinary seamen.

1. ABLE or ordinary seamen may be entered to fill vacancies, as non-continuous-service men, for six months' trial on the station; and if, after that time, they are found suitable, they will be allowed to join the Royal navy for continuous service, and will be paid (as continuous-service men) from the date of their original entry. Men so entered will be sent to England for training in gunnery, &c., but they will afterwards be employed on the Australian Station if they so desire.

Boys.

2. Boys who volunteer and come up to the standard will be accepted and sent to England for training, with the paid-off crews of H.M. ships; and, after undergoing the necessary training, they will be employed as far as possible on the Australian Station if they so desire.

Qualifications.

(a.) These boys should be between the ages of fifteen and sixteen, and they must be in all respects suitable.

How to be borne.

(b.) When entered, boys will be received in one of H.M. ships on the station for passage to the training-ship in England.

The rates of pay, pensions, and other advantages are given in the quarterly editions of the "Navy List."
