A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS by the second section of "The Government Loans to Local Bodies Act Amendment Act, 1891" (herein termed "the said Act"), it is, amongst other things, enacted that, before certain moneys therein mentioned shall be expended upon any block of land, it shall be necessary that the same be proclaimed as set apart for settlement:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of every power and authority enabling me in this behalf, and for the purposes of the said Act, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the blocks of land described in the Schedule hereto as set apart for settlement.

MENT IN COUNCIL.

Present: HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERN-

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the thirty-ninth section of "The Sheep Act, 1890," His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby suspend the operation of sections thirty-four to thirty-eight, both inclusive, within all the districts defined under the said Act (subject, however, as hereinafter provided as to the Districts of Nelson and Marlborough) in respect to sheep bred in the colony and brought by sea from within the colony to be landed in such districts, and in respect to any vessel bringing such sheep; and in further pursuance and exercise of the power and authority aforesaid, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions upon which sheep brought coastwise from any part of the Districts of Nelson or Marlborough, or either of them, may be landed within any other part of the colony, that is to

say:—

1. No sheep bred in the colony and taken or carried by sea in any vessel, coastwise, from the Districts of Nelson or Marlborough, or either of them, to any port or place in any other part of the colony, shall be landed at any such port or place unless the owner of such sheep, his agent, servant, or other person having the charge of such sheep, shall have first obtained from the Inspector at the port or place of shipment authority in writing to land such sheep at the port or place of destination.

2. The authority to be given by the Inspector shall be in

2. The authority to be given by the Inspector shall be in writing, and shall be in such form and contain such particulars as he thinks necessary.

3. If the Inspector at the port or place of shipment thinks

fit in any case, he may require the person, or one of the persons, for whom or on whose account the sheep are required to be taken or carried as aforesaid to make a declaration before a Justice of the Peace, or such Inspector, in the form or to the effect specified in Schedule D to the said Act.

4. The foregoing regulations shall apply to the master or owner of any vessel bringing sheep coastwise from the said Districts of Nelson or Marlborough or either of them; and it shall be the duty of every such master or owner to see that these regulations have been complied with before he ships any sheep to be so taken or carried as aforesaid.

5. If any person shall knowingly commit a breach of any of the foregoing regulations he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £100.

And also in pursuance and exercise of the powers aforesaid, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, His Excellency the Administrator as aforesaid doth hereby declare that this Order in Council and the regulations hereby medeshall come into force and take effect on and after the seventeenth day of March next, and shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of December next; and all previous Orders in Council in force under the said thirty-ninth section shall be and be deemed to be revoked on the day when this present Order in Council comes into force.

These runs are situated on the dividing-range between the Hakateramea and Waihao Rivers, inland of Waimate, and comprise an area of 32,820 acres of high open hills, intersected by deep gullies, which in places merge into gorges. The ridges are generally broad and flat, the slopes easy and undulating in parts, and in others steep and broken. Though there are no large flats, each run contains at least one suitable site for homestead purposes, the means of access thereto, however, being in some cases difficult. The soil varies in quality from fair to good, that on the main tops and southern faces having a cold appearance, whilst other parts are very rocky. The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs: The births in February were 224, against 227 in January, a decrease of 3. The deaths amounted to 132, against 126 in January. There were 13 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 2 males of 81 and 76, and 5 females of 88, 82, 79, 77, and 66, died at Auckland; 2 males of 66 (both), and 1 female of 73, at Wellington; 1 male of 78 at Christchurch; and 2 males of 91 and 73 at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The higher temperature in February has been synchronous with an increased number of deaths from these diseases on that in January, caused by the greater mortality from infantile diarrhæa. The deaths from this class in February were 39, which included 12 from influenza and 24 from cholera and diarrhæa. In February the number of deaths increased to 46, of which 38 were from diarrhæal diseases; of these, 36 were of infants, all but two being under one year of age. Influenza was much less prevalent in February, as no deaths from that disease were registered in the four boroughs. Typhoid and low fever caused 3 deaths (2 at Auckland and 1 at Wellington), against 1 at Wellington in January.

Constitutional Diseases.

Constitutional Diseases.—The mortality from these diseases was also somewhat greater in February than in the previous months, 28 against 24 deaths. The number of deaths from cancer increased from 5 to 8, but the mortality from phthisis was somewhat less, 10 against 11 deaths.

Local Diseases.—There were 37 deaths from diseases in this class in February, being fewer by 5 than in the previous month. Diseases of the nervous system caused 5 deaths, against 8 in January; diseases of the circulatory system, 8 deaths, a decrease of one on the number in the previous month; and diseases of the respiratory system caused the same number 4 in each month. number, 4 in each month.

Violent Deaths.—There were 3 accidental deaths, of which one was from drowning, and one death from suicide by

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
