Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Masterton District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

MASTERTON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-east generally by a right line bearing 115° 30' magnetic from the summit of the Tararua Range to the Makakahi River, at a point where the production of the western boundary-line of Section No. 21, Block XIV., Tararua Survey District intersects the said river; thence by the said river, the southern and eastern boundary-line of Section No. 1, Block XIV., the north-eastern boundary-line of Section No. 172, the western and eastern boundaries of a Native reserve, the northern boundary of Section No. 128, part of the western and the northern boundary-lines of Section No. 130, Block XIII., Mangaone Survey District, the north-west boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 54 and 56, Hastwell Village Settlement, the north-western and northern boundary-lines of Section No. 58, the western and the northern boundaries of Section No. 61, part of the western, the northern, and part of the eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 139; and thence by the northern boundary-line of Section No. 67; thence by a line along the middle of the road forming the eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 67 and 72, by the eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 65 and 18, by the north-east boundary-lines of Section No. 9 (Education reserve); thence by a line in production of the north-east boundary of said Section No. 9 to the middle of the road, and thence by a line along the middle of the road running along the northern boundaries of Sections Nos. 92, 97, 98, Block III., Kopuaranga Survey District, and of Section No. 99; thence by Sections Nos. 95, 96, and 16, Block IV., Kopuaranga Survey District, by Section No. 22, Block I., Mangapakeha Survey District, by Sections Nos. 22, 27, and 26, Section No. 310 (College reserve), and Section No. 151 (Education reserve); towards the south-east by Sections Nos. 824, 156, 155, 154, 153, 811, 812, 869, 870, 871, 875, 874, 867, and 518, all of last-named district; again towards the north-east generally by Sections Nos. 518, 519, 616, 725, 729 of Mangapakeha Survey District, Sections Nos. 268, 267, 266, 262, 259, and 241 of Rewa Survey District, and by the Mangapokia River to its confluence with the Whareama River, and thence by the said Whareama River to the ocean; again towards the south-east by the ocean to the Kaiwhata River; thence towards the south-west

generally by the right bank of the said Kaiwhata River to a point bearing north 85° west to the southernmost corner of Section No. 130, Wainuioru Survey District; thence by a right line to that corner; thence by the left bank of the Ruamahanga Stream to the Wainuioru River; thence by the right bank of that river to Section No. 79, Wainuioru Survey District; thence by the said Section No. 79 and Section No. 76, Block XIV., Section No. 75, Block XV., Sections Nos. 63, 51, and 50, Block XIV., and Section No. 48, Block X., all of Otahoua Survey District, and by Te Kahu Native Block to a point due south (magnetic) from the southernmost corner of Section No. 102 of the said Otahoua Survey District; thence by a right line to that corner; thence by the southern boundary-line of the said Section No. 102 and the southern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 103, 104, 105, and 95 to the Taueru River; thence by the left bank of that river to the Ruamahanga River; thence by the right bank of the said Ruamahanga River and the right bank of the Waingawa River to the source of the last-named river; thence by a line due west to the summit of the Tararua Range; and towards the north-west by that summit.

EKETAHUNA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north-east generally by a right line from Arawaru Trig. Station to the northernmost corner of Section No. 20, Block XIV., Mangahao Survey District; thence by Section No. 1 of the said block, by Sections Nos. 1A, 5, 4, 3, 4A, 33, 27, and 30, Block III., Mangaone Survey District, and by Section No. 30A; thence by a line across the Mangaone River and by Section No. 16, Block IV., by the Pa Valley Road, and by the northern boundary-line of Section No. 175, Block VIII., of the last-named district to the Tiraumea River; thence by the said Tiraumea River and the Waitawhiti Stream; towards the east generally by Sections Nos. 174 and 175, parts of the eastern and southern boundary-lines of Section No. 151 (Education reserve), and the eastern boundary-line of Section No. 310 (College reserve), and by the south-eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 26, 27, and 22; towards the south-west generally by Section No. 21 and by Sections Nos. 17, 18, 101, and 100, Block IV., Kopuaranga Survey District; thence by a line along the middle of the road to the north of Section No. 99 and of Sections Nos. 98, 97, and 92, Block III., of the last-named survey district, to a point in line with the north-east boundary of Section No. 9 (Education reserve); thence by a line to and by the said Section No. 9, by Sections Nos. 18 and 65, and thence along the middle of the road forming the eastern boundary of Sections Nos. 72 and 67; thence by the northern boundary-line of Section No. 67, part of the eastern, the northern, and part of the western boundary-lines of Section No. 139, the northern boundary-line of Section No. 61, and part of the western boundary of the last-named section, the northern and north-western boundary-lines of Section No. 58, Hastwell Special Settlement, the north-west boundary-line of Sections Nos. 56 and 54, the northern and part of the western boundary-lines of Sec-

tion No. 130, Block XIII., Mangaone Survey District, the northern boundary-line of Section No. 128, part of the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of a Native reserve, the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 172, the eastern, south-eastern, and south-western boundary-lines of Section No. 1, Block XIV., Tararua Survey District; thence by the Makakahi River to where it meets the production of the western boundary-line of Section No. 21 of the said Block XIV.; thence by a line bearing 295° 30' (magnetic) to the summit of the Tararua Range; and towards the north-west generally by a line along that summit to Arawaru Trig. Station aforesaid.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration district known as the Masterton District; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Masterton and Eketahuna Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

Licensing A. Davidson to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of Wairoa River.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of March, 1892.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT
IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883," Alexander Davidson, of Napier, Shipowner (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore of Wairoa River, in Wairoa Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a shed for the storage of goods; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1696), showing the place where it is intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore, adjacent to the North Clyde Wharf, intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Administrator of the Government in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Administrator of the Government in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a shed for the storage of goods, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such shed which is shown on the plan marked M.D. 1696, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

2. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister, or any person authorised by him to receive the same, the sum of five pounds for this Order in Council, and thereafter an annual sum of five pounds, payable on the first day of April in each year during the continuance of the license hereby granted, the first of such annual payments to be made on the first day of April next.

4. The licensee shall, during the continuance of the said license, maintain all sheds erected on the foreshore included in such license in good order and repair.

5. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said sheds or any part thereof and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee at Napier a notice in writing of any defect

or want of repair in the sheds, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to remove or repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provision of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred or granted by this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee at Napier aforesaid.

8. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said goods-shed may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

9. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said goods-shed for a period of three calendar months;
- (3.) Become bankrupt or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions as they respectively become due and payable;

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

10. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

Licensing Messrs. Turnbull and Co. to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of Picton Harbour.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of March, 1892.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT
IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that, where the foreshore has been legally vested in any Harbour Board or other local governing body, it may from time to time, subject to the provisions of the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," license and permit any part of the foreshore to be used or occupied, *inter alia*, for any purpose relating to the convenience of shipping or the public, or for any local enterprise or object which the Governor in Council may approve: And whereas by the said Act it is also provided that every licensee shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have power to make and construct any necessary reclamation for the purpose of erecting on the foreshore comprised in his license, or upon any land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore which shall be specified in such license, any building, structure, erection, or other works to enable him to obtain the full benefit of such license: And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that every such license shall be in writing, under the seal of the Board or body granting the same, and may be for any period not exceeding fourteen years from the date thereof, and may prescribe a sum of money to be payable either at stated periods or on or before the granting thereof for the use of the foreshore so granted, and may prescribe any other terms or conditions, general or particular, to be observed or performed by the person to whom the same is granted: And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted

that, in any case where there is no Harbour Board, or no Harbour Board empowered to grant any such license as aforesaid, the Governor in Council may in his discretion grant and issue a license for all or any of the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, and all the provisions of the said Act in respect of such licenses shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply accordingly: And whereas, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Messrs. Nicholas Reid and John Honeycombe Cock, of Wellington, Merchants, trading there under the style or firm of "W. and G. Turnbull and Co." (hereinafter called "the licensees"), have applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore in Picton Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a fishing establishment; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," have deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1717), showing the place where it is intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensees under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is requested by the licensees as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a fishing establishment, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of such fishing establishment, which is shown in yellow on the plan marked M.D. 1717, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

2. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister, or any person authorised by him to receive the same, the sum of five pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of six pounds, payable on the first day of April in each year during the continuance of the license hereby granted, the first of such annual payments to be made on the first day of April next.

4. Her Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service of New Zealand acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the fishing establishment without any hindrance or payment.

5. The licensees shall during the continuance of the said license maintain all buildings and fences now standing and being on the foreshore included in such license, or that may hereafter be erected or placed thereon, and also all other erections of what nature soever that may at any time be put up, erected, or placed by the licensees on the said foreshore, for the purposes or use of the said fishing establishment, in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said fishing establishment or any part thereof and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in any building, fence, or erection in or upon or used for such fishing establishment, requiring them, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to remove or repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. That nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or

inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provision of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred or granted by this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees.

9. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said fishing establishment may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

10. In case the licensees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said fishing establishment for a period of three calendar months;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions;

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

Mikonui Water-race vested in Ross Borough Council.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of March, 1892.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT
IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the sixth section of "The Local Bodies' Finance and Powers Act, 1885," and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby vest in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ross all the rights of the Crown to the water-race known as the Mikonui Water-race, in the Totara Survey District, and to all branch supply-races, dams, and other rights connected with such water-race, as the same are more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to hold the said several rights subject to the several conditions upon which the same are now held, and subject to the regulations in force for mining within the said colony. And it is hereby declared that this Order in Council shall take effect on the date hereof.

ALL that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 42 acres 3 roods 38 perches, more or less, situate in the Survey District of Totara, Provincial District of Westland, commencing at a point on the north side of Donnelly's Creek, the same being 25550 links south and 63880 links west of the Initial Geodesical Station of Hokitika Survey Circuit, in the said Provincial District of Westland. 1. "The Sale of Poisons Act, 1871," is hereinafter referred to as "the said Act."

It shall not be lawful for any person to sell or dispose of strychnine or arsenic in any quantities unless such person shall, previous to making the entry required by the provisions of the twelfth section of the said Act, obtain from the intending purchaser of such strychnine or arsenic a statutory declaration setting forth the particulars hereinafter mentioned. Immediately upon completion of the purchase the

seller of such poison shall forward such statutory declaration to the Registrar of the district appointed under the said Act: Provided that this regulation shall not apply to the sale of arsenic wholesale for use in the cure of diseases in sheep.

3. Every such declaration shall state precisely (1) the Christian name and surname of the intending purchaser at full length, together with his or her occupation and address; (2) the exact quantity and name of the poison required; and (3) the express purpose or purposes for which such poison is alone intended to be used, and the places or localities where the same is to be used or deposited respectively.

MY LORD,—With reference to the Earl of Carnarvon's circular despatch of the 13th June, 1877, transmitting a summary of the statutes dated 30th May, 1877, of the Most

Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, and to my circular despatch of the 7th September, 1887, respecting the recovery of the insignia on the decease of members within the colony under your Government, I have the honour to acquaint you that the Queen, as Sovereign and Chief of the said most distinguished order, has been graciously pleased to issue statutes of the order, dated the 24th November, 1891, repealing those provisions in the statutes of the 30th May, 1877, which ordained that persons admitted into the order should make arrangements for the return, on their decease, of the insignia or badges received by them; and altering, amending, and consolidating the several statutes of the order.

2. In enclosing for your information copies of the new statutes, I have the honour to acquaint you that it will no longer be part of the duty of Colonial Governors to obtain and transmit to the Chancery of the order the insignia of deceased members, as the insignia are for the future returnable only when the holder is promoted in, or ceases, while living, to be a member of, the order; but it is desirable that, as heretofore, the death of any member of the order within the colony under your Government should be notified for record in the Chancery of the order, and also that the decease, within the colony, of persons possessing other honorary distinctions should, as heretofore, be reported to the Secretary of State.

3. In the event of any member of any of the classes of the order ceasing to hold his rank and place as a member of the order or of his resigning his dignity, the whole of the insignia issued to him will have to be returned; and, in the event of the promotion within the order of any member of the second or third class, he will have to return to the Secretary of the order the insignia previously worn by him.

I must once again give expression to my deep sense of the loyalty and affectionate sympathy evinced by my subjects in every part of my Empire on an occasion more sad and tragical than any but one which has befallen me and mine, as well as the nation. The overwhelming misfortune of my dearly-loved grandson having been thus suddenly cut off in the flower of his age, full of promise for the future, amiable and gentle, and endearing himself to all, renders it hard for his sorely-stricken parents, his dear young bride, and his fond grandmother to bow in submission to the inscrutable decrees of Providence.
